(Ed. – since the last issue, the son of the navigator got in touch with me, wanting to make contact with the niece of the rear gunner. They have since been able to exchange memories of their relatives. The son, Pete Lomas gave me a copy of his father's book "A Navigator's Story – One Wing High" and it is available for anyone who may be interested to borrow – just let me know and I'll pass it on.)

Following on from this I was shown information about another plane crash which mentions North Frodingham range.

I did a bit of research and found this extract and some photos.

The photos show where the range was and what looks like an abandoned look out.

Brigadier Alan J Simmons

Many of you will be aware that Brigadier Alan Simmons died recently.

Alan was born in London in 1930. Conscripted into the army in 1948, he saw service in Cyprus, Germany, Belgium, and the UK, until his final posting as Commandant of the Army School of Mechanical Transport at Leconfield in 1982 – with the rank of Brigadier.

In 1985 he retired, and moved, with wife Bobbie, to Park House, North Frodingham, where he lived for nearly 30 years. He took an active part in village life — particularly St Elgins Church and Parish Council (serving as Chair for a while). He was also involved with the first refurbishment of the village hall playground.

Between 1987 and 1998 he was Secretary, and later Chairman of what was then the first branch in Humberside of SSAFA – a cause close to his heart.





I haven't been to the place which is off the Brandesburton road myself, but if anyone has any information it would be great to hear from you.

"Halifax bomber- The crew flying this aircraft were new to 158 Squadron, having only arrived five days earlier. At 20.17hrs on 8th November 1944 the crew of this 158 Squadron aircraft took off from Lissett airfield to undertake a cross country night bombing on the range at North Frodingham combined with a local flying training exercise. The aircraft took off and climbed slowly to 400 feet but then dived into the ground almost immediately after near to the village of Gembling. Although it was never proven to be why the aircraft crashed, it was found that the aircraft's elevators had been incorrectly trimmed prior to taking off, instead of the -1 degree that was required they were set at +3 degrees."

Please beware Amazon scam alert

I've had a call from 07431 672366 this morning. The lady asked for me by name, and had my full name and address. She said that she was calling from Amazon Customer Services, and that she was confirming that I wanted to renew my Amazon Prime account.

She was very insistent that she was genuine and that I should listen to her, and kept repeating this. I explained that I don't have Amazon Prime, and apart from the free 30 day trial, I never have had. Again, she told me that it was a genuine call and that my account hadn't been cancelled after my trial period. She became very verbally abusive, so I ended the call.

I get the prerecorded call from "Amazon" virtually every day, asking me to press 1 to speak to

At this time of year we are quiet on the farm so on the Sunday after Christmas, my wife and I were walking down one of our grass margins adjacent to the roadside ditch running alongside the Northern boundary on Grange Road.

To my displeasure I picked up a can of Rockstar Energy drink, which someone had clearly hurled from a passing vehicle or cycle on the road, this in itself is not uncommon but it is the unintended impact of this irresponsible act that really upset me and my wife.

As I normally do I started to empty the can so I could take it home and put it into our recycling bin, a service I must congratulate ERYC on

Customer services etc, but this is the first live operator I've ever had. I rang Amazon Customer Services from a different phone, and they confirmed that they EVER call customers regarding their accounts unless asked to. They also said that the scammers are "Upping their game" as people are becoming aware of the recorded calls, so are now using live "Amazon associates" to try to get our bank details etc. I was also asked to report the number to Action Fraud. Please make everyone aware of this, and not to respond to the calls, or give out any personal information.

As you can see a simple act of littering can have consequences far greater than the act itself, the leftover drink inside has warnings on the can of its high Caffeine content which is what I assume killed the mice having initially been drawn in by the sugary smell of the leftover drink.

Enough of a moan, but please next time to all concerned please take home your litter and place where appropriate in your ERYC excellent Blue Bin so as not to leave what amounts to lethal death traps all over our countryside.

From the Ward Councillors

First of all, may we wish you the very best for 2021 and we hope it's a better year for all of us as we continue to battle against Covid and hopefully the roll-out of the vaccines allow a return to a more normal life for everyone.

Budget

Over the next few weeks as councillors we will be considering the budget for 2021-2022 and the setting of Council Tax. Never before has there been so much uncertainty as to what the financial pressures will be moving forward as the costs of the pandemic continue, and the unknowns around unemployment, jobs and other impacts on our communities, not to mention Brexit!. One of the largest areas of expenditure is on Adult Social Care, with over £1million per week spent in the East Riding. The pressures on this budget grow yearly as the population ages and the effects of the pandemic on the older population and those in care have resulted in increased costs. The government has put some extra funding in to help but expects the rest to be met by allowing local authorities to increase their council tax by up to 3% on top of any other planned increase specifically to help fund social care. This means a cost to the local taxpayer if implemented, and local government is desperate to see the long-awaited green paper on adult social care funding which has been delayed time and time again. It is a national, cross-party problem, that must be concluded.

The council continues to attempt to provide as many services as it can such as emptying the bins, fixing the roads, keeping schools and libraries open and with the loss of income from places such as leisure centres, will continue to be innovative in delivering its services in different ways.

One thing is for certain, life is never going to be the same again.

Devolution

At the end of last year, we wrote about devolution, since then a piece has been printed in the winter edition of Your East Riding which outlined the principle of what a Mayoral Combined Authority would mean for this area, however the explanation is rather basic and somewhat biased.

If a Mayoral Combined Authority does progress creating another layer of government which will need funding, it is a position where there is no going back, and the initial agreement is one that will certainly change & grow over time.

Our reason for writing is to draw attention to the lack of clarity over when & how residents of the East Riding will have the opportunity to comment on these proposals should they go ahead. This is something you may wish to write to Caroline Lacey, Chief Executive of ERYC & the Leader Cllr Richard Burton asking when the public consultation will take place in the process, assuming the government gives approval to the application for a Mayoral Combined Authority.

Our continued promise to you is we will try and do our bit to ensure the services you want from your local council are provided as effectively as possible and please feel free to contact us at any time with any issues you may have, and we will try to help.


