From the Ward Councillors

In these very strange and unprecedented times the opportunity to send our best wishes and hopes that you all remain safe is welcomed.

We have been delighted by the strength of community spirit shown across our area, there has been a wonderful variety of ideas and projects developed by local organisations, town and parish councils to ensure that the needs of everyone are being recognised and met during this difficult period.

As ward councillors we have been working to deal with a variety of queries from residents and businesses and have contacted some of the more vulnerable residents we are aware of.

ERYC acted swiftly in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic setting up Community Hubs, they have worked with HEY Smile Foundation, a charity which works closely with the private, public and voluntary sectors. The work of the Hubs has been to identify and support the vulnerable within our communities providing a helpline number O1482 393919 and a website for local organisations and town and parish councils to go to and register www.beecan.org. the aim being to build up a detailed database of

organisations that can work alongside ERYC and build resilience when helping those in need.

County Hall in Beverley is almost deserted with 2,500 staff working remotely from home keeping essential services going especially around social care, safeguarding children and adults and keeping the financial services going to support our residents. The close partnership working with the NHS and others has meant that hospitals have been able to free up bed capacity to cope with demand whilst the Council's social care teams help support the care homes and domiciliary care services in the home.

ERYC has also been tasked with distributing the business grants announced by central government, an important piece of work to try and help our businesses keep going and we are pleased to say our council is in the top 3 nationally for the speed in which it is delivering these vital funds.

Despite all the upset and change to our routines over recent weeks isn't it reassuring and a sign of normality to hear the councils refuse vehicles turning up every week to collect our bins.

Driffield and Rural Ward – Burglary numbers in real terms has seen an increase in February. This has been mainly shed and outbuilding break-ins, targeting tools and portable items. A theft of a tractor was also reported and enquiries are ongoing to trace this. There is no specific location or MO and general crime prevention advice still applies.

East Wolds and Coastal Ward – Violence is still up on the year, although with fewer reported incidents during February. Again no trend or location is responsible and there is no special preventative advice.

Across the East Riding we have seen increased reports of thieves targeting Sat Nav systems on Tractors which assist with targeted inputs onto fields. These are very expensive and are usually attached or part of the roof and take some time to remove. Please encourage the reporting of any suspicious activity or vehicles as these thieves are ranging across the county and beyond.

Rural Crime

Officers will continue to conduct drop-ins to farms and businesses to offer advice on target hardening their assets. Fly tipping remains a focus with officers working alongside the East Riding Council Environmental teams to apprehend the culprits.

Operation Galileo

Officers from across the East Riding of Yorkshire area continue to engage in the prevention and detection of wildlife offences and poaching across the ward area. Officers will be using intelligence, new equipment and volunteers in helping to identify offenders and obtaining evidence to form prosecution cases. If you see people with dogs in fields, and if safe to do so, please ring 101 and report the incident.

Operation Galaxy

Our Op Galaxy officers are focused on proactively tackling crime and those responsible

for it. Our task force is also able to identify vulnerabilities and help vulnerable people while we are out in our communities. Please take a look at the news section on our website for frequent full updates and details of arrests made.

Crime News and Appeals

Please note the spike in Burglaries recorded in the Driffield and rural areas as mentioned in Sergeants Whiteheads update. Please review your security arrangements. Officers will continue to patrol by default to vulnerable areas.

Poaching/hare coursing continues to be a problem, however a number of individuals have been caught and are being dealt with by the community team for poaching offences and vehicle/traffic offences.

OP Galileo is continuing through the winter months to combat the poaching issue and to identify the people who are responsible.

If you suspect you have been a victim of fraud please contact police on 101 and visit the action fraud website to report the incident.



Be aware of scammers trying to exploit the coronavirus crisis

During difficult times like these, it's an unfortunate reality that new types of scam activity can appear.

The FCA has issued guidance on some new scams that have arisen during this period. It's important to familiarise yourself with these scams to make sure you don't fall victim to any of them. Some of these include:

- 'Good cause' scams, where scammers will ask you to invest in good causes such as face masks and hand sanitiser production, often promising lucrative returns.
- Cold calls, emails, texts or WhatsApp messages telling you that your bank is in trouble due to coronavirus and you need to transfer your money to an alternative bank account.
- Scammers asking for upfront fees when applying for loans or credit cards that you'll never receive, in an attempt to exploit people experiencing short-term financial concerns.

Contact from your bank or other financial services:

Whilst your health is the most important thing during this crisis, the safety and security of your money is also a priority, and we are treating it as such.

If we ever need to contact you, we'll never:

- Call you and ask you to tell us your password or your memorable word in full.
- Ask you for your full bank details we'll only ask you to confirm the final four digits.
- Ask you to move money into another account, or ask you to pay fees directly into another bank account. We'll also never ask you to pay fees in Bitcoin or any other cryptocurrency.
- Cold call you to try and sell you an investment or product.

If anyone claiming to be from your bank etc asks you for any of these, do not respond.

Protecting yourself

The rules remain the same as ever when approaching potential scams:

- Never give out your personal details if you're not sure who you're speaking to.
- Use the Financial Services Register and Warning List to check who you are dealing with.
- Be vigilant when taking unsolicited calls or checking unexpected emails.
- Avoid being rushed or pressured into making decisions.

We encourage you to follow this guidance as closely as possible. Please stay healthy, safe and secure.

There are still the ordinary common or garden scams to look out for too. I received this one recently. It is designed to frighten you into action and clicking the "Log in" link. This is when some mischief will be done to your computer, probably introducing some malware or virus.

The giveaway is that it is addressed to an email address rather than a proper name. It's easy enough to find out when a vehicle tax is due and mine had been due at the end of the previous month. This is the hook to reel you in.

Your vehicle tax invoice will be sent to a debt collector agency.

Status - Unpaid

You have a deadline of 5 working days to complete the payment, otherwise we will start the procedure of passing your data to the collector agency.

Keep in mind that you will bear all penalties after the agency will start the procedure.


