Parish Council News

Work has commenced on the new housing development at Alderson Mews on Main Street, and the developers need to close the road to carry out drainage connections.

Unfortunately, due to the width of the carriageway, it is not possible to carry out this work with a partial closure. Utilities and other bodies have statutory powers to install apparatus in a public highway, so this closure cannot be refused.

The Parish Council has worked with the developers and East Riding of Yorkshire Council and accepted an option for Main Street to be closed during the half-term school holiday from 22nd to 30th October 2022 between 9:00 am and 3:30 pm daily. The road will remain open to pedestrians, and contingency plans are in place to allow emergency services to pass through if required.

Local Police Station

Driffield Police Station is now open as usual, and although it is not manned 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, there is a buzzer to press for help. Residents have been urged to be aware of any unusual vehicles or suspicious activity in the village and not to be afraid of taking number plates and reporting them and any concerns using phone number 101.

Cemetery

Unfortunately, the Parish Council has received several complaints recently regarding activity in the cemetery. Visitors to the cemetery are reminded that they have permission to tend to the graves of their relatives or friends with the permission of the family only. No Ledgers, kerbs or edging are allowed on or around plots.

ERYC News

Cost of Living Emergency

Elected members that make up the Full Council agreed at its latest meeting to declare a 'Cost of living Emergency' as are many other local authorities across the country. As elected members, we are fully aware of the pressures facing many residents and the fears many will have for later in the year when energy costs and living costs continue to rise.

Declaring an 'emergency' is just to recognise we are aware of concerns. Over the next months, the Council will be continually monitoring the situation with regard to vulnerable residents and ensuring we act where we can to intervene and help.

We will also be keeping a close watch on government initiatives which we can implement locally. In our rural communities, it is more important than ever to keep an eye on neighbours and the vulnerable, and if anyone has worries or concerns, to report them.

Area of Natural Beauty (AONB)

In the last Village Voice edition, we wrote about an email circulated by Natural England inviting comments and attendance at meetings about the designation of an area of the Yorkshire Wolds and the potential for it to be designated as an Area of Natural Beauty.

East Riding of Yorkshire's submission had been for a much larger area than now shown on the website & included much more of the beautiful Yorkshire Wolds landscape within East Riding of Yorkshire up to and including the heritage coast.

Natural England's submission falls short of what was expected as you can see if you visit the webpage on the link below.

Natural England will conduct a formal consultation next year on their plans, but comments received now may well influence the area put forward for the formal process next year.

Whilst there needs to be a recognition, we are unlikely to be offered an area as large as the initial submission now is the time to make your feelings known if you do believe more land should be included in the designated area. ERYC will be submitting a formal response to Natural England's submission

If you could share this information with residents, it would be very helpful.

Draft Climate Change Strategy

After recent weather conditions, there can be little doubt there is a need for change and much work has gone into the production of the East Riding Strategy from both officers and Elected Members. We are writing to make you aware that the strategy is currently in draft form, and we are circulating the link below and inviting people to comment.

The consultation period runs from 1 August until 25 September and will be followed by an action plan. This is an important document affecting all generations and we urge you to read it and respond with any comments.






