Across the Humberside Force area we are receiving regular calls regarding poaching/hare coursing. The poaching is by gangs from well outside the area who arrive by vehicle(s) with a number of hunting dogs, specifically lurcher types, aiming to poach hares. Often significant amounts of money are involved and whilst poaching itself is illegal, it is known that poachers are often in contact with other members of the criminal fraternity and are known to pass onto them details of vulnerable properties, sheds etc which may form easy targets for break-ins and this can obviously affect a number of people. Vehicles such as quads, 4x4 are very attractive to the passing thief and groups may well be on the look out for them to steal Please be extra careful when locking/securing vehicles such as these.

In order to assist the Police in locating and identifying these persons, would all residents please be vigilant, particularly in the outlying area of the Parish and report all suspicious activity, with particular reference to vehicle registration numbers to Humberside Police. We now have new powers under Section 35 to disperse suspicious groups of individuals for up to 48 hours, without requiring specific evidence of law breaking, so every bit of intelligence is important to us. Your assistance is required to keep these criminal activities in check in your Parish.

Albeit not in North Frodingham, we have received reports of a number of thefts of garden ornaments over recent weeks. Many of these have been Christmas presents so their loss is extremely upsetting.

Many of us add interesting features to our gardens, whether they add a touch of humour or are specifically located for aesthetic effect, they are our choice and personal to us. No-one likes their possessions to be damaged and personal possessions stolen.

Please ensure that gardens are as secure as possible and outside buildings and sheds are securely locked. Be vigilant when you are out and about – if you see anything which you believe to be suspicious and it is not an emergency, please call 101 and give the details to Humberside Police.

Crime Prevention advice can also be obtained by ringing the 101 number.







Elections

As we mentioned in your last newsletter for the first time in many years this year the general election, local elections and parish council elections which take place in May are on the same day, which will make for a very busy and interesting time for all involved. As part of the preparation for the election a Notification Letter has gone out to all households now which sets out who is on the electoral register. The aim is to encourage as many residents to register as possible before the registration deadline on the 21 April. Proxy vote deadline is a week later (28 April).

Anyone not registered by this time will be unable to vote in the General and Local Elections. East Riding of Yorkshire Council Electoral team are also attending the halls of residence in Cottingham and Bishop Burton to encourage students to register and are also planning to work with the care homes in the area to ensure their residents are registered and have postal votes, if required.

Winter

As we hopefully head out of winter and into spring we thought it might be of interest to look at some of the statistics of the work undertaken by the gritting team over the winter.

- On 66 occasions full treatments of the Precautionary Network were undertaken
- In addition to this 48 were treatments of particular areas such as coastal strip and higher ground including the Wolds.
- There were also 5 treatments of selected routes because of localised problems
- There were 9 call outs to treat the Secondary Network
- And on one occasion the network was specifically ploughed (because of snow) prior to salting, during other
 Precautionary treatments the network was ploughed as part of normal treatment

Update on History of Nth Frodingham Drainage Book

Some feedback on the book *Becks Banks Drains and Brains* which featured North Frodingham parish as one of the two local case studies, The case study was led by Joy Harris, the parish clerk, and seven other local volunteers contributed to the research and drafting of the chapter. Nearly 800 copies of the book have now been widely distributed, both locally and nationally. It has been extremely well received in both academic, corporate agency and local community contexts. The 2nd edition was a run of 250 which were not LEADER(European funding) funded and the group decided to sell these so far.

Council Tax

Council tax bills will be soon arriving on your doorsteps. East Riding of Yorkshire Council has frozen council tax for another year with no increase since 2009. Local government faces huge financial pressures but cross party support for transformational change to the delivery of services to residents in the East Riding has meant that the council is at the forefront of finding new ways of maintaining services to us all without cutting back. We are pleased as a result to be shortlisted as finalists in the category 'Council of the Year' in the Local Government Chronicle Awards.
