

Disappointingly, there were no group walks for November or December so I'll tell you about an

excursion Ann and I made on our own. We went down into Lincolnshire to the Wildlife Trust site at Donna Nook. Here we found a thriving grey seal colony. As far as the eye could see, from the sea wall to the water's edge, there were mother seals and pups, as well as a few bulls.

From a few hundred seals in the mid-1970's, the colony has expanded rapidly over the last few years to over six thousand with a further 1800 pups born this year.

The air was full of mewing and moaning – not much of a "siren song" – and they were completely



oblivious to all the sight-seers. Ann had no trouble taking the photo. Fortunately the wind was blowing off-shore as the area wasn't too fragrant.

Pupping occurs mostly in October and November, the pups are suckled for five weeks, making huge weightgain, after which they are left to find their way down to the sea and thereafter fend for themselves.

Apart from seals, there were teeming flocks of waders such as lapwing and golden plover and also (new to us) Brent geese. Well worth a visit.



Humberside Police has been contacted by a member of the public advising they have been contacted by a person purporting to be from Barclays Debit card appertaining to suspicious activity on their account. The person outlined some of the transactions which had reputedly been processed on the card, which the card holder knew they had not made. The person advised the card holder that they were transferring them to a Detective Graham STONE of the Metropolitan Police, who would inform them who had been using the card in an inappropriate way. It was also stated that the card holder should transfer an amount of money (advised by Barclays Debt card) into another account for which they would confirm the details in order to cover the cost of the transactions made suspiciously. The member of public was told to transfer £14K to the account! Fortunately the card holder realised this was a scam and terminated the call.

Reports have also been received by Humberside Police regarding persons receiving letters from O_2 (identity theft) advising there are monies overdue on their account and if these are not paid, mobile phones will be disconnected. Check with your phone company if in doubt.

Humberside Police are warning home owners to be aware of bogus telephone callers purporting to be from a Police Magazine selling advertising. It is a scam – the police do not seek private advertisers and would never call you at home to sell advertising. If you receive calls like this put the phone down, wait five minutes for the line to clear or use another phone and then call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.

There are variations of these scams but the object in all cases is to get your details.

With so many banking transactions being done electronically these days, it is sometimes difficult for some persons to discern if they are being contacted by bona fide organisations or individuals. If in doubt, do not give them any

details, ask for a contact number to ring them back on and you will most likely find the call is terminated extremely quickly! If someone were to use your card fraudulently, you would not be liable to repay the monies used by them.

We are also receiving numerous reports of persons on farm land without farm owner's permission with lurchers. Should you see any vehicles parked in gateways or near farm entrances with a number of people and dogs, please do not approach them but endeavour to get their vehicle registrations and call 101. We receive calls from members of the public which have been rung through to us with good intent. Upon investigation of these matters, in some instances persons are there with the owner's consent and knowledge. Some however are not and can be dealt with by the police.



My Last Trip continued

You may remember that previously, "Sparks" the radio operator set off for Rangoon with 6000 tons of petrol in jerry cans at the end of the war, leaving behind his wife and new-born daughter......

After nine thousand miles and forty four days, we arrived in Rangoon. The general cargo was quickly discharged but nobody appeared to want the petrol. Finally after three weeks, the ship was ordered to proceed to Singapore.

Again, no interest was shown in our cargo so, after another two weeks, we were ordered to

go to Hong Kong. Three weeks in Victoria Harbour and then we were ordered up to Li Chi Kok in China. The petrol had been sold to the Chinese government who were then fighting the communists for control of the country.

Waiting for us when we arrived in China were about a thousand Japanese prisoners of war. They certainly speeded up the unloading of the quarter of a million jerry cans. It was difficult for us to understand why we had hawked 6000 tons of petrol thousands of miles when at home there was such a shortage.

Unloading finished, we were directed to Calcutta, the home of our head office. What I feared, happened. I was transferred onto an Indian coast ship. The man I relieved had been out there nearly three years.

Unhappy me!



Report from the Ward Councillors

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council's budget plans and council tax are very much top of our agendas as we head towards 11th February when the Full Council meets to set the Council Budget for 2016/2017.

An important part of the process has been to involve residents & businesses seeking their views on how the council's budget should be prioritised, this was achieved by running an online survey in which people could answer questions about the authority and also at 3 budget events where invited residents and business people attended special events where the council explained its budget process and let them have their say.

Representatives of North Frodingham Parish Council were amongst those attending the first budget event at East Riding Leisure Beverley on Thursday 26 November. Those attending took part in a workshop which highlighted the difficulties of maintaining quality public services amid continuing funding cuts from central government and were asked to choose how they would prioritise financial resources.

The general feedback was that people found the events very helpful giving them an insight into some of the real problems the council faces.

The top priorities for residents who took part in the exercise were that budgets to fund road repairs and maintenance and flood prevention work should be protected.

Courageous Crocodiles

You may remember that during the summer holidays a group of Lifestylers decided to renovate a very overgrown wildlife area at school.......
