You will have heard by now that the anaerobic digestor planned for West Farm, Foston Lane, Beeford has been refused.

A spirited and well-researched opposition was spearheaded by a tri-partite committee Lisa Goodall, Jos Sykes and John Huzzard (North Fodingham), Angela Mckie, David Goodwin and Di Blanchard (Beeford) and Linda Lawson, Janet Robinson, Sandra Grantham (Foston). They immersed themselves in every detail of the plan, expending a great deal of their time and money in the process and we should all be very grateful to them and all the other concerned individuals who put in an objection.

There is still the possibility that the decision will be appealed. The Not Our Waste team will keep an eye on the situation.



In the previous issue the **Social Centre** report highlighted the need for more people to help out — events were having to be cancelled because of insufficient members to safely run them. Here's your chance to make a big difference to village life by offering just a few hours when needed. You are sure of a very warm welcome!

Correction.....

During the course of the objections to the AD plant, Dr Sowerby was concerned about a possible misconception. She wrote "The presence or otherwise of a doctors' surgery in Beeford is not dependant on whether or not Beeford is a Rural Service Centre and therefore, whether or not the anaerobic digester affects Beeford's status in this regard, this will not mean that the residents of North Frodingham or Beeford will lose their doctors' surgery. There are certainly other threats around currently to the provision of local Primary Health Care Services but this is not one of them and we would wish to reassure our patients regarding this."

In addition Council heard a short presentation by Mrs Pickering about the proposal to use Green Lane Farm to house autistic young men, and their carers, in a safe and controlled environment. Mrs Pickering stressed that there would be minimal interaction with the village and absolutely no need for concern.

Mrs Sykes updated Council about the proposed CAD plant at Beeford, planning for which has recently been refused by East Rising Council. Whilst celebrating a victory for common sense

(about the suitability of the chosen site) we must not forget that the developer can go to Appeal. Please keep your 'NO' notices on display for the time being.

Cemetery news: The sealed envelopes of two quotes had been received and were opened at the end of the March meeting; one from Mr Maurice Wilson and Sons, of Frodingham, the other from Mr Jason Pea of Beeford. The totals quoted for this season's works were very similar and could not be used as the sole basis for a decision. The discussion then moved to the known ability of the gardeners. Mr Wilson's son had held the contract last year and had impressed with the standard of his work. Mr Pea had carried out garden work for one of the Councillors, who had been impressed by the quality of the work.

Despite the discussion included a natural desire to give young Mr Pea a chance to expand his business, in the end the decision was made on the proposed work schedule and its importance in monitoring performance. Council voted seven in favour of Mr Wilson's tender, with two abstentions.

<u>Village website:</u> The Council website is now operating smoothly and is attracting a number of hits. Details of Council business, Agenda, signed Minutes and quarterly accounts will be regularly posted. Members of the Council are beginning to get to grips with reviewing planning applications on screen rather than as hard copy; although the new (cheaper) method is not considered to be as useful.

<u>Council Vacancy:</u> The Parish Council is looking for one more resident to make up the quota of Councillors, how about YOU?





Beeford Anaerobic Digester Planning Application

On Thursday 14th April following weeks of waiting from local residents & ourselves the planning application for the Anaerobic Digester Plant at Beeford finally went to the Planning Committee for determination. We have worked closely with the campaign group since last October when the application was submitted, giving advice on planning process and what to expect. We have been so impressed by the work of the local residents involved in the campaign to oppose the application and the hundreds of people who wrote in objecting, it made a huge difference, if ever there was an example of how to object to a planning application this was it.

There was only room for 50 people to get in and observe the planning meeting on 14th April but we did see a number of North Frodingham residents there, the debate was quite lengthy but good. As ward members we both had the opportunity to speak for 5 minutes along with an objector and a supporter. We used our time to put a strong case for refusal and again we worked with your campaign group so we knew exactly what areas each of us was covering. I believe every member of the planning committee spoke and each in turn

condemned the application and then finally there was a unanimous vote for refusal.

Of course things aren't over yet and the applicant does have the right to appeal the decision and go to an independent inspector in an effort to get the decision reversed, this was the reason that the grounds for refusal were so important. We proposed the application be refused on 'Harm to a Local Amenity & Rural Landscape, this is irrefutable and something our planning officers can defend if the need arises. We now enjoy the moment knowing we got the right decision but wait to see whether the applicant will appeal.

Fracking

We are already being contacted by a number of residents wanting to discuss their concerns over Fracking. We have been pleased to meet with people and discuss what we understand of the position. At this moment we have no applications to Frack in the East Riding but it is good that we and many people are fact finding and discussing their concerns. In my knowledge this is the first time an opposition group has been ahead of developers in preparing for proposals that may come forward.

Fracking is quite definitely something we will be talking to you about again.



There are some old scams reappearing with a bit of a face-lift; they are THE GOOD CITIZEN AWARD and CHEAP ELECTRICAL GOODS.

Protect yourself:

There is no genuine 'Good Citizen Award' scheme in the UK that operates by cold calling "winners" and asking for an upfront fee to release a grant. If you receive a call which claims to represent such a scheme, IT IS A SCAM!!! End the phone call – do not give out any personal or financial data.

Fraudsters are setting up high specification websites advertising various electrical goods and domestic

appliances. These goods are below market value and **do not exist**. The website will state you can pay via card; however when the purchaser goes to pay, this option is not available and the payment must be made via bank transfer.

The fraudster entices the purchaser and reassures them it is a legitimate purchase by using the widely recognised Trusted Shop Trustmark. They then use the Trustmark fraudulently and provide a link on the bogus electrical website to another bogus website (which purports to be Trusted Shops). This website shows a fake certificate purporting to be from Trusted Shops and provides thousands of reviews for the bogus electrical website. These reviews are all fraudulent.

The FRAUDSTER'S website has not been certified by Trusted Shops and therefore the purchaser is not covered by the Trusted Shop money-back guarantee.

Please keep your wits about you, and stay safe.

DOG FOULING AND EXCLUSION

Extracts from The Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014

<u>"FOULING</u> – If within the parish of North Frodingham a dog defecates on land to which the public has access and a person in charge of the dog fails to remove the faeces, that person shall be guilty of an offence."

<u>"EXCLUSION</u> - The East Riding of Yorkshire Council has made the following Public Spaces Protection Order for North Frodingham at 1) Social Centre grounds childrens' play area.

2) North Frodingham Primary School

A person in charge of a dog shall be guilty of an offence if he takes the dog onto, or permits the dog to enter, any land in the above schedule."



Retailers across Hull and the East Riding are being urged to be on their guard after at least 10 shopkeepers have been conned into accepting forged £50 notes. A number of convenience stores, cafes and garden centres in Bridlington, Hornsea. Flamborough, Driffield, Stamford Bridge and Preston have been targeted since 1st April. In each case young boys with Irish accents have gone into the premises and bought items totalling less than £10 before leaving with their change. Only after they have left has it been realised the £50 note is a fake. The youths in the incidents reported to date are described as white, aged between 10 and 12 years old.

Bank notes which are printed for the UK have a wealth of hidden security features. Run your fingernail across the number fifty and you will feel how bumpy the surface is. The tactile intaglio print deposits the ink in recesses in the paper surface also giving the bank note its crisp, shiny quality. When a counterfeit note reaches a bank, the forged note is taken out of circulation.

Be vigilant you do not get passed any forged £50 notes. If you have a note which you believe to be counterfeit, you must take it to the police as soon as you can. They will provide you with a receipt and send the counterfeit to the bank for analysis. If the note is genuine reimbursement will be made in full.

There have been a number of thefts from motor vehicles in North Yorkshire. Albeit this is not in our Force area, the perpetrators could move into our area. Entry has been gained to parked and unattended vehicles including vans, resulting in some instances of tools being stolen. In particular, if anyone tries to sell you Makita tools and/or specialist plumbing tools including an Anton gas cylinder and Rothenberg freeze machine, these may well be the result of these thefts. If you wish to remain anonymous, you can pass information onto Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. The North Yorkshire reference is 12160057637.

There appears to be an issue with bogus callers who purport to be from the Police or from a police

magazine. It is a scam. There have been recent incidents whereby members of the public have been contacted by the scammers in relation to advertising in a police magazine. If you receive a call from anyone saying they are selling advertising for the police, do not fall for it – the police do not seek price advertisers and would never call you at home to sell advertising. If you receive calls like this put the phone down, wait five minutes for the line to clear and then call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.

What should you do if you are contacted by these persons:-

Never give out bank or personal details to strangers

Do not hand over money or transfer funds to unknown accounts

If you are called, use another phone to call the police to report the incident but do not use your own phone immediately as the offender may be on the line a short time after you have put your phone down.

If you book your holidays on-line, be very mindful. More than £64,000 was lost by would-be holiday makers from the Humberside force area last year, who were conned out of their hard earned cash by online criminals. This is not a problem unique to our area, with UK travellers losing a total of £11.5 million in 2015, according to a report by the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau. The report revealed that 4,910 cases of holiday fraud were reported Fraud. Humberside Police and its partner Get Safe Online have teamed up with ABTA to highlight the issue in the hope of preventing others falling for similar scams.

The most common type of fraud nationally relates to the sale of airline tickets, although there has been a large increase in the number of owner accounts on popular accommodation websites being hacked too.
