At the June meeting the main problem reported was the poor state of the verges. The warm, wet weather we are experiencing this year has led to rapid weed growth which is particularly hazardous at road junctions. Your Parish Council has been in touch with the East Riding Highways Department and has been assured that the verges will soon be cut, in the meantime – take care.

Village website: The Council website is now operating smoothly and is attracting a number of hits. Details of Council business, Agenda, signed Minutes and quarterly accounts are regularly posted. Members of the Council are still struggling to get to grips with reviewing planning applications on their computers. To assist with this Council has purchased a large screen for use at its meetings. History Group (Joy Harris)

The last meeting of the History Group was a great success with our much-respected friend David Mooney, historian and stonemason, giving an excellent talk about "Memorials and Memories".

He started his slide presentation with a statement made by Charles Dickens at the end of the 19th century, "grave memorials are silent" and then proceeded to totally refute that claim. For David, memorials "speak" to you and can tell you a lot of information if you are prepared to use your eyes and brain.

He told of the death of a young girl whose elaborate memorial showed her being lifted from the soil by two stone angels. Beautifully carved and very emotive was his considered opinion and so far removed from the sterile modern style. He showed slides of some that had designs illustrating the life of the deceased, an image of the lifeboat in which the man died, and a simple carving of a stonemason's tools.

David spoke of his respect for the stonemasons of yesterday and a little of his scorn for the modern computer-generated memorials of today, but above all he recommended that we "listen to the memorial stones" in our little cemetery and see what they can tell us about earlier residents.

Our July meeting will be the members summer outing to Ryedale Folk Museum; and for anyone wishing to try out the History Group the September 15th meeting will be about Emmotland and its role in the development of North Frodingham.



An Entry for North Frodingham in White's Directory 1840

FRODINGHAM (NORTH) is a well-built village, consisting chiefly of one long street of detached houses, on the east side of the river Hull, nearly 6 miles S.E. of Driffield. It formerly had a weekly market, which was transferred to Driffield about 80 years ago, but it has still two annual fairs for pedlery, &c., held July 10th and October 2d. Its parish comprises 711 inhabitants, and 2880 acres of fertile land, including the hamlet of Emmotland, near the junction of the Driffield canal with the river Hull. Richard Bethell, Esq., is lord of

the manor and owner of a great part of the soil, but P. Saltmarshe, owns Frodingham Grange, (400 a. allotted for the great tithes, and Messrs. R. and J. Harrison have estates here. The Church (St. main) is an ancient edifice, with a tower at the west end, and and Messis. It and a transformative estates here. The Church (St. Elgin) is an ancient edifice, with a tower at the west end, and was thoroughly repaired in 1816. A gallery at the west end was erected by subscription in 1786. The vicarage, valued in K.B. at £5, and now at £170, was augmented with £600 of Q.A.B. from 1777 to 1786, with a yearly rent charge of £10 and an oxegon of land and with a yearly rent charge of £10 and an oxgang of land, left by the Rev. Christopher Blackston, in the latter year. The Rev. Francis Drake is patron, and the Rev. Wm. Drake incumbent. Here are three chapels belonging to the Independents and the Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists. The parish has the interest of £30, left by the Rev. Samuel Hunter, for schooling poor children, and the interest of £10, left by Francis Smith, in 1812, for distributions of bread.

For this edition we touch on two areas which we think will be of interest.

Heating

A household is said to be in fuel poverty if 10% or more of household income is spent on adequate heating in the home, and adequate means 21 degrees for the main living area and 18 degrees for other occupied rooms. Over the last five years the East Riding has historically had between 14-18% (approx. 25,000) households classed as being fuel poor, this is slightly above the national average of between 12-14% of households and a reflection of the more rural nature.


East Riding of Yorkshire Council has been very successful in attracting external funding to invest in this area, which has led to national recognition, schemes such as Health through Warmth and Yorswitch continue to have an impact supporting vulnerable households.

There is still a lot of funding for gas central heating and gas connections from the Dept. of Energy & Climate Change

Have done this in the past in North Frodingham as people still using coal, storage heaters and can get mains gas. Fracking

A Motion on Fracking taken to Full Council at County Hall, Beverley on Wednesday 22nd June was well received by councillors & given general support. The Motion highlighted need take to precautionary approach applications which may have an effect upon the aquifer, environment, local communities & landscape. The Motion gave us the opportunity as your local ward members to highlight some of the concerns about Fracking which residents in our ward have drawn to our attention. There is a worrying haste by some companies to start fracking with still so many questions around the process not answered satisfactorily. The voting in favour of the Motion will allow members of the Environment & Regeneration Overview & Scrutiny Committee to fully scrutinise fracking ahead of any applications which may be forth coming.



Many people know that full council tax has to be paid for a property if two or more people live there and that people who live on their own can apply for a council tax discount.

What they may not know is that they might also be able to get a discount if someone living there qualifies for one of several types of other council tax reductions as a carer or have mental health problems or physically disabled.

Those who have reached pension age also qualify if they would otherwise have been entitled to one of these benefits. 

Messages sent by Action Fraud (Action Fraud, Administrator, National).

Businesses are being contacted for the sale of goods or services by fraudsters, who request to pay by cheque. The fraudster sends a cheque with a higher value than the amount expected, and then sends the business a request for the difference with instructions on how it should be paid back. This is usually by bank transfer or

through a money transfer service, such as Western Union or PaySafe. Once the 'refund' has been provided, it is realised that the cheque provided was fraudulent and no funds are credited to the business's account.

The suspects have used pressure tactics to persuade victims to refund the amounts immediately prior to the cheque.

Crime Prevention Advice

Be cautious of payments where the amount provided is higher than expected. Refuse to provide the service unless the correct balance is received or wait until the cheque has cleared before refunding the difference.

- Always contact banks on a trusted number found on their website or correspondence that is known to be authentic to confirm whether the cheque has cleared.
- Do not feel pressured to provide a refund before the cheque has cleared.
 If you have been affected by this, or any other scam, report it to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040, or visiting www.actionfraud.police.uk

Also,0 a new phishing campaign which has hit students of UK universities, claims that the student has been awarded an educational grant by the Department for Education. The email purports to have come from the finance department of the student's university and tricks the recipient into clicking on a link contained in the message to provide personal and banking details.

One victim reported that after submitting their sensitive information (including name, address, date of birth, contact details, telephone provider, bank account details, student ID, National Insurance Number, driving licence number and mother's maiden name), they were taken to a spoofed website which appeared like a genuine website of their bank, where they were asked to type in their online banking login credentials.

Protect yourself:

- Do not click on any links or open attachments contained within unsolicited emails.
- Do not reply to scam emails or contact the senders in any way.
- If an email appears to have come from a person or organisation you know of but the message is unexpected or unusual, contact them directly via another method to confirm that they sent you the email.
- If you receive an email which asks you to login to an online account via a link provided in the email, instead of clicking on the link, open your browser and go directly to the company's website yourself.
- If you have clicked on a link in the email, do not supply any information on the website that may open.

If you think you may have compromised the safety of your bank details and/or have lost money due to fraudulent misuse of your cards, you should immediately contact your bank, and report it to Action Fraud on the phone number or web site shown above.
