



Parish Council

September/ October meetings

The September meeting was routine with ongoing project reports and those from Police and Social Centre Committee. The replacement bench has been bought and those at the Church are in the process of being renovated. Concerns were again raised about the amount of dog mess being left for others to clear up and about the use of the recreation ground for 'fun' which should be conducted indoors and in privacy. As with the dog problem if you must use the open spaces please take your litter home, or at least put it in the bin.

October was a longer and more complex meeting, James Durham, ERYC Planning Development Manager, gave the assembled councillors a comprehensive talk about Neighbourhood Planning which led, after he had left the meeting, to a lengthy discussion about whether Frodingham should embark on such a time and cost-consuming endeavour. Social Centre


Christmas Fair This has been scheduled for Saturday December 3rd and several groups / individuals have expressed an interest in taking part. Father Christmas has been booked and the Parish Council has agreed to fill his sack of 'goodies' for the youngsters of the village. Tombola, refreshments, Christmas baubles and games will be on offer. Tables are still available and we make only a very small charge of £5, or free if you are selling for a charity. Do come along and join in the fun, this and the Summer Fair are the only village-wide events held each year and any monies raised will go towards good causes, or to help keep the village hall open for your groups to use and private events to enjoy.



Ongoing projects: The storeroom shelving has been commissioned, we only have to find an acceptable space in the calendar and work will start. So far Mr Geoff Rudd's repair to the meeting room ceiling is holding, and we are keeping an eye on this.

Evening talk: We held our first evening talk of the season, Thursday 20th October when John Close, Emergency Manager Northern Gas, talked about his work and the problems he has dealt with as an outcome of carbon monoxide poisoning. The moderate audience in attendance were impressed by the knowledge and skills that he has obviously accumulated since working in the gas industry all of his working life. It was comforting to know that if we have a problem, this emergency service is well-equipped to handle it. John told us how to recognise a potential CO leakage, the colour of a flame or the presence of sooty deposits will confirm that a gas appliance is not working properly, he also let us know that the industry is striving to remove the toxic element CO. Until that happy result has been achieved he strongly recommended having gas appliances serviced annually, using only a Safe Gas registered engineer and investing in a CO detector to be placed near the ceiling and in the vicinity of the appliance. That way we should be safe. He also urged us not to hesitate calling for help if we smell gas.

Finally our increasingly desperate plea, please will some of you come along and support the Social Centre Committee? The only cost is about an hour of your time once a month, and the use of your brains to give us some new ideas.

Forthcoming meetings. In September we heard a talk about Emmotland from Mr Steve Sissons. It wasn't quite what we had expected, Steve had researched in some detail the possible location of the Battle of Brunanburh AD 937. He quoted a poem from the Anglo-Saxon Chronicles giving gory details of this the largest battle on English soil prior to the Norman Conquest in 1066. Steve then said that he had been asked where the battle had been staged, whilst on a walking party near the airfield at Driffield. He proceeded to offer a very plausible claim that it may have been held close to the villages of Kirkburn, Battleburn and Eastburn, and that the invading coalition fleet, bent on making its way to York, had disembarked near to Emmotland

having made its way up the Humber. Steve admitted that there is scant archaeological evidence for this being correct, although several large horse shoes have been found at Southburn and small horse shoes at Elmswell; it is known that the southern cavalry of the time favoured very large horses and the northern cavalries a smaller breed. Also, it is recorded, navvies digging the Hull to Driffield railway, came across many skulls at Corpse Landing, near Emmotland. Where was the Battle of Brunanburh? Was Emmotland involved? Who can be sure — at least it gave us an entertaining evening and something to ponder.

November meeting The History Group's AGM will include a 'curious artefact' quiz to be presented by Derek Clerk which will be followed by a light buffet and time for a good gossip.

Visitors are welcome at any of our meetings for the princely sum of one pound. Membership for next year will cost seven pound and include five in-house meetings, and a subsidised summer outing. How about joining?





FROM WARD COUNCILLORS JANE EVISON AND JONATHAN OWEN

BUDGET

As we near the end of 2016 our thoughts are focussed on next year's budget and how important services are to be protected in the following financial year. As in past years the council has undertaken Budget Events with residents, parish council representatives & business and the outcome of the process will be made public in the fullness of time on the council's website. I think it is fair to say that whilst the budget process gets harder each year, £118 million savings since 2010 and a further £60 million to be made by 2020, ERYC is in a much better place than many other councils and the sound financial planning that operates within the council is allowing us to manage the financial changes in a sensible practical manner. However the longer term effects of Brexit and the move to local authorities retaining business rates to offset grants from central government make it increasingly difficult to plan many years ahead. The loss of European funding in future will affect the East riding which was a benefactor from funds in the past.

RURAL STRATEGY

The new East Riding of Yorkshire Rural Strategy for 2016 – 2020 which is in place to raise the profile of rural issues has recently been adopted. The document has been prepared following an extensive public consultation & has been endorsed by the Rural Partnership; it highlights many of the local issues such as housing, broadband, transport, flooding &looks at effective approaches to developing rural communities and business. The strategy accepts it is no longer enough to decide what needs doing but most importantly how things are done.

May we wish all residents a happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year despite all the uncertainties in the world.

P.S.

Bad news I am afraid, it was confirmed yesterday (20 Oct) that the applicant has lodged an appeal to the decision taken to refuse the Beeford Biogas application. It will now go to a public inquiry.



A member of the public received a letter from a company called "Extra Energy Supply Ltd, Birmingham" advising there was outstanding logged his debt against details. Reviewing the paperwork the gentleman believed this may be false and tried to check their details out on the internet. It was found they also trade as "Credit Style The gentleman made no Ltd, Sheffield". contact with him due to his suspicions and has not suffered any financial loss at this time. He has contacted Action Fraud. If anyone else is contacted by either of these alleged companies, please be mindful.

We have received reports across the Force area of two men approximately 6ft tall and described as being "rat faced" maintaining they were collecting for the Green Howards and ex-prisoners. One member of public whose house they attended advised he was too busy – their response was they spat at him. If anyone else is visited by these individuals, please try to get as detailed a description as possible and contact 101.

A gentleman having parked his car in a permitted zone, returned a short time afterwards to find a parking ticket on his windscreen. The ticket appeared to be issued by a company known as UKCPS. The details outlined on the ticket were incorrect and the gentleman was fortunate to find a parking warden who reviewed the ticket and believed it to be a scam, advising the member of the public to contact the police, which he promptly did. If anyone else finds a parking ticket on your vehicle from this company, please advise us on 101.

A report has been received from a householder whose wooden garden shed has been broken into. It is believed the perpetrators entered the garden from the rear

during the night, cutting a hole in the shed door possibly with a hacksaw. Items stolen were a lawnmower, an electric power washer and an electric strimmer. Anyone who stores similar items in their garden shed, as well as ensuring sheds are securely locked, it may be prudent to consider the erection of sensor lighting. It may not stop the most determined of criminals, but it could be another deterrent and is not as expensive as a CCTV system.

There have been reports in the media across the country of persons wearing clown masks or outfits jumping out at people frightening them and some have been armed with items such as baseball bats/knives. Our Force area is unfortunately no exception. Reports have been received around our Force area of persons wearing such masks or outfits scaring members of the public. If anyone is approached by someone wearing a clown outfit or mask, please contact 101. Offenders can be charged by the police for this offence.

A vehicle has been broken into in our area by unknown means – the locks have not been damaged, the windows were not smashed. A search of the vehicle was made resulting in money and a sat nav being stolen. Please remember to secure your vehicles and do not leave any valuables such as money/laptops/sat navs in them overnight.

We have received reports of house burglaries across the Force area, including Manor Green and on Main Street in Frodingham on 30th October. Some gaining access via insecure doors — as we are approaching Christmas criminals will take any opportunity available to them to obtain money or steal items they can sell for cash. Two men were disturbed while thieving and their images caught on CCTV. Please make life as difficult as possible for thieves. Lock, check, sleep — be worry free.

PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDERS







INTRODUCTION

Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) assist in dealing with nuisance in relation to the control of dogs, consumption of alcohol or access to certain public areas that are detrimental to the local communities way of life, by imposing conditions on the use of that area which apply to everyone. They are designed to ensure the law-abiding majority can use public spaces, safe from anti-social behaviour.

When considering the introduction of the Orders East Riding of Yorkshire Council has taken into account the needs of those in charge of dogs and the interests of those affected by dogs with emphasis, in particular, placed on the needs of children to have access to dog free areas and also the need for those in charge of dogs to have access to areas where they can exercise their dogs without unnecessary restrictions.

THE FOULING OF LAND BY DOGS

This makes it an offence if a dog defecates at any time on any land in the open air within the East Riding of Yorkshire to which the public have access (with or without payment) and the person who is in charge of the dog at that time fails to remove the faeces forthwith.

DOGS ON LEADS

These Orders include cemeteries and churchyards in the East Riding of Yorkshire which are included in the Orders. This makes it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to keep the dog on a lead, at any time, on any land from which dogs not on a lead are excluded.

DOG EXCLUSION

This makes it an offence for a person in charge of a dog to take the dog onto or allow the dog to enter or remain on land from which dogs are excluded.

The orders apply at all times to all enclosed children's play areas which are, or form part of, land included in the Orders which is available on the East Riding of Yorkshire Council website: www.eastriding.gov.uk or can be requested by telephoning (01482) 393939.

The orders apply at all times to all grounds of educational establishments within the administrative area of East Riding of Yorkshire Council included in the Orders which is also available on East Riding of Yorkshire Council website or by calling the above number.

In the first instance these offences may be dealt with by way of a fixed penalty notice of £75. Failure to pay the fixed penalty notice may result in further legal action being taken against the person who was in control of the dog at the time.

Nothing in the Orders apply to a person who is registered as a blind person or has a disability for which he relies upon an assistance dog trained by a prescribed charity.
