

Planning Appeal: Waste Plant at Beeford

Unfortunately the appeal against the refusal of planning permission of an anaerobic digester plant at Beeford was submitted by the applicants on the morning of the last day by which they could appeal. Permission was refused by ERYC on the grounds of amenity and visual impact which covers the scale of the proposed industrial sized development in open countryside.

The villages of Beeford, North Frodingham and Foston on the Wolds mounted a very professional opposition to the original application to which nearly all residents signed up to.

Now that support and involvement will be necessary again - as ward members we have already met with the Campaign Action Group &

ERYC planning officers to discuss the appeal process & establish how we can work together most effectively.

We believe this last minute appeal has infuriated residents who will actively support the NOW campaign (Not Our Waste!) and we will play our part by working closely with planners & the campaign group, submitting letters of objection to the Planning Inspectorate & speaking at the Public Inquiry. On a lighter note may we take this opportunity of wishing everyone a Very Happy & Healthy 2017

Parish Council

The December meeting was preceded by a short presentation from Mrs Angela McKie. Her main objective was to persuade the Council of the importance of restating their objection to the Beeford, anaerobic digester plant to the Appeal Inspectorate. This, the Council agreed to do and members restated their intention of sending a further email/letter to reinforce the message.

After this, the formal meeting was convened and routine business conducted. There was a slight change to the order on the Agenda to allow Cllr Doyle to leave the meeting before his Outline Planning Application was discussed.

Special Inspector Wilson reported that Frodingham was escaping fairly lightly with little attention being paid to the village by miscreants; however she asked that we continue to be on guard against opportunistic thieves, poachers and email/door-to-door and telephone scams all of which are active throughout the country.

Your Council has agreed to continue to support the Twilight Bus, so that our young

people can join after school clubs in Driffield and still get the bus home. It also discussed and agreed not to increase the Precept demand for the next financial year. The Precept is the amount of money the Council can get from East Riding Council to run the business of North Frodingham. This money is collected through the Council Tax and paid in two instalments. Unlike most taxes, this one will NOT increase.

Some of you will have noticed the new bench on the Main Street/ Grange Road corner; this was bought by a grant from the Lissett Wind Farm Fund. Council does apologise that it does not provide a fascinating rural view for users, however it felt that being able to access the seat from the footpath would probably be of more benefit.

Next meeting of the Parish Council will be 9th January, 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. These are Open Meetings, anyone can attend and the Agenda and Minutes are regularly published on the Village website for your information. Joy Harris

Social Centre

Well it has been quite a year for the Social Centre Committee! We have had some successes; a defibrillator talk and another on carbon monoxide poisoning attracted several residents; the Summer Fair was well attended and finances have stayed 'in the black' throughout the period.

The Village Hall has had all requisite safety checks including, fire, electrical, heating and extinguishers, all of which have added to the cost of maintaining the hall for use.

The Committee has secured the services, twice a year, of an external playground inspector to check that the equipment is in good order. As it is not possible to supervise the playground; the Committee would ask that anyone seeing

youngsters misusing the equipment would take action to prevent a potential accident.

A positive event this year has been the installation of shelving in the store cupboard. This had become an accident 'black spot' in the building with equipment threatening to 'brain' anyone daring to enter the room. All is now safely stored away, with steps provided to reach the upper shelves, the 'Jellytots' push chairs, toys and prams have been found parking spaces and there is space to get into the room.

On the negative side, sadly the Youth club had a minor mishap with children playing in and locking themselves in the disabled toilet. All were safely freed by some enterprising dads, but the lock has been damaged beyond repair and the Committee has still to find a suitable, child proof replacement.

The gas boiler timer is still not working properly and will have to be replaced, meanwhile a member of the Committee has to check that the heating is turned 'on before a meeting and 'off' afterwards.

But the roof leak in the Main Hall has not re-occurred, thanks to the kind offices of Geoff Rudd.

To end on a positive note the Committee has been joined by the new PTA, who is already contributing a 'new-blood' boost to the working of the Group.

Now, if we can attract someone from St Elgin's, and Jellytots to join us we will be fully formed, the Youth Club, Parish Council and Senior's group are already represented. We only need about one hour a month - .next meeting February 6th 2017 at 7.00 pm.

We have been receiving reports across the Force area, particularly in the run up to Christmas of persons calling at houses endeavouring to sell items such as large flat screen TV's or similar expensive items of equipment. Please remain vigilant if persons approach you at home with a view to selling products, if they are bona fide salespersons they should have some form of ID on them along with a Hawkers licence which is signed by the Chief Constable of the local Force area.

There have been reports of vehicles having their front and rear registration plates removed whilst vehicles are parked up overnight. This could be to affix your number plates to vehicles being used in criminal acts to disguise the true identification of the vehicle(s) in question.

A lot of commercial vehicles now have a sticker on the back doors advising that no tools are kept in the vehicle overnight. It appears at this time that premises are being broken into which are secure and power tools are being stolen. Please remain vigilant if you are approached by anyone endeavouring to sell power tools or if you go to markets and power
