**Parish Council** The Parish Council has met twice since my last report, the January meeting was, as usual, dominated by the forthcoming Appeal for the Digester Plant at Beeford to be granted planning approval. The Parish Council has registered its continued opposition to the plant with the Inspectorate and has concentrated on the increased HGV traffic this would impose on the Village and the potential damage it would cause. Councillors were urged to send their personal objections to the Inspectorate as apparently 'it is numbers that count'. Apart from ongoing business the only other decision made was for a Village Plan to be produced for North Frodingham. A small working party will be set up to finalise an approach to this work which will involve a request for participation from all residents. Perhaps you would like to be thinking about improvements you would like to see in the village over the next few years.

The February meeting of the Parish Council started with a briefing from one of the CAD

Plant committee to update on progress to date. As an outcome of this together with a newspaper report an approach has been made to the local MP for his views. It is understood that he too has registered his opposition to the proposed plant. Full details of this and the other matters dealt with can be found on the Council website.

The Council also made the final payment for the new bench at the Grange Road corner and renovation of the two benches at the Church. The bench on the corner of Highside has been included in the payment, which has been heavily subsidised by a grant from the Lissett Wind Farm money, and this work will be completed when the weather improves. Just make sure you look before you sit as Spring approaches!

The next meeting of the Group will be held Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March, in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm. The speaker will be Peter Burnell, a member of the Yorkshire Dialect Society, who will give a talk entitled 'Speaking Yorkshire' at which some of the 'strange' words one still hears from the locals will be explained, and the subtleties of the dialect fully revealed in some of his own poetry.

Visitors and new members are always welcome, if you are coming for the evening it will cost you one pound, and if you decide to join our group the annual membership is just seven pound for which you get the remaining programme of events and an outing in July, to say nothing of great company and light refreshments at each meeting!



#### Social Centre

The Management Committee is still struggling to provide a quorum for decisions at its meetings. The February 'get together' was hampered bv ill health and other commitments, which meant that only two members were present and no financial decisions could be made. Several matters were discussed for inclusion on the next month's Agenda.

The gas boiler is awaiting a service and a new timer so, for the time being, both water and heating are left on and the temperature is controlled by the thermostat in the Main Hall. Users of the Hall are asked to turn the thermostat to about 18 degrees at the start of their meeting and to turn it down to below 10 degrees as they leave the Hall. That way we can, hopefully, keep the next gas bill at a reasonable level.

That brings me on to the next matter we discussed, finance, we MAY have to increase the hourly rate for hiring the hall. Everything has gone up in price over the last few years, gas, electricity, rates and insurance but our hiring rates have remained the same for the last nine years. We will make a decision at the next meeting and will notify Group leaders immediately after that; please do not panic the increase will be as small as possible and will not come into effect until September at the earliest – that much was decided.

Please can we attract someone from St Elgin's, and Jellytots to join us, the Youth Club, Parish Council, History and Senior's group are already represented. We only need about one hour a month - next meeting February 6<sup>th</sup> 2017 at 7.00 pm. If we can get to a Committee of seven we will have a good chance of reaching a quorum each meeting. pond surrounded by weeping willows. Onwards and over the Garton road, we headed up a wellmaintained track with ancient hedgerow on one side and open fields on the other.


This brought us to Spellowgate with its broad verge and views over the Wolds. Heading back to Driffield





We are thanking all villagers for their continued support.

The Beeford Anaerobic Digester appeal inquiry is scheduled to begin on Tuesday 3rd October 2017.

This is likely to be held at County Hall Beverley but this venue has as yet not been confirmed.

The inquiry is expected to take six working days, not counting Mondays. Anyone can speak at a public inquiry; we will provide further information on this in the future.

The NOW Group also wishes to inform all residents that fundraising is now essential to be able to have good representation at the inquiry.

The group has up to now personally funded the campaign.

Some funds have already very kindly been donated and these have been deposited at the bank.

We are looking at raising a minimum of £30,000.

This may seem a lot of money but we have 1000 households in our 3 villages. For example, this would only amount to £7.50 per person for a 4 person household, a small price to pay for not having a Waste Plant on our doorstep.

A successful outcome can of course never be guaranteed.

Of course some villagers have already been generous, others may not be able to afford this amount, any donations are welcome.

A bank account is now operational. If you wish to donate, direct payments can be made to the NatWest Bank at 28 Market Place, Driffield.

The sortcode is 60-07-05, the Account number is 40163393.

Cheques need to be made payable to: 'NOW Community Action Group'.

Cash donations are also possible.

Receipts will be given (please enclose address if you would like one) and all donations will be recorded for inspection, if so required.

#### **Council Tax**

As letters come through your letter box you will see that East Riding of Yorkshire Council has set a budget which will see a 4.99% increase in council tax, the first for five years, 3% of which is the social care precept that government has allowed local authorities to raise which has to go towards social care. Despite this, over the next four years, the social care precept, even if used each year, will only cover 46% of the estimated pressures on the care services and a further £10 million of savings will have to be found. Often, council tax payers don't realise that the council tax is only a proportion of the money the council uses to run its services. To offset the reduction in other funding, especially from government, then the council tax would have to be increased far beyond that planned.

Central government funding will be reducing year on year and replaced by funding generated from keeping local business rates which are currently collected by central government and redistributed. The council, through prudent financial management, business transformation, cost reduction and asset rationalisation will do its utmost to continue to deliver quality, value for money services to its residents.

#### **Beeford Anaerobic Digester update**

As previously mentioned, the anaerobic digester plant application refusal at Beeford has been taken to appeal by the applicants. The local NOW (Not Our Waste) group are working with the East Riding Planners to build the case to fight the appeal at the public enquiry which is likely to be held later this year - possibly October time. Representatives of the NOW group have been keeping Nth.Frod. Parish Council updated at their meetings and as local ward members; we are keeping abreast of all progress and have submitted our letter to the planning inspector outlining our grounds for objection. Can we reassure all residents that we will continue to fully support you & the campaign group. (cont p 17)

What do you need to do?





#### **Early Years Education**

At the Cabinet meeting held on 28th February at County Hall, Beverley, councillors approved a request for a publication of a Statutory Notice to enable Nth Frodingham Primary School to admit children of two year old and provide school based early years education with effect from 24th April 2017. A Statutory Notice is when the local authority publishes a brief notice in a local newspaper with a full proposal on the Councils website; this allows any member of the public to comment.

## **Contact the Elderly Tea Party**

The staff of the Surgery in Beeford were hosts to a Contact the Elderly Tea Party on Sunday 19th February. Contact the Elderly are a national charity trying to help with the problem of loneliness and social isolation which sadly afflicts so many of our society's older citizens. Loneliness is known to have very negative effects on both mental and physical health.

The charity has, since 1965, organised monthly Sunday afternoon tea parties for which a small group of elderly people are collected from their homes by volunteer drivers and taken to the home (or surgery!) of a host (a different one each month) where they are treated to afternoon tea and to chat with the other members of the group and the drivers (so the group all get the chance to get to know each other), as well as to their hosts (who need to provide a large tea pot, a selection of foods and a downstairs toilet!).

Locally, Driffield's first ever group has been running since Feb 2016. Beverley and Market Weighton's groups have been running for some time. The Surgery were keen to help to get the local group up and running.
