Parish Council

The Parish Council has met twice during the last period; the March meeting started with an opportunity for councillors to question Mr Pearson about the proposed hatchery on Grange Road. This topic was on the Agenda, again, as an outcome of a formal complaint from a local resident. Mr Pearson was asked several questions, primarily by a councillor, who had objected to the planning proposal. At the end of the session each councillor was asked whether they wished, the Parish Council Approval of the scheme, to be changed. A positive decision to uphold the Approval was unanimous and was fed back to ERYC.

Mr Pearson left the meeting and business continued; a new meeting, involving representatives of local Parish Councils is to be established with a view to dealing with common problems, such as dog mess, litter etc. In consideration of the ERYC Planning Department deciding not to brief adjacent residents of a planning application that could affect them, Council decided to carry out this now defunct procedure as not all residents have access to a computer.

The April meeting included the A.G.M. and was preceded by a local resident attempting to re-open

A beautiful, sunny Sunday in April made the walk from Welburn to Bulmer and back a real joy. It started with a relatively steep pitch (heads down for that! – photo courtesy of Ann) with a broad view of the Castle Howard estate behind us. The walk was varied: open farmland, pasture and woodland with many stunning views across the Vale of York and of the Castle Howard monuments as well as the ruin of Sheriff Hutton castle in the distance. The spring flowers, especially primroses and wood anemones, were a treat as were the Brimstone and Orange-tipped Butterflies. Our March walk took account of 'City of Culture' by a tour round Hull. A record turnout of about 27 met at the Ice Arena to start a leisurely tour from the historic fish docks, past the modern marina to the ferry terminal (pre Humber Bridge) at Humber Street – the 'Oss Wash' caused some amusement. There were poignant memorials to the huge number of migrants passing through and to the trawlermen lost at sea. ABOUT NORTH FRODINGHAM

A useful resource for those with internet access is the East Riding Data Observatory which contains a vast wealth of information right down to Parish level detail. All the main public services use the information to shape their policies to meet local demand and East Riding Council which hosts the observatory is no exception. In the case of North Frodingham, there is a wealth of information. For example 18% of the population is aged 0-15, 61% of working age and 21% aged 65 and over. 81% of residents believe they have good or very good health, although 27% of households have at least one person with a long-term health problem or disability. 13% of the working population work in construction compared with 8% across the East Riding as a whole. You can also compare all parishes with other parishes to see what differences there are. For those interested in this data and a host of other facts and figures, you can register by putting dataobs.eastriding.gov.uk into your search engine and accessing the website.

PLANNING

It is worth remembering that as of the 1st April that East Riding of Yorkshire Council Planning

Department will not be sending out notification to residents of planning applications associated to neighbouring properties. A review of the planning process last year revealed that the response rate to individual neighbour notifications. which meant thousands of letters being sent to residents, was only 3.6%, and was a very expensive exercise for the council. Instead site notices have been re-designed to enhance their visibility and readability for residents, however the actual process of viewing the application associated documentation on-line remains and unchanged as well as the communication process for the Council to receive comments i.e. via Public Access, by e-mail or in writing to our Council offices. This does mean it is even more important to look at parish council agendas to see what planning applications are listed or look on the council's web site.

BEEFORD BIOGAS

We continue to get updates regards the Beeford Biogas appeal, the public inquiry is scheduled to last for two weeks. It will be based in County Hall, Beverley, starting on Tuesdav 3rd October 2017. The campaign group maintain their excellent work on preparing for the public inquiry and of local information sharing, their hard work and knowledge of matters pertaining to the inquiry continues to be verv impressive and having established themselves as a Rule 6 party will mean they will be taking a formal role in the inquiry process.

The Council's proof of evidence must be submitted a month before, on the 5th September 2017.

Over recent weeks we have seen an increase in the reporting of residential burglaries across the Force area - some of these partly due to premises being left insecure. Do you go out at the same time each day, do you go via the same route - not wishing to alarm anyone, but none of us know if we are being watched going about business. Some of these evervdav our "watchers" are opportune thieves. If we go through the same routine each day at the same time, it makes things easy for them. Please ensure your property is always securely locked, day and night. That way it makes things more difficult for them.

In addition to domestic burglaries, we have also received reports of stolen vehicles – some of these having been left insecure. However, there was an incident in the village whereby persons unknown attempted to break into a secure vehicle during the early hours, but their actions were thwarted as the noise disturbed the owner's dog. In addition CCTV was also submitted to Humberside Police depicting the persons in question. Investigations are underway.

We are also seeing bogus workmen operating in the area. In one incident a resident was quoted a price for the removal of a tree. The tree was ultimately removed, but by which time the price has increased considerably. Be very wary of persons coming to your homes offering gardening/roofing.... type services. If you are at all concerned/unsure, ask them for some ID or at least details of their company. If they provide a business card or something with the company details on, close and secure your door and contact the company in question to determine their authenticity. Any genuine cold callers selling products should carry a Hawkers licence, which is signed by the Chief Constable (or their deputy) in the respective Force area.

FRAUDSTERS AND GARDEN THIEVES.

We hope that the New Year, (it seems so long ago), has been kind to you, and that

2017 is the first of many problem free years for us all. Please try to remember to bring in all your equipment and furniture, over night or if you're out for part of / all of the day.

It is an unfortunate fact that, with the arrival of this nicer spring weather, there comes the threat of those unfortunate(?) people who think they have more need of our garden equipment or furnishings than we do.

People Are Being Targeted by Fake Police Officers.

There has been a series of recent incidents reported where a lone fraudster has approached victims whom they believe to be unfamiliar with the local area. They make an excuse to talk to the victims such as enquiring about directions or offering a recommendation for a good hotel.

After this interaction, several other fraudsters will intervene purporting to be police officers in plain clothes and will sometimes present false identification as proof.

The fake officers will then give a reason to examine the victims' wallet, purse or personal items. Also; they may examine the first fraudster's items, or try to tell victims that the first fraudster is suspicious; this is in order to gain their victim's trust and appear more realistic in their guise.

After all the fake police 'checks' are finished, victims have reported that, after being handed back their personal items, they opened them later only to realise that a quantity of money or valuables were missing.

How to protect yourself:

• If an individual claims to be a police officer ask for their name, rank and which force they serve under, and closely examine any identification presented; this is always good practice but especially important if they are not wearing a uniform. • The Police will **never** ask for your passwords or PIN details. Do not give this information to anyone.

• The Police will **never** request that you withdraw, transfer or give any money to them **nor will** they ask for you to transfer it to a 'safe' account. If you have been affected by this, or any other fraud, report it to Action Fraud by visiting: - <u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u>

This time of year is when COWBOY TRADERS come knocking to say that something looks unsafe! Just thank them nicely and tell them that we have some very good tradesmen in the village who will carry out the work for you. **IF** they then try to convince you that it is in urgent need of repair, then it is 99% certain that they are not certified tradesmen, your costs could be huge, (including any rectifying repairs you could need doing because of their bad workmanship) and you'll never be able to contact them to rectify any faults you may find later.

Remember these are all **possibilities not certainties**, so please don't have sleepless nights about them.

One last thing: I changed my telephone and t'internet supplier recently, within 2 or 3 days I was contacted by "the same company" saying that they had overcharged me and were going to repay me the excess by returning it to my PayPal account; so I told them I had no such account and cut them off. I subsequently cancelled my PayPal account.

I was **lucky** in that I remembered my own advice about these things. Please stay **lucky** too!
