Parish Council

As usual, the Parish Council has only met once during this period. At the July meeting everyone was relieved to hear that the threatened CAD Plant Appeal had been retracted. Mrs McKie, who gave out the news, warned that there was still the possibility that GasCorp may make another application and to that end she suggested that fund-raising continue and that the monies be held against that eventuality. Once all danger had passed she said that the Committee would meet to resolve dispersal of the fund.

Routine business followed and Council reviewed its financial position, dealt with Planning Application and completed the full Agenda before breaking for the Summer Holiday.

During August the Planning sub-committee met to discuss an application for an extension to Carr Farm – there was no objection raised to the plan. Councillors together representatives of ERYC carried out a Village Walkabout to note problems that had been observed. Cllr Wilson had provided a comprehensive pictorial summary of his earlier survey and this was carefully reviewed by all present. Much of the work, such as road markings, potholes and footpath problems was passed to the appropriate ERYC department for remedial action. Other matters such as bollard cleaning, and moss clearance, etc. will be handled Walkabout bν the team.

Dr Alan Sykes



It was with immense shock and sadness that the doctors, staff and patients of the Leven and Beeford Medical Practice learned of the sudden and unexpected death of Dr Alan Sykes. He died at his home in Beverley on Wednesday 5th July 2017 aged 63 years.

He had been a GP at the Practice from 1984 and was a well-known member of the local community. He worked with Drs Ian Jollie, Bill Hutchinson and Damien Cooper through the 1990s (all of whom are now very sadly deceased). The Practice and Dr Sykes' family are overwhelmed by the marvellous and warm tributes that are flooding in about him.

He was clearly held in high esteem and his patients found him to be caring, conscientious and very giving of his time. He was tremendously supportive of them during some of the most difficult times in their lives and was passionate about being an advocate for them.

He had a passion for aviation history, as evidenced by the familiar pictures that had long been in his consulting rooms in both surgeries. He had some nifty phrases that could be pithy, to the point and often funny, like: "it's the old adage that you can measure things that don't matter and the things that really matter can't be measured..."; and "these days, if it isn't written down, it hasn't happened". He enjoyed motorcycling, travel and live music.

He is survived by his wife of just two years, Yvonne, and his children, stepchildren and grandchildren.

His funeral was held at the Haltemprice Crematorium on Saturday 22nd July and was enormously well attended. The mourners listened to warm and often funny tributes from his sister Valerie, his wife Yvonne and our Partner Dr Jaap Vermeijden.

My step-father Dr Alan Sykes suddenly passed away leaving a hole in our hearts and of his patients. He served at the Beeford and Leven Medical Group for 33 years before sadly passing away. Now we would like to fundraise in memory of him. He always complained that there were not enough defibrillators accessible to the public in rural villages and communities. We would also like to raise awareness about defibrillators not being available on aircraft which my stepfather did not agree with at all as they're simple, small and save lives as the descent to an airport may be too long in order to restart the heart. My stepfather once saved a man's life outside the Beeford surgery and luckily enough for him it was outside as if he had been at the other side of the village the ambulance may not have come quick enough for him and thankfully Alan saved him using the surgery defibrillator. Public ones need to be made available in the event of someone suffering a heart attack and the ambulance not coming fast enough. That is why we are fundraising to install defibrillators in the surrounding villages of his practice and hopefully through the whole of EastYorkshire.

Twenty

members of the Local History Group enjoyed a guided tour of Beverley Minster and a recuperative cup of tea and cake at a nearby venue on Thursday 20th July. Our tour guide proved to be an extremely knowledgeable volunteer, who introduced us to many new and interesting aspects of the history of the building. He had completed the exhausting task

of finding and recording mason's marks on the stone blocks. He explained that these marks were used to calculate the monies due to each master mason and his team. Our group was left in full admiration of this volunteer who had scrambled all over the roof space in search of these marks and who had accumulated details of 517 separate marks from bold capital letters to fancy squiggles. It was a fascinating talk enlivened by many humorous anecdotes that kept us thoroughly entertained and subtly introduced to a medieval Masterpiece virtually on our own doorstep.

Local Heritage Museum. The doors have been open for four Sundays now, and there has been a steady flow of visitors to have a look at the exhibition. This year we have tried to concentrate on women's work and have tried to depict what life would have been for most of us at the start of the twentieth century. IT WAS HARD.

We have included details of common chores that would have faced the housewife each week, for example washing, cleaning, mending and sewing. There are some indications of the problems mums faced identifying those common childhood diseases that have almost been eradicated.

One display cabinet has been filled with doll's house items showing housewives at work whilst

another has been utilised to show two maps of the village, the first dated 1911 and the second 2011, come and be amazed at how much the village has changed.

Six occupations outside the home have been identified and a short biography of each of the women involved has been created. What difficulties must have been faced by, for example, Mrs Scott who moved into Sovereign Row with her husband and children and tried to make a living selling from door-to-door in a village where most of the shop-keepers would have stocked similar items and had been established for generations?

The Museum will be open each Sunday afternoon2-4 pm until September 17th please try and pop in, there is no charge!




Mature Mayhem I am happy to report that our efforts to find a noise-dampening solution to our

Dear Residents

We received information on Monday 10th July 2017 from the Inspectorate that the Applicant Gascorp (West Farm) Ltd have <u>withdrawn</u> their appeal against the ERYC decision to reject the application for the Erection of an AD plant at West Farm Beeford. This is good news but there is nothing to stop the applicant submitting an application for a smaller plant in the same way they did at Holme Upon Spalding Moor which was passed by ERYC.

The fundraising and donations have been a huge success and we cannot thank you all enough. So many people have helped in so many ways and are too numerous to thank individually.

Another very successful weekend for the Events team with the Big Beck Weekend held over 2 days 22nd and 23rd of July. Despite the weather the many attractions held over the weekend raised a staggering £1,400.00!! Those who attended had an amazing time over the 2 days and huge thanks to Yvonne and Pat Turner and their team (I apologise I don't have all the names of all team members) and Sally, Dave and Nick for their support with the setting up clearing up and slaving over the BBQ. Thank you also to Mike and Linda Artley for the ducks. The water was so still the race turned into a duck raffle!!



The total raised to date with donations and events is £30,960.16!!! We have hit the target with events still to complete.

£14,515.92 raised from the Events, costs £4,250.33 with a balance in the bank = £26,709.83 today.

What an amazing summer 2017 of success. A huge undertaking when we first agreed to fund raise and ask for donations with a 30k target!!! We were all very concerned this was a big ask and a huge undertaking for the events team and asking all the residents for donations. The community must be immensely proud of you all and of those who have supported the campaign in so many ways. I cannot put into words my amazement and sense of gratitude. Everyone who has been involved in any way all deserve a huge thank you from the bottom of all our hearts.

We are in a very good financial position to fight any proposal that threatens our communities but we have to continue to be on our guard and ready for any proposal. Please still be aware.

The funds raised by the event group will be split between the three villages and our intention is to hold this until further notice in case it is needed to help fight any future application.

The events will continue throughout the summer as planned and please do go along and support them. The funds raised will be for the NOW (Not Our Waste) campaign unless it is stated otherwise. A huge amount of hard work and time has been generously given organising and arranging all the events for you all to enjoy.
