The Old Howe breach showing water escaping into the lower catch dvke which has itself been blocked by debris, for the accounting localised flooding in the area. The breach was at a point identified after the last floods in 2012 as having been undermined by rodents but no effective repair was undertaken. Currently the Environment Agency is pumping the water back up into the River

Hull at Hempholme and Wilfholme. How much does that cost compared to not repairing the drain bank? Let alone the avoidable damage to surrounding agricultural land. The Environment Agency say that they can only get funding to protect residential property and vet heavy machinery has been on-site, but only to stone-line the breach to prevent further erosion, creating a very permanent-looking "temporary" solution. As Adrian commented, why not get on and make a permanent repair to the bank while the kit is there?

#### **Parish Council**

The Parish Council met during March and April with the usual business of paying bills, looking at planning applications and discussing problems emerging in the village. Quite a lot of time was spent discussing the new, EU inspired, rules about Data Protection and how they should be put into place by the Council. Useful advice was proffered by the Ward Councillors and the Clerk is now in a position to introduce guidelines.

Also causing some discussion were the proposed changes to the Twilight Bus service from Driffield School. The Parish Council makes a donation each

The Eryc are keen to point out that the existing bridge is unsafe and the chalk blockage unsuitable for pedestrian traffic. Hence the footpath is likely to be closed for six months!

Parish Council meetings are open to all residents and are held on 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month at 7.30pm; you are welcome to attend and if wanting to address the Council, are asked to notify the Clerk by the Wednesday before, so that you can be included on the Agenda.

keen to introduce the Speaker for the evening Mr Mike Rymer who was to present his talk on coopering in Hull 1690 – 1710.

Mike, who has been studying local history for many years, had analysed the inventories of six coopers who had died within the given period. He illustrated his talk with slides that helped to keep the audience focussed, and talked about the evidence that could be gleaned about these six men from old documents, photocopies of which were circulated around the audience.

It was fascinating to hear details of the property of the six men; to attempt to picture their lives, work and social status at the time of their death.

Without understanding how it came about, the listener began to understand the world of the cooper, from the value of his goods, stock, raw materials and tools, to the contents of his bedchamber and his linen press. (Although, I for one could not understand why anyone would need 14 tablecloths and several dozen napkins!)

All in all and absolutely fascinating glimpse of life 300 years ago delivered in good voice by an interesting yet understandable speaker.

May 17<sup>th</sup>, Mr Stephen Carvill, sculptor, will talk about the Gansey Girl and others sculptures. Members will enjoy an outing to Trinity House, Hull for their July meeting and will meet again in September.



**Potholes** Where ever you drive in England potholes are a problem now following a wet & sometimes very cold winter, so we thought a general update on East Riding of Yorkshire Council approach would be of interest to all road users.

There are several strands to the council's pothole repair programme and work repairing potholes and other defects across the 3500km network is constantly being carried out. The work is either reported by the public, Town & Parish Councils or picked up as part of routine safety inspections.

ERYC inspect all footways and carriageways on a rota basis, the main routes (A and B roads) being inspected monthly, lesser used 'C' roads quarterly and the unclassified road network annually. From these inspections and reports they repair approximately 30,000 potholes each year at a cost of approximately £600k. Last year and this financial year the council received an additional £900k as part of the Department for Transport(DfT) 'pothole fund'. This fund is being used proactively to undertake

both repairs and preventative maintenance. It funds some traditional patching work in preparation for the annual surface dressing programme, 'Roadmaster' repairs are also undertaken using the councils spray patching vehicle and 'ultraseal' resin patching. These treatments commenced in March as better results are generally achieved with these processes as the road surface temperatures are warmer and the weather drier.

Recently the DfT also issued further funding because of the severe winter weather and the council received a further £350k in addition to the £900k above. They are currently identifying sites for this funding and will be programming the same treatments above for this money, the majority of which we will programme to spend before the onset of next winter.

We know from previous budget conferences & surveys that keeping the highways in the East Riding safe is of importance to residents, there are a lot of potholes across the East Riding following the severe cold weather we experienced, some have already been repaired & work is ongoing to repair the remainder as soon as possible.

Breach of old River Howe Bank. current situation has left the parish council and landowners in a state of annoyance. The situation is on the old River Howe which is the top part of the River Hull (responsibility of the Environment Agency(EA)). The bank has breached leaving a growing gap of around 12 feet in width. That means that the river there is flowing in reverse bringing water out of the of the river into the lowland land drain straight into the internal drainage board's dikes which then flow about 4 miles down to pumps on the east side of the River Hull (flooding land on the way) where the water has to be pumped back into the river, which already too full, means that the water ends up going full circle and returning back to flow through the breach in the bank.

The Parish Council warned E.A. of a breach years ago and feel their comments were ignored. Access to the breached area by the EA has always been difficult, so reluctant to act. The work is not deemed by the EA to be a priority as no property is in danger at present, only land.

We have contacted our MP Greg Knight and are working with the parish council as much as we can to keep them up to date with factual information.

Work now seems to be going on at the site of the breach and we literally will be 'watching this space!'

We have received reports of a silver Movano van, no registration number plate details, with 2 males in moving around the Force area allegedly looking for scrap metal. One member of public came across the van at the rear of his property, disturbed the intruders and potentially prevented any theft occurring. No losses have been reported to date. In a separate incident a white combi van has been reported as driving into farmyards with no lights on under cover of darkness. As above, no number plate details have been obtained for this vehicle - when the security lights illuminated and the alarm sounded at the address in question, the vehicle drove off. If anyone sees vehicles which appear to be acting suspiciously, contact 101. We would rather handle calls rung through with good intent than deal with calls of theft or worse after the event.

There have been a number of motor vehicle thefts reported to us which have occurred over a short space of time across the Force area. This may be the same offenders moving around the area, but these vehicles have been left secure by their owners. One vehicle was found burnt out the morning following its theft. In another incident a member of the public reported hearing drilling and when they looked out of their window, saw two males with hoodies on attempting to drill the lock of a Ford Transit van. For anyone who has a Ford Transit Custom van (circa 2015 onwards), it appears if the front door locks are forced, it not only unlocks the front doors but also all the other doors on the vehicle. There is a modification which can be done to ensure the rear doors remain locked should the front ones be forced open by persons unknown. Your local Ford dealer can advise on this.

We have received reports of members of the public being contacted by persons purporting to be from Ofcom, stating they are trying to stop nuisance calls. One member of the public who was targeted is elderly and vulnerable – somehow the offender(s) has managed to withdraw monies from the gentleman's bank account. He has cancelled his card with the bank in question and has been advised to report the details to Action Fraud. Be very mindful if anyone contacts you requesting your bank details or any other personal data, never disclose that information.

A FIFA spokesperson said: -

"It has been reminding all football fans that <a href="https://www.FIFA.com/tickets">www.FIFA.com/tickets</a> is the only official and legitimate website on which to buy 2018 FIFA World Cup tickets."

FIFA have also warned that: - "Any tickets obtained from any other source, such as ticket brokers, internet auctions or unofficial ticket exchange platforms, will be automatically rendered void and invalid".

Customers are asked to remember that they are at risk of investing a high amount of money (INCLUDING for travelling and accommodation); without having the certainty of being actually allowed to attend the matches.

There is a warning about people contacting the public claiming to be Television providers.

The fraudsters are using the following telephone numbers: "08447111444", "02035190197" and "08001514141". The fraudster's voices are reported to sound feminine and have an Asian accent.

Later on, victims make enquiries and then discover that their TV service provider did not call them and that the fraudster has made transactions using the victim's bank account details.

This type of fraud is nationwide. Since the beginning of this year (2018), there have been 300 Action Fraud Reports relating to this fraud. From the reports received, victims aged over 66 seem to be the most targeted.
