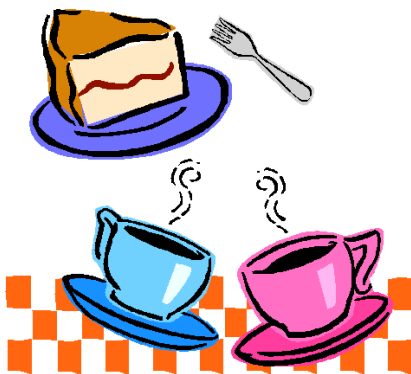

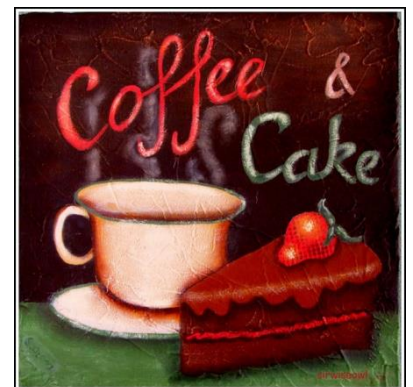

Parish Council

Only one meeting of the Parish Council, held during July it followed the posted Agenda (website and noticeboard). Business included discussions about drones being flown over the village; the Old Howe breach in the banks and the efforts being taken to reduce the risk of flooding and adjustments to Planning regulations. The defibrillator has been checked over and is in good working order.

During the period the Survey Responses forms have been collated and the results and a potential Action Plan will be discussed at the next meeting. Thanks to all residents who took the time to reply to the survey hopefully, as last time, the Parish Council will be able to decide what can be done and which areas will need the greatest input in terms of money and/or labour.

The Parish Council is in the process of appointing two new councillors to fill the gaps caused by Debbie Williamson and David Bannister who have both moved away from the Parish.

Parish Council meetings are open to all residents and are usually held on 2nd Monday of each month at 7.30pm; you are welcome to attend, and if wanting to address the Council, are asked to notify the Clerk by the Wednesday before, so that you can be included on the Agenda.

Local History Group.

July is the month for the History Group to have its annual outing. This year we were privileged to have a



private tour of the Trinity House building in Hull, thanks to one of our members being a member.

Trinity House is a charity dedicated to safeguarding shipping and seafarers, providing education, support and welfare to the seafaring community.

What an experience! Opened for the first time to the general public during the Year of Culture, the Brothers had produced a tour of the various rooms, together with a wealth of old stories about life in the Merchant Navy over past centuries.

The House contains a wealth of artefacts and memorabilia given by Brethren over the years, and is

also very much a museum in its own right. The Council Room still has reed straw scattered on the floor, as all the rooms in the building used to have, to gather up the mud and dust from the unpaved streets of the City in years gone by. The Cook Room is dedicated to many of the artefacts about Capt. James Cook and his voyages of exploration, which were financed in part by Wardens and Brethren of The House. The present buildings were constructed in 1753 and completed with the addition of the pediment in 1759. The original building on this site was occupied in 1461, to accommodate 13 pensioners; the rent payable to the Carmelite Monks was one shilling per year.

Our visit, ending with tea/coffee and a piece of cake in Simples café, opposite Hull Minster, had everyone talking about the treasures they had seen thanks to the kind supervision and industry of two of the brethren.

Yes we are still going strong! Our weekly sessions of light exercise, table and board games followed by tea/coffee and biscuits to aid recovery, are still a focal point for many of our Friday afternoons.

If you are thinking about coming along at 2.00 pm on a Friday afternoon, you will be made most welcome and remember you can sit and watch others whilst they exercise their joints; you can turn your backs on any energetic exercise; and most important you can enjoy a social natter and slurp your tea/coffee with the best of them!!

A FIRST FOR NORTH FRODINGHAM: NATIONAL GARDENS SCHEME OPENING, 1ST JULY

Since moving into The Old Vicarage in 1997 I have been trying to improve our 1.5 acre garden. It was a major attraction, given my love of gardens and gardening, although I could have done without the filled in outdoor swimming pool on the long barrow...which had to go, as did several huge 'weed' boundary trees.

The next years were spent bringing my design to life, a series of interconnected areas each with distinctive planting. At times awful weather, howling gales and rabbits made me feel like giving up, but I persevered, and the garden gradually took shape. I am particularly grateful to Nick Muirhead, who has helped me transform the house as well as the garden, and Mr Wilson, our first gardener. Hard landscaping and most planting were completed in 2014, but there's always room for more! In 2015 we joined in the village gardens open day: in 2016 we opened for the Church window renovation fund, complete with stalls and refreshments provided by the parishioners. Having got the hang of it, I did it again last year, with a contribution to the successful 'Not Our Waste' campaign, this time with an air rifle range and the swimming pool open.

Joining the National Gardens Scheme was a longstanding ambition, but I had doubts about the maturity and quality of the garden, thinking to put it off until I retired. So I was very surprised when I received an email from the NGS County Organiser in the autumn, inviting me to put it forward! Inspected and found fit to be seen, it now features on ngs.org.uk, and in the NGS annual directory, the 'Yellow Book'.

An NGS garden in Foston was going to open alongside ours, with refreshments in Foston village hall. This fell

through when the owner moved, leaving me with a major headache: the parishioners seeking to fundraise less strenuously, and no transport for the social centre tables and chairs. I posted 'Fund Raising Opportunity' on Nextdoor.com, and the Nafferton Methodists came to my rescue, complete with their own furniture in a van! The few weeks before the opening were spent rather obsessively getting the garden into shape, and keeping it that way: it's mainly me and my hoe, a sprayer and a battery hedgetrimmer, but I have help with grass and hedges. My younger son is a great under gardener, too.

Sunday 1st July dawned clear and sunny. Signage was installed and helpers organised: visitors were queuing up even before the 11am opening. I was extremely grateful to the Cherry family for car park facilities. There was a constant stream of people, some with dogs and even arriving on bicycles. The Nafferton Methodists were very busy indeed, serving huge amounts of drinks, excellent cakes and scones throughout the day. I circulated, identifying plants of interest and chatting to visitors. All were most complimentary, and gave every indication of enjoying themselves. A member of the County Organiser's team arrived...and stayed for quite a long time!

The garden remained open until 5pm: we tidied up, had a barbecue and sloped off to the Blue Post to wind down. Will we do it again next year? Definitely yes! Over 300 visitors, many having travelled from a distance, generated nearly £1300 for charity. We had a great time: many thanks to all involved.

Caring for orphaned, destitute and needy children in a family environment.

As some of you may remember Andrew and I went to Kerala to teach as volunteers in 2012. We had a very special time in Kerala and have been saddened by the recent floods.

Since then we have had contact with a charity called Hope India, which is a community village in Aleppey Kerala providing a family home for children in need. The children go to school and have extra educational support as well as life skills. They have no family and live 6 children to a house with a house mother aged from 3 – 12 years.

The Lake in Aleppey, on which the tourist attraction of houseboats is based, has risen by a metre and the rivers have flooded the local villages around Hope. Shops and markets have been ruined and although the rains have stopped the impact is devastating. The floods have meant that the schools are being used as shelters so the children are not at school at the moment. The floods have affected all aspects of life from transport to a shortage of basic items from cooking utensils to clothes and bedding. We have contacted our teachers and as individuals they are okay but all the villagers are struggling.

August is a time of 'recess' for local councillors, although not recognised by residents looking at the number of messages and e-mails received.

East Riding Council is one of the few local authorities that still employs a 'Rural Team' with a specific remit to address particular issues faced by living in a predominantly rural area. The Council has a rural strategy and an action plan to tackle various issues. Some of the key outputs achieved through the 2017/2018 plan are as follows;

- Establishment of the Wolds Tourism Business Network
- Local Food Spring Conference
- Yorkshire Nature Triangle received regional and national press attention
- £725,444 contracted under European funding to 21 projects – many involving farm diversification

- New village Hall Website launched
- £708,000 from community funds linked to energy related developments awarded to sustainable rural development
- Promotion of Community led housing initiatives.

For the next 12 months the priorities will include;

- Rural Business and Rural Tourism development
- Rural Landscape and Countryside Access
- Rural Infrastructure to include broadband, mobiles, transport and affordable housing.

Many of these issues will affect communities such as North Frodingham and our role is to keep your voice heard along with the other 20 parishes we represent.

A **SCAM** targeting elderly persons.

Between 25/7/18 -14/8/18 there have been 7 police incidents in the Cottingham Willerby and Beverley area.

Beware of A MALE who was dressed in a Post Office T shirt, black shorts and shoes. This man is believed to be a bogus Postman.

He said he had a parcel for this address (THE PERSONS NAME IS ON THE PARCEL), and there is an outstanding 68 pence to be paid for it. When the householder stated they would pay by cash the Bogus Person said he can only accept card payments.

The man produced a card reader. Once the Bogus

Postal Worker had the card he told the home owner that it didn't work, the signal was no good, the man then stated he was going around the corner to see if it would work. **NOW** the Bogus person had the **BANK CARD & DETAILS**. Once he was around the corner he joined another man who was waiting in a vehicle; a **black Land Rover Free Lander, 1997 – 2006 model**. They then drove off to any nearby ATM machine and withdrew £200.

The same scam is then repeated in the same area before they then drive away, only to turn up a few days later, to repeat the same scam again in the same area.

If anyone becomes suspicious or can get the registration number of the BLACK car; please; please; please, "PHONE THE POLICE 999."

Reports of commercial burglaries across the Force area have been received, whereby predominantly tools have been stolen from premises. We are also seeing reports of residential burglaries across the area. In a recent incident, person/persons unknown enter the rear garden of a property via an insecure wooden gate. They enter a brick built outbuilding by unbolting the door and steal one bicycle, leaving others behind. Upon exiting the building, they also steal 5 alloy wheels which were visible in the garden. In another incident person/persons unknown have broken into an empty cottage via the neighbouring farmer's field and stolen radiators and piping. They used the wheelie bins to transport the stolen goods.

Due to the intense heatwave we have been experiencing, there have been reports of fires across the area. Some of natural causes, but others due to the actions of person(s) unknown. In one incident arson was present at a caravan storage premise whereby persons unknown have fired the field and some caravans, but also stolen units from the premises.

Pension scams have been in the media recently, with particular reference to iTunes vouchers. It appears vulnerable persons are being contacted via the internet. A supermarket has seen evidence of this within the Force area and fortunately alerted Humberside Police to the amount of vouchers an individual was presenting.

A member of the public was receiving scam emails advising money needed to be sent to a specified bank account, otherwise information would be released showing which porn sites they had visited. No such sites had been visited by the persons concerned, but these are the levels criminals and fraudsters are prepared to sink to.

A member of the public was approached by a man in a red Ford Transit van **KV13 FBD** regarding collecting of scrap. The member of the public showed the man the scrap which was available for collection, but the man's mannerism gave them cause for concern and they took a photograph of the vehicle's number plate on their mobile phone. The driver of the van witnessed this and turned nasty, threatening

the member of the public. There are bona fide scrap merchants operating in our Force area, but be very mindful of other persons who are purporting to be scrap merchants.

Theft of copper piping and a heating tank from a farm during the early hours of the morning in the Force area has been reported to us. The farm has been the victim of several thefts and the farmer has even put bales at the end of the farm track to deter persons, but these are being moved to gain access. The vehicle in question in this incident was reported as a black Nissan (no model), but whose registration number is **MW54 BUV**.

HMRC scam emails are doing the rounds once again. If you are fortunate enough to be due any monies back from HMRC or should you owe them any monies, they will write to you using the Royal Mail. They will never ring you or send you an email. An example of such an email has been witnessed recently - it opened with "Dear followed by the person's email address and advised that "due to undoubtedly and unpredictable issues within the system If you haven't updated your card details the amount at the end of the tax year, HMRC will post a penalty fine varied from £70 to £200 This can be a P800 of a Simple Assessment letter with a check slip. It went on "No payment will be taken out upon updating your details all bills will be shown on your accounts and you will be able to choose whether and (When) you want to pay. So please feel comfortable and safe when dealing with HMRC". As you will see the English grammar, lack of punctuation, spelling, use of capital letters in the wrong places and use of certain words were clear evidence that this was a scam email, but unless you know what to look for, you could fall foul of these fraudsters.

A member of the public and friend were recently stopped late at night whilst driving along a quiet rural road by a Nissan Almera, registration **MW54 BUV** by a male purporting to be an undercover police officer. He had followed the car, flashing his headlights to attract their attention. The driver stopped the car, but fortunately did not open the driver's door window at his request. His appearance was unkempt, dirty teeth wearing a dark baseball cap and a grey Hugo boss top. This may be a one-off incident but be very aware he may strike again.
