Each month our local PCSO has reported few problems in Frodingham - that is until the recent burglary at commercial premises! Of course, we have had telephone and email scams reported – it seems to have become a way of life questioning whether or not to answer each phone call!


On a more general front we have had few planning applications to deal with. Some extensions and a couple with an agricultural focus only two have involved new housing, both located to the west of the village, and both having received approval from ERYC despite several objections being raised.

In the early part of the year the Old Howe bank was breached; as a result much of the rest of the year has been time-consuming exercises, trying to persuade the Environment Agency to fix the problem, and when they do some work trying to understand what has been done, and continually badgering to get the Right of Way bridge to Foston re-opened. Finally it has been completed, albeit without his help, the Council is in the process of working through the resulting Action Plan. Whilst the financial situation continues to be a challenge for East Riding of Yorkshire Council and huge pressures on our 'revenue' budget continue i.e. the costs of running the day to day operations and services. The 'capital' programme remains strong, this is where the Council spends money on large and long term projects utilising borrowings, grants from many sources and 'one off' government funding, often investing now to save in the future. For example highway schemes, replacement street lighting, flood prevention schemes, leisure centre improvements etc. Unlike many other local authorities, East Riding continues to invest spending over £100 million per annum and currently has £413 million of projects in the pipeline. Much of this work is undertaken by local businesses generating local employment from external funds brought into the area. The council is proud of its track record in obtaining this external investment and looks to continue into the future.


More GP appointments for people in our area available now

We have been receiving numerous reports around the Force area of persons acting

suspiciously and vehicles being parked in obscure places but with headlights left on for long periods of time. When persons have approached the vehicles, the vehicles have been driven off or when persons have driven past these stationary vehicles, lights have been turned off, only to be turned back on when those persons believe passing traffic has gone. These incidents have been happening on farms, near commercial properties and in residential areas. If you see such things, persons may be parked up for bona fide reasons, but if you call the matter into 101, it will be checked out. We would rather receive calls made with good intention rather than people ignore such incidents and a crime occur.

Commercial burglaries are being reported to us resulting in vehicles being stolen/tools being taken. In some instances the power is being turned off to premises thereby rendering the security alarms inoperative. In a recent burglary Makita power tools were taken from an insecure cabin. If anyone is offered such power tools, please be mindful these items may be stolen property.

Public houses are being attacked – in a recent incident the rear door of a public house was entered, person(s)

unknown gained access to the safe, despite the owner having the keys at home all night and monies taken. An untidy search was made of the premises, but it appears the cameras may not have recorded.

Residential burglaries are also on the increase – in some instances persons have returned to their homes during daylight hours to find burglars in their homes. Method of entry not always clarified, but in some instances it has been due to insecure windows/doors. We are all very busy at this time of year getting ready for the festive season, but be vigilant and ensure vehicles and properties are left secure at all times.

Another matter about which we are receiving high volumes of calls is road traffic collisions. It is winter, the roads are wet, road surfaces are cold, greasy, there are fuel spillages and due to the volume of rain we have had recently, when vehicles are coming out of fields, they are leaving mud residues on the road surfaces. Please take extra care on the county's roads, while there are instances over which we have little control (other people's manner of driving), adapt <u>your</u> driving style accordingly to the weather conditions and stay safe.


