The trips are ideal for those who want to learn more about the historic waterway, for bird and wildlife watchers, or for a group or family celebration with a picnic and bottle of champagne.



Knowing virtually zero about herrings and no desire to go to sea I sat with some trepidation through the opening slides of a PowerPoint presentation. I shouldn't have worried, it was a fascinating talk covering a huge amount, from the types of herring boats, to the life cycle of the fish and the shore-based ancillary workers who made the nets, gutted the fish, and sent them off to York

and London. How hard were the lives of the women sitting on the quayside waiting for the boats to come in (probably knitting 'ganseys' for their men folk) and then gutting the slippery fish, packing them in barrels of salt or boxes of ice before sending them to market, drying their frozen hands and going back to the knitting waiting for the next boat to arrive. WOW. I for one will never look a kipper in the face without remembering Howard's splendid talk.

Polly, our Chair, thanked the Speaker, and after an extended and well-deserved round of applause everyone settled down to light refreshments and a good chatter.

The next meeting will be held March 21st, when Mrs Jean Abbott will tell us how to research a Family Tree.

Parish Council

At its meeting, held February 11th 2019, the Parish Council handled the regular business of the month including dealing with planning applications,; paying the bills and discussing problems reported by the Councillors. In addition there was some talk related to the need for a bus shelter and more salt bins around the village. These latter items will need to be costed and the monies either applied for as a grant or taken from the Business Account.

A report from Special Inspector PCSO Wilson concentrated on the necessity of being alert to scams both electronic and on the doorstep as these seem to be increasing in the region. The police have asked us to look out for a white Ford transit van, YK 55 VU, which had been reported as the driver had been picking up 'scrap' metal also a silver Shogun with the same registration.


Councillor Greaves gave an upbeat account of progress at the Social Centre. She said that the first

'FrodProd' table sale would be held 25th May, tables for the sale of any produce would be available for £5.00 and sale items could include craft items as well as garden produce. There will also to be an Easter Egg Hunt for children with the proceeds to be split between Social Centre and School. Residents are asked to volunteer gardens where the eggs could be hidden.

Several problems were raised by the councillors and these were to be reported to ERYC before the end of the month and hopefully dealt with soon after.

Mr Wilson has started to spread new gravel on the footpath in the Cemetery, with particular attention to the entrance area. Also work is underway on the Cemetery Chapel, including new guttering, painting of external woodwork and re-plastering of internal walls.

The meeting closed at 8.45 pm.

The Lissett Wind Farm Community Fund has become a well-used source of funding for many groups & organisations in the East Wolds & Coastal Ward and the grant application period for this year has started.

Applications can be made by organisations such as community groups, parish councils, schools and churches for projects that are of public benefit including charitable, educational and not-for-profit activities.

The fund receives an annual donation of over £82,000 from the wind farm's operating company, Ventient and an independent decision-making panel comprising of local representatives from parishes within the area, the wind farm owner and East Riding of Yorkshire Council will assess applications and award grants.

Reports are being received by the Force regarding the theft of lead from church roofs.

Shops including post offices have been attacked in the Force area.

Theft of commercial plant at treatment works undergoing development. Diesel generator, blue, 2 wheels, 2 handles with a serial number 3175333 and GAP stickers all over it. If anyone is approached by person(s) unknown trying to sell this item, call 101.

Theft of farm vehicles around the Force area. In a recent incident a Kawasaki Mule, registration number YX68 EDL was stolen. This vehicle resembles a golf buggy type vehicle. Any sightings, log 161 13/02/2019 refers.

Theft of copper piping in Driffield – vehicle witnessed was a white Ford transit van with a registration number similar to YX55 VBU. A silver Mitsubishi Shogun Equipe was also witnessed at a property in a village not far from Driffield where the theft of metal bins was attempted. The driver of the vehicle was challenged by a neighbour of the elderly residents and told to return the bins to their rightful location. The man believed to be in his 30's, was approximately 6ft tall, stocky build, short brown hair and was wearing a hi-viz hoody. The vehicle's registration number was checked and did not come back to a silver Mitsubishi Equipe, but a white Ford Transit van. There is every possibility the plates have been cloned.

Reports of a black Audi, registration number YX64 UNY operating in our Force area. Possibly associated with drug running/trafficking of young people. If this vehicle is seen, log 258 14/02/2019 refers.

Residents in a village in our Force area have reported finding chalk marks on their gates, but this is only happening to people who own dogs. The residents are concerned this may be highlighting them with a view to persons unknown stealing their dogs. If anyone finds chalk marks on their gates, logs 678 16/02/2019 and 571 17/02/2019 refer.

A white moped and blue Ford tractor with partial registration W224 were reported as acting in a suspicious manner around the social centre in the village. Persons went round the rear of the building and torches were seen being flashed about. Police attended but the search was negative. If anyone sees persons these vehicles (or any others) acting in a suspicious manner in the vicinity of the building, please call 101. Log 620 17/02/2019 refers.

There have been motorcycles thefts in the Force area. In one incident a white VW Caddy, registration number YY05 KDF was seen acting suspiciously in a village where a motorbike had been stolen the previous night. When the vehicle was approached by a member of the public, it was driven off. It was later seen parked up in the village where the theft had occurred, which was not North Frodingham, but be vigilant.

Recognise a SCAM when you receive one.

I was sent these two in the space of two days.
