



On a very sunny Sunday in March, a dozen of us, well wrapped up against a chill wind, met at Bainton to walk up the lane by the church to Neswick. Bearing right, our road took us over the 'Brakenberg' bridge (Photo, left, thanks to Joan) which straddled the former railway line and makes a fine viewpoint. Further on we turned for Burn Butts with superb views all the way to the Humber. Down to Cawkeld for a picnic spot and then past Wedding Wood and through Bracken, we picked up the Green Lane, with fine views over the Wolds and which took us back to our start point.

In April, with so many of us on holiday, there were only six to enjoy a walk starting from the church at West Lutton. A gradual climb up the hill to Thirkleby Wold Farm soon brought fine views across the Wolds all the way to the North York Moors. A green lane led through to Squirrel Hall Farm where this year's crop of potatoes were going in. Reaching the lane beyond, which led down to Kirby Grindalythe, Andrea's party stopped for lunch alongside St Andrew's Church. This is one of the Sykes churches, very attractive with its pinnacled west tower and tall spire. Parish Council

There has had to be a deviation from our usual meetings this period, a clash with holiday dates had meant the April meeting had had to be put back until 29th April hence only one meeting to report on. March 11th found us very busy preparing the nomination forms for the forthcoming Parish Council elections on May 2nd. Nine of our current councillors have accepted nomination and will be duly elected. In addition we managed to update the meeting on several matters including work on the Heritage Chapel, in the Cemetery, which is now almost complete. The Local History Group is planning to start work on preparing the chapel for the summer opening sessions. In addition Council is starting to ascertain whether a community shop and / or outreach post office would be of use in the village. Initially there will have to be another survey to


establish the level of need before we take this any further.

It was agreed that the benches at the Millennium Garden should be scheduled for maintenance work at the Parish Council expense.

Two planning decisions were recorded and all invoices paid.

A meeting of the Planning Enforcement team at County Hall had been attended and was duly reported back to Council.

Each month Parish Councillors report problems they have noticed, or been made aware of, in the village, these are then passed to the relevant Council Officer for action. During April three Parish Councillors will walk around the village with engineers from ERYC, noting any problems that need to be dealt with. These will then form the basis of an Action Plan.







We also spent some time thinking about the Heritage Museum, how to get everything in order once the builder had finished, and starting to plan our summer exhibition. Geoff Rudd, Howard Goodrick, Paul Wright and Maurice Wilson volunteered to help with the heavy work. Hopefully we will be able to start this after the Easter break and other members can then be co-opted to set out and label our 'treasures'.

She was careful to point out some of the difficulties a newcomer might encounter, and was scrupulous in maintaining that all material should be checked. Spelling mistakes on official records were to be expected and 'just because someone had the family name – it did not necessarily mean they were a member of YOUR family'!

Jean left some time for questions at the end of her talk and her audience certainly joined in with questions including the value family trees had in increasing knowledge of genetic history.

Polly thanked the Speaker for an interesting and fully participative talk. After an extended and well-deserved round of applause everyone settled down to light refreshments and a good chatter.

restaurants/takeaways/fast food premises have been broken into and drums of rapeseed oil stolen. The drums, which cost around £20 each, in one such

drums, which cost around £20 each, in one such incident were stored in an insecure wooden shed.

A number of commercial burglaries across the Force area, including public houses, have been reported to us, whereby persons have gained access to premises and stolen money.

A male in a white Ford Transit (registration) NC05 FDX has been reported in our Force area collecting scrap without permission. This may be that he sees scrap or items he perceives to be scrap outside premises and believes they are there for collection, but in some instances it has been reported he has gone into premises to fetch goods out, which amounts to theft.

A number of commercial businesses have been broken into in our area – in one instance a number of archery bows were stolen, in another a quantity of tyres have been stolen.

A male claiming to be James MILLER from the Attorneys Office has been contacting people advising they have a case in hand and they need to call back urgently on 0800 869 8472. When this number is checked on Google it returns to multiple foreign websites, the main ones being Turkish and Japanese.

A further incident of this nature has been reported, but the caller's name was Christopher Stephenson on this occasion and he was calling from Nottingham County Court. The caller stated to the member of the public that monies dating back 5 years had not been paid to a company the member of public had signed a contract with (no company name given) and if monies were not paid within the next 2 days, the matter would be reverted to court. Payment could not be paid by cheque due to the stage reached in the process, however payment could be made Paypal. Fortunately the member of public was astute enough to recognise the call for what it was - a scam. He had received no correspondence from any company regarding outstanding monies and is a shrewd businessman. He asked the caller to give him his telephone number, he would check the matter out with his brother who works in the legal profession and ring him back. At this point the caller put the phone down. The member of public did 1471 and obtained the number. When the member of the public rangit, it did come back to Nottingham County Court. He explained about his phone call but was told they had no such person working for them or on their behalf. Due to his being astute and recognising the scam, the member of public did not pay any monies or divulge his bank details.

These scammers are becoming very persuasive and convincing. Be mindful if you are contacted, listen to what persons say to you and never reveal your bank details. If you are concerned in any way, contact 101 and report the call. The call can be looked into – if it is genuine you have lost nothing - if the call is bogus, it will be reverted to Action Fraud. Your call could save someone else falling victim to these scammers who have no morals or scruples.
