

One of the issues before the Council in May was agreeing a new tenancy agreement for the village allotment. An advert in the village voice had generated some interest, and it was hoped that a new tenant had been found.

A review of the cemetery fees was undertaken by Council and it was decided not to make any changes. The 2018/19 Annual Governance Statement and the Accounting Statement had been prepared and audited and are on the Parish Council website.

#### From the Ward Councillors

Following the local elections in May we are delighted to be back representing the East Wolds & Coastal Ward once more and as always, we will do our best to continue to represent to the best of our ability.

Since being re-elected in May one particular issue which will potentially affect 1000's of people in the East Riding is new legislation being brought in by Defra in January 2020 called The General Binding Rules.

Many rural properties in the East Riding rely upon septic tanks and if they do not comply with the General Binding Rules could be asked to pay as much as £8000 to upgrade their systems and introduce packet treatment works.


The Environment Agency have been tasked with implementing the new legislation which may well affect households with older systems that are not working efficiently or discharge into water courses.

There can be no objection to the tightening up of legislation that prevent the pollution of water courses,

our main concern is the number of properties in rural areas who are likely to be affected by this new legislation and what support they are to be given to help them meet the regulations. It appears there is a charity who will work with homeowners to help them understand and address the changes but at present this is not widely known, nor is it clear what approach the Environment Agency intend to adopt to implement the new rules. We are talking about a huge financial outlay for some property owners or it may affect the sale of properties & we need a better understanding of who will be affected & ensure they receive advice from the Environment Agency.

We are calling for the Environment Agency to provide East Riding of Yorkshire Council with the information on how they are going to provide households with the information they need to ensure they are prepared for January 2020.

### Scam Warning - Fake TV Licensing Emails.

Please be aware that there is a continuing TV Licensing **SCAM**, first identified in September of 2018. Fraudsters are sending the public fake TV Licensing emails that are designed to steal their personal and financial information. Since April 2018, Action Fraud has received over 900 crime reports, with victim losses totalling more than £830,000.

**How you can protect yourself:** Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.

Don't assume a phone call or email is authentic, even if someone knows your basic details (such as your name or address). Remember, criminals can spoof phone numbers and email addresses to appear as companies you know and trust, such as TV Licensing.

Your bank

will never call and ask you for your PIN, full banking password, or ask you to transfer money out of your account. **What to do if you've fallen victim:** Let your bank know as soon as possible and monitor your bank statements regularly for any unusual activity. If you suspect your identity may have been stolen you can check your credit file quickly and easily online. Use a reputable service provider and follow up on any unexpected or suspicious results.

If you have been a victim of fraud or cyber crime, report it to Action Fraud at <u>actionfraud.police.uk</u>, or call <u>03001 232 040</u>.

**The police said** that although the Driffield and East Wolds area has not suffered a pattern of \*2 in 1 burglaries, here are some simple security measures below which can be taken to help protect yourself and your property.

(\*A 2 in 1 burglary is where a thief steals car keys and then steals the car).

- Never hang your keys close to doors where they can be taken through the letter box.
- Do not leave your car or house keys in an obvious place such as a handbag or a key cupboard.
- If you have a garage use it and lock it.
- Always keep your vehicle windows closed and the car locked at all times.
- If your car or van doesn't have an alarm or immobiliser, then consider having one fitted.
- Consider extra security such as a steering lock.
- Never leave any property or personal documentation on display in your car or van, i.e. on the vehicle seat, as it only takes criminals seconds to smash a window and grab something.
- If you use a SatNav or a Dash Camera, make certain that you not only remove the device from view, also remove its cradle too; and, don't forget to wipe away any tell-tale sucker marks off the windscreen too.
- If you own a van, and are able to do so, make certain that all your stock and tools are taken out over night, and, consider parking it in such a manner that the rear and side doors are close to walls, garage doors or against other vehicles to hinder direct access or physical attacks against your vehicle.
- Security mark all of your tools and equipment to make items uniquely identifiable and less attractive to a thief. Also, you can register the tools and the security marks on <a href="www.immobilise.com">www.immobilise.com</a> so that, if they are ever stolen and subsequently recovered at a later date, they can easily be traced back to their owner.



- **1. Install the latest software and app updates.** They contain vital security updates which help protect your device from viruses and hackers.
- 2. Use a strong, separate password for your email account. Having strong and separate passwords for your most important accounts including your email means that if hackers steal your password for one of your less important accounts, they cannot use it to access your most crucial accounts. A good way to create a strong and memorable password is to use three random words, which are memorable to you, but not easy for others to guess. Other top tips include: Secure your tablet or Smartphone with a screen lock Always back-up your most important data Do not use public Wi-Fi to transfer sensitive information such as card details Watch out for fake websites Use two-factor authentication for your most important accounts Go to cyberaware.gov.uk to find out more or join the conversation @cyberawaregov







