# WOLDS WANDERERS









Far-reaching views from the Wolds Way, Yellow Toadflax and Hoverflies (photos thanks to Vicky) together with huge numbers of Marbled White butterflies (Ann's photo) were the highlights of a delightful walk in July. Starting from the old station at

Kiplingcotes, we ascended to Arrass Wold Farm and took the Wolds Way down to the lane which led up to Goodmanham passing the flower-filled Rifle Butts Quarry on the way. From the far end of the village we joined the Hudsons Way railway line with its butterflies taking us leisurely back to our start.

We went further afield in August when Andrea led us from Ravenscar south on the Cleveland Way. We passed the WWII radar station and continued as far as Meeting House Farm where we turned to join the old Scarborough-Whitby railway track which took us back to Ravenscar. Going further north we had a look round the extensive site of the Peak Alum Works, the world's first chemical industry which operated 1640-1862. Alum was needed for fixing dyes. Also seen from here were several seals from the colony on the shoreline. Visible in the middle distance was the construction of the Sirius Potash Mine.







# National Gardens Scheme opening, The Old Vicarage, 30th June 2019



After last year's very successful opening, we decided to do it again this year, raising money for various nursing charities under the NGS. This year a garden nearby in Fraisthorpe opened on the same day, which could have increased visitor numbers: of course I never got to see it, as I was too busy with ours!

There is a surprising amount of 'behind the scenes' organisation to be implemented, from registering the garden on the NGS website in the autumn, uploading photos, writing copy for the book entry etcetera, to publicity and signage when the opening is imminent. Not to mention the gardening itself ......fortunately my

younger son Jeremy is willing to do a lot of the heavier work, and only charges me £5 per hour! Matthew Pea and Gary Marshall take care of the grass and the hedges, which were all in great shape on the day.

The Nafferton Methodists provided catering services again, including furniture, this time there were sandwiches, which quickly sold out, as well as cakes. Jeremy and I had spent some considerable time over the winter potting up seedlings, runners and divisions of many of the plants, grasses and shrubs, which were for sale in aid of the Gamekeepers Welfare Trust. We did not sell all of them, so if anybody is interested feel free to call round, they are going cheap at a pound or two each.... We were lucky with the weather, although it was less sunny and more windy than ideal, it did not rain. We were also slightly short on helpers, my daughter Lucy was in Newcastle completing work experience wit the BBC, and we needed someone on plant sales, as well as on the gate, the car park and toilet facilities. My brother, Lucy's boyfriend Jack, my friend Anne, my partner Tony and my two sons kept the show on the road. Again we are very grateful to the Cherry family, who kindly allowed visitors to park at theirs.

We meet every Friday afternoon in the Village Hall from 2pm until 4pm. Gentle exercises, table tennis,


badminton, soft bowls, scrabble, triominoes etc are all available along with a cup of tea or coffee and biscuits.







