### WOLDS WANDERERS



There was no walk in September due to so many being away on holiday. In October, a very unfavourable forecast drew only five hardy souls for a largely wet but otherwise enjoyable circuit between Millington and Givendale. Following the Minster Way past Little Givendale Farm, there was a steep grassy descent into Whitekeld Dale and then a gradual ascent to the church at Givendale and its pond (site of Robert Fuller's signature painting *Geese at Givendale*). From here we picked up the Chalkland Way passing through Brimland Wood and Grimthorpe Wood on the way back to Millington.

One of the highlights was the appearance of a small group of Roe deer but the most pleasing were several sightings of Red Kites. We were often alerted to their presence by their high-pitched whistles.





#### **Parish Council**

A good attendance of the Parish Council in October with just a couple of councillors swanning off on holiday. I'm new to the role of Parish Clerk and am the only paid employee. I think that I was expecting a kind of "Vicar of Dibley" environment and instead found myself in awe of this group of village volunteers, giving up their time to discuss and decide on village issues, some of which evoke opposing strong views. One of those items was that BT had announced that it wished to de-commission the village pay telephone. We established that it had only been used four times in the past year. The options were to remove the kiosk, appeal the ruling or keep the kiosk by paying £1.00 for it. We decided to see what some in the village thought by using the Friends of Frodingham Facebook group and the village was split three ways - an eyesore - get rid of, poor mobile signal -keep it as a working phone or keep it as a village resource - what could that be? We've got one more

meeting to go before we decide so I would appreciate your views. We also submitted the beginning of our redrawn emergency plan to the Humber Emergency Planning Service so that we can offer leadership in the event of an emergency (at least until the emergency services arrive). Another big issue to arise that may affect some more rural members is that the Environment Agency will introduce General Binding Rules in relation to septic tanks that discharge into waterways, in January 2020. The detail of which is too complex for this article but there is a document relating to it on our website at <a href="https://www.northfrodinghampc.org">www.northfrodinghampc.org</a> or on the Environment Agency website.

Our next meeting is on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November at 7.30pm in the village hall and you are welcome to attend. If you have any issues that you wish to bring to the attention of the Council then please do not hesitate to let me know.

#### **Ward Councillors**

Some years ago, we offered to arrange for the 21 parish councils in the East Wolds & Coastal Ward to come together to discuss issues of local importance that pertain to the role of East Riding of Yorkshire Council with the relevant council officers or Directors. The cluster meetings have proved to be very popular with many parish councils & a representative of North Frodingham parish council has always attended.

Our most recent parish council cluster meeting took place on 10<sup>th</sup> October and Paul Bellotti Director for Environment & Communities attended to answer questions on matters raised by parish councils relating to a variety of topics covering highway issues of speeding, speed reactive signs, parking & potholes, we also discussed the new legislation relating to septic tanks, dog fouling & fly tipping.

Paul Bellotti was able to hear first-hand the views from parish councillors, he went on to outline the role of his directorate & also took away several tasks with the promise of responding in due course.

We believe that by bringing parish councils together in an informal setting, inviting them to set an agenda which relates to matters of local interest that they can then raise with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, is a method that has proved useful for everyone concerned and very productive.

Our aim is to continue to offer parish council cluster meetings for as long as councillors in the East Wolds & Coastal Ward find them useful.

Data Intelligence For a number of years East Riding Council has hosted a 'Data Observatory' which is an online repository for a host of facts and figures regarding the East Riding. This has now been replaced by a new Intelligence Hub, which hosts a huge range of data and statistics covering the East Riding from demographic information to health statistics. This information can be brought right down to Parish Level. The Council and it's partners in the Police, Health and other services utilise this information when planning their services and anyone looking at obtaining grants can access this data to build their case, so is an invaluable tool for the voluntary sector. This information is available to all and even if you do not have a use for it, it's a wonderful 'tool' for discovering facts about your area.
