

At our recent meetings it was decided to establish a committee to look at enhancing the look of the village. We are currently in the process of drawing up short, medium and long term goals and need the help of the village in getting ideas to consider and to find ways to fund the enhancements. If you have any ideas please make contact with me. Our contact details are on our website at http://www.northfrodinghampc.org

We are also in the process of upgrading our Community Emergency Plan to try and give us some control over issues caused in the event of an emergency. We are hoping that discussions between ERYC and Environment Agency will result in a solution to safely re-opening Foston Bridge to walkers. Council has also agreed to a two- yearly maintenance plan to manage the tree stock in the village cemetery and an arborist has been appointed to undertake the work. It has also been agreed to purchase two additional litter bins to try and encourage a litter and dog poo free village. Additional signage has been put in the

village indicating that offences may be committed by those not picking up their dog's mess. It has been discussed with the Dog Warden Service about prosecution of offenders although we hope that won't be necessary.

May I also take the time to plug a brilliant community resource on social media? Set up by the community to keep each other informed is the Friends of Frodingham Facebook group. It has nothing to do with the Parish Council but I do use it a lot to get feedback on village matters.

Our next meeting is on Monday 9th March at 7.30pm in the village hall and you are welcome to attend. Local Councils are subject to rules that do not permit us to discuss <u>and</u> decide unless the item is on our agenda so If you have any issues that you wish to bring to the attention of the Council then please contact me at least a week before the meeting so that consideration can be given to put on the agenda.


History of North Frodingham:



From the Ward Councillors

Councillors have agreed to increase the council's part of the council tax charge in the East Riding by 3.99% for the 20/21 finial year, which included 2% allowed by government to raise money for Adult Social Care. This helps towards the savings the council needs to find to meet the growing cost of delivering its services, which are forecast to increase to nearly £20 million by 2023/24.

The conservative groups budget which was agreed included some specific funding not included in other proposals which should benefit residents across the East Riding. The £1.6 million included amongst other items:

Tree Planting Community Fund - £200k of grant funding will be made available to Schools, parish councils & other community groups to compliment other tree planting schemes across the East Riding

Local Flooding Resilience Fund - £500k grant funding available for those small schemes to help communities achieve improvements which would never attract the funding allocated to larger projects.

Active Communities - £200k to build on the success of the Active Coast work and bring leisure & sports initiatives to inland communities

Coastal Town Seafront Improvement Scheme - £200 for small scale improvements to main coastal towns

Sunday Parking Pilot Scheme - £80k to allow free parking on Sundays out of season in Bridlington & Hornsea

Young People Business/Schools Career Adviser - £200k will fund a post for 3 years to work with business, young people and schools to ensure they are aware of the opportunities associated career with business development in the East Riding.

Tour de Yorkshire - £15k fund making grants of up to £500 available for parish councils and local groups to use to decorate the route of this year's cycle race as it passes through the East Riding.

75th Anniversary of VE Day Community Fund - £20k of funding available for grants for parish councils or local organisations who wish to mark the historic event with celebrations.

Hopefully you are all getting safely and comfortably through this wet and windy weather.

Something more uncomfortable is the multitude of scams going around at the moment; the latest for me was telling me that my Amazon account would be debited by "a certain amount"; and all I had to do was press ONE on my phone!

Well, I don't have an Amazon account so that was easy for me; however, for those who do have one; **DON'T PRESS "ONE" ON YOUR PHONE!**

Please be careful when confronted with these types of telephone or internet scams, IF IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT, or put the telephone down on them.

I heard on the news of someone down south who had a call from their bank saying there was a problem with their account; could they verify their account number.

REMEMBER; the Banks NEVER REQUEST MONEY OR YOU ACCOUNT NUMBER OVER THE PHONE OR AT YOUR DOOR! And the Police WILL NEVER ASK YOU FOR MONEY.

I received a telephone call recently supposedly from my Visa company, telling me that a sum of £300 had been taken from my account **14 minutes ago**, press 1 if this is correct or press 2 if this is wrong.

I promptly put down the telephone and called my bank **on a different phone line altogether,** just in case they had my phone "fixed" to go straight to them. My bank confirmed that no such amount had been removed.

Please be aware that these scammers may be the scum of the Earth, but, unfortunately, they are very clever too. **Please don't get caught out.**


