A new initiative - Visit Cromarty

This is a new initiative by Cromarty Community Development Trust (CCDT) to build a digital presence for the attractions and businesses of Cromarty with the primary aim of increasing visitor footfall to the town. The developing strategy has been initiated by creating a Facebook and Instagram account called Visit Cromarty which will share content about things to do, places to visit and stay, where to eat and shop, community events and fairs and so on.

Next on the list is a website highlighting these same things with some static content (listings for each business/visitor attraction) alongside blog content, captivating images and hopefully some video content too.



The task is big, and to include all that want to be part of the campaign, a Business Group will be formed. 

Cromarty Harbour - East Pier Update

Hopefully you will have seen the progress being made so far on the East Pier project. It is now well underway and the results are starting to show. Hoping that all challenges were behind us, we came across an issue that had the potential to drastically limit the scope of the project. When work started, a diving survey was conducted at the end of the pier to check the condition of the base and to identify where there may be issues in the structure. Regrettably, the structure was not as stable as we had hoped, with the discovery of voids and slipped stones at the base, making the pier structure highly vulnerable to collapse; perhaps not in the short term but certainly a likely event in the near future. From this survey our engineers arrived at a plan

to secure the foundations but at an increased cost of some £90k. Given this information we had no choice but to redistribute funds to underpin the pier head. This left us to either scaling back the ambition of the project or to press on and raise more funds. The need to resolve took on some urgency due to Aberdeen Marine being on site. It would not have been financially efficient to revisit elements of the project at a later date, particularly as the cost of setting up had already been incurred. Fortunately, we once again had the support of Historic Environment Scotland who agreed to fund an additional £124k, making the project cost nearer £450k. Quite a commitment and quite an endorsement. Today the work continues, probably through until late September, where we will again have a pier to enjoy for years to come. Picture of progress on 28 July 2025.

News from St Regulus' Church

The Church has undergone a bit of a transformation since Fr Alex started as Rector in February. He is very tech savvy and a number of positive changes have taken place.

We are indebted to Highland Broadband which has installed a super-fast fibre optic system for us completely free and as a community benefit. It means the church can now live stream services, accept donations via a QR code and offer the space to others in the community to enjoy the facility.

Some old pews have been taken away, as have some wooden chairs and there is now a good deal more room on offer and we are encouraging local groups to make use of the facilities. There is no need to be a card-carrying member of the Episcopal Church - all are very welcome!

Services are held at St Regulus' Church **every Sunday at 9.30am** and every **Wednesday at 7.00pm**. The Wednesday Eucharist is a very short service and gives a wonderful opportunity for silent reflection. Other services are advertised on the board outside on Church Street and the church is open every day for private prayer or a visit.

There is a herb garden from which everyone is welcome to help themselves to produce - it's for the community to share! We also have a donation box outside the church for Blythswood food boxes.

The Black Isle Charge (including St Regulus') will have a presence at the Black Isle Show, so why not visit us there?
