

"Exploring Your Past is a two year project which will allow people to learn about and celebrate their archaeological heritage in the Highlands. With funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund, Highland 2007 and Moray Firth Partnership, the project will enable local people to gain an understanding about their past, and then to use this knowledge to make a contribution to their local community by:

- 1 researching and contributing to the archaeological record in the Highlands (the HER, the new Historic Environment Record which will replace the Sites and Monuments Record (SMR)),
- 2 publicising the knowledge in whatever way is considered to be most appropriate.

On offer will be affordable background courses on Highland archaeology. The courses are non-vocational, but an SQA in Local Investigations would be available to people who wished it for the Community Project. Courses will include:

- Finding out about your Local Heritage. This
 course provides the background and tools for
 anyone wanting to find out more.
- Digging Deeper into Highland Archaeology. A more detailed exploration of the rich archaeological heritage in the Highlands.
- Local Investigations Community Project. An opportunity to research and then publicise local archaeological heritage in whatever way the group decides.

Fieldtrips to Highland sites and museums will also be arranged. These allow local people and tourists, and especially those without transport or on limited means, to visit local sites and collections with a guide.

There will be opportunities to research and contribute to the HER (the replacement Sites and Monuments Record in the Highlands).

At the end of the project, there will be a book which will gather together the results from the above actions, and act as a celebration of the work and inspiration for others to do the same.
