
Report of a project to survey and record the Memorial Stones in Old Urray Burial Ground, Ross-shire – March to June 2021

Introduction

The Grid reference for the Old Urray Burial Ground is centred on NH 50687 53231, the Highland Council HER No is MHG8983 (Chapel) and MHG40741 (Cemetery), and the Canmore ID is 12869

The site of Old Urray Church was 500m to the south of the confluence of the Rivers Orrin and Conon where, in former days, there was a ferry crossing. No physical remains of the church can be confidently detected today, but the Old Burial Ground in which the church stood has been used until relatively recently. The location is annotated "Site of Chapel" on the First Edition OS map of 1875, and the church is marked on the Roy map of c1750 but soon after this, in 1780, it was replaced by a new church, Urray West Church, 700m to the south. The Old Burial Ground occupies the west corner of a large field. It has a stone wall with several mature trees surrounding it and is accessed through a caravan site. The enclosure is sub-rectangular, on a NE-SW alignment and generally 1m above the ground surface of the field; it is maintained by Highland Council.





Very little information is given in the two databases. Apparently the site was visited in 1943 but "found to be occupied by a military encampment which must have destroyed any remains previously existing". The databases also report that no trace of the chapel exists although a "small 19th century burial enclosure may have been constructed using some of the stones from the chapel and one of the stones forming part of the west door jamb bears the inscription "AMD 18 1531". In 2005 a survey of the inscribed gravestones was carried out by Kilmorack Heritage Association.

History

Much of this history is taken from GVR Grants "Urray and Kilchrist Church of Scotland – *the Parish, Churches and Ministers from the Earliest Times to 2000*". Mr Grant was the minister of the parish from 1949 to 2000 and had studied the minutes of the meetings of the Dingwall Presbytery transcribing many of the passages into his book

Urray is recorded in papal letters as being dedicated to "St Madidoes"; this was possibly "St Madoes" a colleague of St Curadan who had established the Pictish Christian Church based at Rosemarkie. The earliest church in the vicinity of Urray may have been at Fairburn; old rent rolls refer to a place called "Februne-neegles" – "egles" being an old place-name element almost certainly Pictish in origin. The location of this early church has not been identified. A system of parishes had been established in the North of Scotland by about 1170 and these have mostly survived. One exception however is Urray which was united with neighbouring Kilchrist (near Muir of Ord/Tarradale) in about 1600

In 1666 – A Mr Cummings was appointed minister; he died in 1705 having served 47 years

- From 1690 onwards there was turmoil in many Scottish parishes as the Presbyterian government tried to establish itself against the wishes of many folk, not least the landowners or heritors who remained Episcopalian. Urray Parish seems to have gone through an unsettled period for the next 60 years
- 1716 Minutes of Dingwall Presbytery have "the parish of Urray has been vacant for several years". There are references to several appointments but these don't seem to have lasted. However the Episcopalian minister of Contin, Mr Aeneas Morison, appears to have been preaching and baptising at Urray and Fodderty at this time, and later another Episcopalian minister Mr Duncan Murchison was also officiating at Urray.
- In 1717 Mr John Morrison, a Presbyterian minister, was appointed to Urray from Gairloch. He seems to have been quite a controversial character and many parishioners didn't approve of him by spreading rumours about his conduct; many of his exploits are related in the Presbytery minutes. John Morrison reported that the manse was ruinous due to the long vacancy (see also below). The heritors were unwilling to tax themselves for the money so it was decided that the vacant stipend for 1708 1715 should be used to pay for the manse. The manse however was not built until 1750, after John Morrison had died in 1747 (gravestone C70)
- 1749 Patrick Grant was appointed to the post of minister
- 1750 The Presbytery found that the manse was ruinous and decided to ask the Barons of Exchequer for a grant for repairs, the manse was uninhabitable and a new one was ordered (there is some confusion here; these facts were expressed by John Morrison in his time as minister, some of the minutes are thought to be missing; clearly the new manse ordered in 1717 had not been built MM) The OSA (in 1793) reports that the manse was built in 1750 and was then "the best in the synod".
- 1762 Visit from Bishop Forbes (in 1760 it is reported that one third of the population of the parish were Episcopalian) he confirmed 34 people in the Episcopal Chapel at Ord but stayed with Mr and Mrs Grant at Urray manse and confirmed another 143 on the Sunday. In 1778 Patrick Grant was elected Moderator of the General Assembly. He died in 1787 having been at Urray for 38 years (gravestone C71)
- 1774 Minutes of the Presbytery report that "there is no proper place of worship, the old ruinous church having been quitted and the people (were) holding their meetings sometimes in open fields sometimes in byres and barns"
- 1780-81 The new "West" Church was built at Urray at a cost £900 Scots and "the most elegant and substantial building of the kind in the country" (OSA/Downie 1793) "The overseer (for building the church) was given authority to take down the ruinous church (the old church) and to use what he could of the stones towards the new church" (Grant p38, see later chapter on Associated Sites). In the early 18th century use of neighbouring Kilchrist Church had diminished and a service was held only on one Sunday in three; services at Kilchrist church ceased completely when the West Church at Urray was built in 1780.
- From 1787 to 1811 the minister for Urray parish was John Downie; he compiled the report for the Old Statistical Account and his monument (A01) is close to the entrance of the old Burial Ground

Method

Our main aim was to take details and photographs of the gravestones and to draw a plan to show their position. A nearby resident had informed us that, in the not too distant past, many more stones had been visible but had now become overgrown with vegetation. We therefore included some stones that were just under the turf and on occasions some which were even deeper if they appeared to be more unusual or interesting. In some instances we "probed" deeper stones to assess their size and shape.

The area was divided into quadrants - A,B,C and D. Each gravestone was given a number which was preceded by the letter of the quadrant. The size, inscription and a photograph of each memorial stone is included in the gazetteer of this report. Visits were made to several nearby sites which were associated with the Old Urray Burial Ground as part of the project - photographs, comments and observations are noted below.



Sites Associated with the Old Urray Church and the Old Burial ground

Former Manse – Grid ref NH 50688 53004. Highland Council HER MHG 16362, Canmore ID: 267941, Listed Building (B) 14019. Described as a "barn or farmstead", this building is 200m to the south of the old burial ground and dates to 1750. Quote from Listed Building doc – "Steading, incorporating large 18th century, 2 storey crowstepped barn, with single storey byre range at NE gable and single storey cottage at SW, forming shallow U-plan court......"

Statement of Special Interest states "(it is) said locally that Old Urray barn incorporates former ecclesiastical building. Earlier manse built circa 1750 and was then "the best in the synod". The unusual height of the barn, and its large size, suggest it might incorporate some of an earlier manse. The "barn" resembles the "rent girnals" of the richer Easter Ross cornlands. One of the doors has "a re-used stable door handle of unusual





"New" manse – Grid ref at NH 50712 52906. Highland Council HER MHG8996, Canmore ID 12855, HES B Listed Building 14018. This building 300m to the south of the burial ground dates to 1814 and is presently inhabited. The NSA of 1840 has "The manse was built in 1814 and is at present in excellent condition having been repaired in 1837". Associated with this later manse are the remains of a substantial walled garden to the NW. Lining the driveway around the house there is a collection of carved stones positioned as garden ornaments. They comprise angular or curving dressed stones which have previously been part of a variety of buildings - decorative ridge stones, millstones/grind stones, lair marker.

Comment - The OSA and the Presbytery minutes state that the masonry of the Old Church was reused in the building of the West Kirk in 1780. The West Kirk was fairly plain and it was impossible to say with any certainty that the stonework included masonry from the Old Kirk. However the stones lining the driveway at the "new" Manse ranged from ornately carved ridge stones to curving coping stones and may well be stones from the Old Kirk which had been discarded

Glebe land – Grid reference centred on NH 506530. An area of farmland between the road, the burial ground and the two manses is annotated "Glebe" on the First Edition OS map. The NSA of 1840 has "the glebe is about 8 acres in extent". The land is surrounded by an unusual wall which incorporates many large orthostats projecting above the capping of the wall at regular intervals. These larger stones have two drilled holes through which fencing wire was "threaded"





Urray West Church – Grid ref at NH 50890 52473. HC HER: MHG 23404, Canmore ID: 110553, Listed Building 14023. This church is 700m to the south of the old burial ground. It was built in 1780 using some of *"the masonry of the old medieval parish church" (OSA)*. The vestry was added 1833 and repairs were done in 1862 (Ross and Joass). Quote from Listed buildings doc *"Rectangular church pinned random rubble ashlar dressing. Pair long round headed keystone windows......."*



Old Urray Gravestone Records

Quadrant A

A1. Wall Monument a white marble plaque with sandstone surround built into the SW wall of the burial ground. The inscription is carved into the marble and the letters are of lead. The overall height of the monument is 2.4m and the width 2.4m; the marble plaque is 92cms high x76cms width


A2 Lair markers Three dressed sandstone markers in a row forming what was probably the west limit of a lair 4.5m², no corresponding markers on the other side were found. The markers are 17cms high x 25cms width x 25cms thick and all have sockets probably for a metal railing now removed. No inscriptions



A3 Headstone This headstone, with stepped pedestal, has fallen but the base is still in its original position. The headstone is largely intact apart from losing its ornate capping, the majority of which lies in small fragments on the base at the NE end. The headstone and pedestal are 141cms height x 70-86 width x 15-30cms thickness



A4 Headstone A substantial fragment of a sandstone monument, probably the lower part, lie just underneath the turf. It is 41cms high x 65cms width x 14cms thick. The SE wall of the burial ground respects it and curves around it.





A5 Headstone This simple upstanding headstone of sandstone faces NE and is covered in lichen; height 84cms x width 76cms x 10cms thickness. Inscription difficult to read



A6 Headstone An upstanding sandstone headstone facing NE and leaning significantly to SW. Height 124cms x width 84cms x 8cms thickness





A7 Table tomb - This low moss-covered sandstone table tomb is 176cms long x 72cms width x 10cms thick with moulded and bevelled edges is supported on a stone ($60 \times 25 \times 15$ cms height) at the SW end.



A8 Table tomb A simple sandstone table slab 190cns long x 92cms width x 12cms thick. It is on low supporting stones making the total height of the monument 38-42cms. Other Chisholm gravestones are adjacent.



A9 Obelisk/Celtic Cross A sandstone monument close to the SW wall of the burial ground. The monument is facing NE and is 184cms high x 23-36 width x 13cms thick. It has a stepped base 33cms high x 36-61cms width x 20-43cms thick

A10 Lair markers Three lair marker stones (A10a, A10b and A14) define a rectangular area of c45m \times 4m, there may be a fourth in the undergrowth. All are of similar size 20cms height \times 30cms width \times 10-11cms thick. All have the inscription "DC" on their sloping surface, A10a is facing NE whereas A10b and A14 are facing SW

A11 Headstone This sandstone headstone is 160cms high x 77-90cms width x 14-30cms thickness and in good condition. It may be associated with Lair A10 which is adjacent *(markers have "DC" inscribed on them).*


A14 Lair marker - see A10

A15 Headstone A simple headstone of grey granite located close to the SW wall of the burial ground and within Lair A16. The stone is 48cms high x 48cms wide x 10cms thick and leaning backwards

A16 Lair/Burial Enclosure A rectangular enclosure measuring 4.75m x 4m abutting the SW wall of the burial ground and surrounded by a low sandstone wall 30cms thick x 44cms high. Sockets at 9cm intervals along the top suggest that it once had railings. An "entrance" with 2 steps and sockets for a possible gate are in the NE wall. Headstone A15 is in a mid-position at the back of the enclosure





A17 Headstone This granite headstone is in a central position on the SW side of burial enclosure A20 and is probably associated with it. It tapers in width at the top and is 133cms high x 60-65cms wide x 15cms thick. The inscribed panel is polished

A18 Recumbent Graveslab – This simple rectangular sandstone graveslab within lair A20 has a bevelled edge. See entry for A20 for further photograph




A19 Recumbent graveslab A sub-rectangular schist gravestone under 5 - 10cms of turf close to but outwith enclosure A20. It tapers to the SW end and is 166cms long x 56(SW end)-64cms(NE end) No inscription and no other features noted



A20 Burial enclosure/lair

This enclosure is 2.7m² and surrounded by a granite kerb 13cms thick. Graveslab A18 occupies its west half and upstanding headstone A 17 is at the centre of its SW side





A21 Recumbent Graveslab A graveslab was detected but not exposed under 12-15cms of turf between tabletombs A7 and A8. It tapered towards the NE end and measured c186cms in length x c70cms(SW end)-60cms(NE end)

A22 Table Tomb This plain sandstone table tomb with bevelled edges is 192cms long x 97cms width x 15cms thickness. At each end it is supported by dressed stones 25cms high. This tomb is almost certainly associated with adjacent stones A23 and A29

A23 Headstone This upstanding sandstone headstone is 118cms height x 98cms width x 11cms thickness. The date on the stone "1845" was the centenary of the Jacobite Uprising and the lichen-covered inscription, which is difficult to read, is unusual; "in memory of grandfather, Alexander Fraser" (1719 -1769) The headstone is also adjacent to and probably associated with A29 (with inscription "ASERS 1747"). Table tomb A22 is probably associated too

A24 Headstone An upstanding grey granite headstone 192cms height x 62-89cms width x 15-40cms thickness in reasonable condition but with a superficial crack down its inscribed face

A25 Headstone An upstanding sandstone headstone leaning slightly to the NE is 210cms height x 72-100cms width x 17-40cms thickness. The inscribed face tapers in width towards the top. This headstone is associated with headstone A33 (see comment) and probably also with recumbent graveslabs A31 and 32

A26 Headstone This upstanding sandstone headstone is 131cms height x 64-76cms width x 12-18cms thickness and leans slightly towards the NE. The preservation of the inscription is generally good but the central part has flaked off

A27 Headstone This upstanding sandstone headstone measures 125cms height x 55-72cms width x 15cms thickness. The condition of the stone and the inscription is good although it leans significantly to the east (ie forwards and sideways).

A28 Table Tomb This sandstone table tomb with bevelled edges has cracked completely into two fragments which are now lying at an angle to each other. The slab is 175cms long x 84cms wide x 11cms thick and the undersides of both fragments have laminated. The two supporting stones are 22m high. There is no inscription.



A29 Recumbent Graveslab This simple sandstone graveslab (photo right and below on the right) is under a few centimetres of turf, has bevelled edges and the bold inscription "ASERs 1747"; a missing flake affects the first part of the inscription which was presumably "FRASERs" - curious in being plural! An adjacent recumbent slab A30 may be associated, also A22 and A23 which are Fraser memorials.



A30 Recumbent Graveslab This simple slab of red sandstone, also under a few centimetres of turf (on the left in the photo to the right) measures 151cms long x 56cms wide, has bevelled edges and is possibly associated with its neighbour A29. The plain inscription "PROPERTY" is intriguing.




A31 and **A32** Recumbent Graveslabs Two sandstone graveslabs, A32 lying on top of A31, are probably associated with nearby headstones A25 and A33.

- A31 the lower graveslab is 182cms long x 82cms wide and most likely in its original position
- A32 the upper one is sub-rectangular tapered towards its SW end and 172cms long x 35-74cms width x 13cms thick. It is cracked across its central part. The upper surface of the slab is irregular having been "tooled" with intermittent diagonal short slashes. This slab may originally have been upstanding and may have been lowered (to make way for A33?)







A33 Headstone A simple upstanding headstone of sandstone 90cms height x 66cms width x 10cms thickness. Unusually the memorial inscription is on the SW face and, also unusually, duplicated on A25 (see above) which is just 2m to the SW (the two recumbent graveslabs A31 and A32 are in between)



A34 Headstone A fallen marble headstone mostly covered in turf, this monument has 3 fragments. The main fragment with the inscriptions is 90cms in length x 45cms width x c10cms thickness. The inscription has been cut into the marble and infilled with lead lettering, some of which has now been lost.





B145 A lair measuring 4m x 3.5m, located against the SW wall of the burial ground, is marked by 2 markers. The lair is almost certainly associated with B102, an obelisk at its centre. The markers are different heights, one is 200mm high, the other 340mm. On each is a hole which probably held a connecting rail.


Quadrant C

This, the northwest quadrant, is dominated by the **Burial Enclosure**, a rectangular stone built structure, thought to be on the site of the old church and overgrown with ivy; a mature tree is growing in its north corner. The structure measures 5.5m x 4.4m externally and has walls of mortared stonework 2m in height; double faced it is 58cms thick and capped by regular dressed coping stones, these are 58cms in length x c68cms width (overhang of 4-6cms inside and out) x 9cms thick. The entrance to the enclosure is in the SE wall; it is 1.25m in width and has internal splaying, a single lintel and a single threshold stone. The remains of a door (photo below right) with horizontal slatted timbers are hanging from metal hinges. A dressed stone on the outer side of one of the door jambs is inscribed with the letters "AMD18¹⁵³¹" (photo below left). Features inside the enclosure include two wall plaques C84 and C85 (see record below), and two recumbent slabs C94 and C95 (see record below) buried beneath a few centimetres of leaf compost.

C67 Recumbent Slab This sub-rectangular sandstone slab measuring 150cms length x 76-82cms width x c110cms thickness is partly covered by turf. It has an irregular upper surface and no inscriptions



C69, and **C76** Lair Markers (also **D68** and **D74**) Four sandstone lair markers are roughly the same shape and size; 33-34cms tall x 29-30cms in width x 11cms in thickness. They mark the corners of a sub-square lair roughly 5m² in size. The inscription on all is "FC"; two of them, D68 (below left) and C70, face NE and two, D74 and C76 (below right), face SW



C70 Headstone A plain upstanding sandstone headstone 73cms high x 69cms wide x 8cms thick with no inscriptions. The stone is "tooled" on its SW surface and leans slightly forward/NE



C71 Table Tomb This rectangular sandstone table tomb (*left in photo below*), the east one of two close together, has rounded edges and is 179cms long x 86cms wide x 15cms thick (20 to 28cms height above ground surface). The inscription on its upper surface is very clearly cut and the lettering ornately embellished in parts

C73, C81 (photo right), and C90 Lair markers x3 mark the corners of a rectangular lair measuring roughly 5.2m x 2.5m. All are of sandstone and 21cms height x 25cms width x 10 cms thickness. A fourth marker recorded during the Kilmorack Heritage Project of 2005 was not found



C75 Recumbent Slab This sub-rectangular slab, measuring 127cms length x 44-53cms width, tapers towards the NE where there is possible "tooling"

C79 and C83 Lair markers Two lair markers 2.2m apart, facing each other and probably associated with each other but have different inscriptions. 

C87 Recumbent Slab This small rectangular sandstone slab on a NW-SE alignment measures 76cms x 56cms and is SE of Obelisk C86 with which it may be associated (see photos above and below)

D157 A broken sandstone fragment of a recumbent **gravestone**, measuring 780mm wide, at its maximum it is 420mm long and is over 80mm thick. It has been recovered by turf.

D158 A sandstone **memorial headstone**, which has fallen from its base and broken into many small pieces which partially cover an adjacent recumbent stone, D159 (see photo), and may cover 2 other recumbent stones under the turf. The remains of the inscription are on several fragments of the stone but most of it has been lost. The estimated height of the monument is 1200mm and the base 200mm high, 730mm wide and 200mm deep.

D159 A **recumbent graveslab** of sandstone under the turf with no inscription. It is partly covered by D158 and measures 1900mm in length, 900mm wide and 80mm thick. (See D158 for a photograph)

D160 Located but not uncovered.

D161 A **recumbent gravestone of** sandstone which is broken at the bottom. It measures 2000mm long, 600mm wide and 100mm thick.

D162 A memorial headstone of polished marble, which has, fallen onto its inscribed face. The top is upsidedown and detached from the rest of the stone, the base is still in situ.



D163 A sandstone grave **marker**, measuring 630mm high, 510mm wide and 110mm deep with the inscription: JMR MMN

D164 A sandstone **recumbent stone**. It measures 1400mm long, 400mm wide (at the widest) and 100mm thick. It is broken along one long edge and has been recovered by turf. It could be a reused gate-post.




D244 Headstone A simple upstanding headstone (*left in the photo*) of ?granite or ?manmade composition. The main part of the monument measures 113cms height x 64-59cms width x 17-20 cms thickness, tapering in width and thickness towards the top. The base is 18cms height x 74cms width x 32cms thick. 

D241 A rectangular **lair** on a NW-SE axis measuring 440cms x 182cms, the southern of two adjacent to each other. D241 is defined by 4 sandstone markers with iron railings between them on three sides. The markers are square in plan, 17cms² and have a "G" inscribed on the upper SW facing slope. The iron railings are 3cms in diameter and the one on the north side is common to lair C240






D240 A sub-rectangular **lair** on a NW-SE axis the northern of two adjacent to each other. It measures 453cms x 235-225cms. Four sandstone markers c20cms height x 25-29cms width x 9-11cms thickness mark the corners; the two to the north have "M" inscribed on their sloping surface and the two to the south have "M.M^C.L" (see photo below). Iron railings link the two long sides, the one to the south being common with lair C241. Headstone D242 is in the SE corner of this lair









D239 Celtic Cross A grey granite Celtic Cross in good condition with a total height of 187cms. The cross itself is 15-54cms width x 15cms thick, the lower inscribed part of the base is 49-61cms width x 31-36cms thick and the stepped base is 77-86cms x 56-65cms thick. The lettering of the inscription is infilled with lead.




D237 Raised lair and D238








D238 Headstone (photo above) The two large fragments of the marble headstone lie on top of the raised lair D237 at right angles to one another. The two fragments of the sandstone base are under a few cms of turf at the SW corner of lair D237 (see plan above and below). The upstanding monument would have had a height of 138cms x width 50-78cms x thickness 115-195cms (base 31cms x 78-86 x 31) The inscription is in reasonable condition although some of the numbers are difficult to read. The lower fragment of the base is still in situ and built into the wall of the lair, both the fragments of the base have a stippled pattern on their SW face.





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D236 Headstone An upstanding headstone of polished grey granite in good condition measuring 111cms height x 57-60cms width x 10.5cms thick (base an additional 21cms x 76cms x 22.5cms)
