The Villa was much too big for her, it became a shambles but she would not move because it contained all her fathers papers and possessions, which she believed (wrongly) were of great value. Her later years were difficult, she had to stop driving and this stopped her participation in local events and societies, but this period of her life was much eased by the goodness of her neighbours in the village and the help they gave her. To the end she retained this terrific interest in her family history, not for nothing was she named after her Scots ancestor. Sadly she left moving, to the Millings in Bedale too late, she hated the upheaval of moving and losing her possessions and she died just after her 88th birthday on 25th November 2001.
