Report of the Trustees
For The Year Ended 31 March 2023

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The charity's objectives are to benefit the community of Findhorn Village with he purposes of advancing environmental protection or improvements, including preservation, sustainable development and conservation of the natural environment, the maintenance, improvement or provision of environmental amenities for the community and/or the preservation of buildings or sites of architectural, historic or other importance to the community following the principles of sustainable development.

The charity is highly dependent on the support of volunteers who provided 14,000 hours unpaid service during the year to 31 March 2022.

The charity is grateful for all the support provided by residents and others throughout the year. This support has enabled the charity to progress with developments in line with our objectives.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The work of the company during the year has seen further expansion in both economic and amenity provision for the village of Findhorn. The volunteer workload of the Directors and Members has remained very high with the increasing activity during the year. Without the extra work of the Members and Directors we would not have been able to take advantage of the opportunities that came our way and I thank them for the time and support they have given to the company.

Findhorn Pathway - In memory of David Urquhart was completed in July 2020. This facility is being well used and is appreciated by all users. Some long standing final bills from the construction phase were paid in the year, and some improvements made to Yacht Club corner. A contribution from the company's main account was approved to maintain a healthy maintenance fund for the path going forward.

West Beach Parking - The automatic booking and entry system, along with the general improvements were greatly appreciated by users to the Motorhome Stopover and it has been extensively used, generating income for the company of £46,705 during the year, which has been used for further improvements and upgrades such as a sewage offloading point, road and parking maintenance and toilet block upgrade.

East Beach parking and Dunes Road were maintained during the year, although this requires regular attention and different surface materials have been tried to try to prolong the life of the road surface.

Community Asset Transfer of West Beach toilets was completed in the year and significant work carried out to upgrade these facilities, supported by RTIF Funding from Moray Council and a grant from Moray Speyside. Work continues in the following year to complete this upgrade.

Armstrong Garage Development. Some upgrades carried out in the year. The usable garages continue to be fully let and maintenance work continues to keep them in good order.

The company thanks HIE, Inspiring Scotland, Beatrice Wind, RTIF, Moray Speyside and Moray Council for their support with these developments. The Company plans further development and improvement, as the number of visitors to the village and the demand for parking increases every year. We thank all our visitors for their donations to Car Parking and especially to those who made an extra effort to keep the area free of litter as much as possible.

Looking to the coming year we aim to resolve the boundary issues so that the company can move forward and continue development works with the car parks, motorhome stopover point, toilet and shower facilities and garages. Focus will remain on generating income so that we can turn our attention to the environmental issues, and continuing with our Fundraising plans so that projects like the beach steps can be completed.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Investment property

Investment property is shown at most recent valuation. Any aggregate surplus or deficit arising from changes in fair value is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - not provided

Expenditure of less than £500 is not capitalised.
