	over the past decade or more.	
	Unfortunately, ever-increasing costs now mean that, if the parish council is to continue	
	in its current form and meet its commitments to the villagers of Brampton Ash, there	
	will need to be a significant increase in the local precept for the year 2026-27. This is in	
	common with many local parish councils both nationally and locally: for example,	
	nearby Dingley is proposing to increase its precept from £6,067.00 in 2025 to £8,867.00	
	in 2026 and the precept for East Farndon has risen in recent years to approximately	
	£100+ per band D household.	
	Councillors considered the following options:	
	1/ Become 'unparished'.	
	This would mean that Brampton Ash would have no parish council and, therefore, no local representation at North Northants Council (NNC) level. This option was considered	
	to be unacceptable.	
	2/ Become part of Dingley parish council, subject to Dingley's agreement.
