


#### **REVENUE INCOME FROM COMMENCEMENT UP TO END-2020**

# PROJECTS WE'VE FUNDED IN THE SECOND HALF OF 2020

Two Gazebos

Applicant – Walled Garden
£1295 (fully funded by ART)

Two further sturdy gazebos which are easier to deploy have been added to the Walled Garden inventory. These will provide further protection during outdoor events in our unpredictable climate.





Beehive Equipment Applicant – Neil Robinson £1100 (54% funded by ART)

Neil has had a contribution towards developing his bee colony and honey production and will be making his setup available for educational purposes to the local schools and other interested groups.




Nameplates
Applicant – ART

The Trust has produced a first batch of nameplates to attach to (where appropriate) the Projects around the village that it has funded.









Wall Repair Applicant – Allister Wood £154 (fully funded by ART)

The top course of the wall across the road from the telephone box had been missing for some time. This has now been rebuilt as part of a village tidy-up.





Polytunnel, Raised Beds, Gravel Applicant – Walled Garden £1313 (fully funded by ART)

To allow the growing of more indoor plants, a second polytunnel along with raised beds and gravel for the walkways was approved in December.



## THE HYDRO SCHEMES UPDATE


Three of the four schemes are now operational.

Scheme 1 – Glen Finart (operated by Hydrover)

Scheme 2 - Drynain Burn (operated by Ross MacArthur)

Scheme 3 – Cuil Burn (operated by Hydrover)

The village hall now has the benefit of discounted electricity from this scheme.



## Scheme 4 – Schoolhouse Burn (to be operated by Hydrover)

Tree felling work began in late July to clear a route for the pipeline. This was followed by construction of the two intakes up near the bridge. After receipt of the pipework, the team welded them into longer lengths which could be seen laid out by the trackside and they have since been buried. The turbine house has been built just up the track from the village carpark and awaits the fitting of the turbine and connection to the grid. So nearly complete!
