Glenfinart Bus Terminal, 2. the junction at the Glenfinart bridge on the way to the beach, 3. the entry to Coronation Wood opposite the Church Car Park and 4. at the Slipway opposite the Outdoor Centre).

These are already accessible by the bin lorries for resident's collections. Multi use waste bins would be ideal. This is an issue that councillor William Sinclair has been trying to help us with as well.
