Temporary Prohibition of Traffic of A815 Cairndow-Strachur-Toward Road

Please find enclosed details of Temporary Prohibition of Traffic of A815 Cairndow-Strachur-Toward Road.

These restrictions are proposed to be effective when indicated by signs from 1830 hours to 2100 hours on 12th August 2025 to facilitate planned works on or near the road on behalf of Openreach.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Argyll and Bute Council

TEMPORARY RESTRICTION TO USE OF ROAD

Notice is hereby given that under Section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, use of the following road by the undernoted classes of vehicle will be prohibited for the stated period of time.

Name of Road/Extent of Restriction: A815 Cairndow-Strachur-Toward Road from its junction with Glenfinart Road in a southerly direction to a point adjacent to Loch Eck Caravan Site for a distance of 4.8 kilometres or thereby.

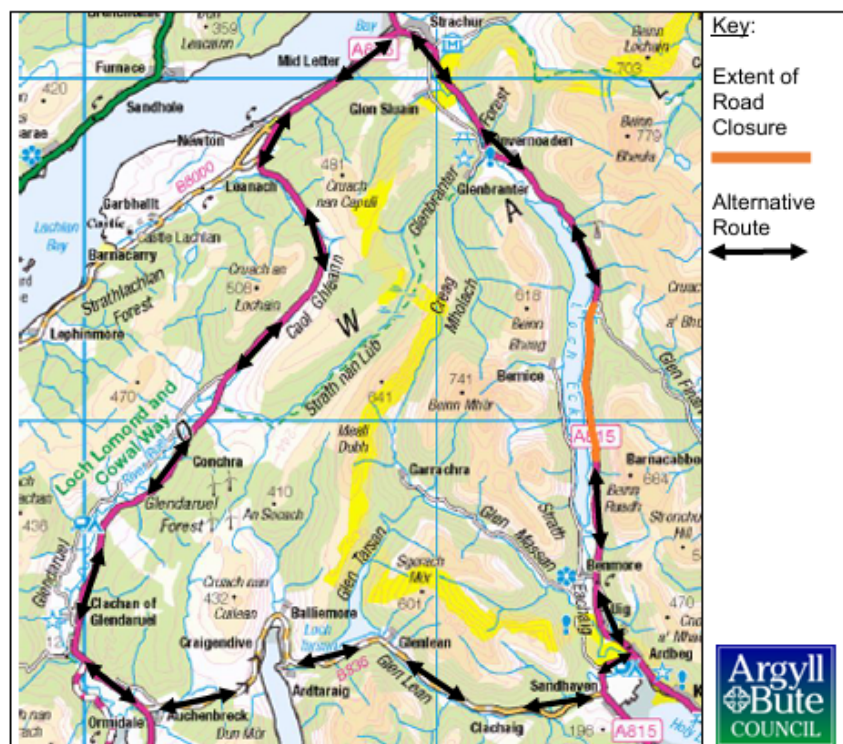
Alternative Route: A815 north, A886, B836, A815 and vice versa.

Type of Restrictions: Prohibition of Traffic.

Period of Restriction/Closure: When indicated by signs from 1830 hours to 2100 hours 12th August 2025 or until the works are complete whichever is earliest.

Reason for Restriction/Closure: To allow planned works to be carried out on or near the road.

Classes of Vehicles Prohibited: All vehicles except those involved in the works. Exceptions will apply to vehicles requiring access/egress to/from affected properties and emergency service vehicles.

Ardentinny Community Trust Ltd: Looking for new Trustees

The Ardentinn Community Trust (ACT) is our own Development Trust which is a community-owned and led organisation, working proactively to combine community-led action with an enterprising approach to addressing and tackling local needs and issues. Development Trusts deliver projects and actions on behalf of the local community.

The four defining principles of a development trust are that they are:

- Engaged in the economic, environmental and social regeneration of a defined area.
- Independent, aiming for self-sufficiency and not for private profit.
- Community based, owned and managed.
- Actively involved in partnerships and alliances between the community, voluntary, private and public sectors.

In recent years the current Trustees have been focused on developing the Glenfinart Walled Garden, which is a major project that operates under the auspices of the Ardentinn Community Trust. It is often thought that the Walled Garden and the Community Trust are one and the same, but this needs clarification and why there is now a need for new Trustees to come forward.

The Current Status of the Trustees

Several of the current Trustees of the ACT are planning to stand down at the next AGM, to focus purely on the project – “Glenfinart Walled Garden”. Therefore, this will result in opportunities for residents to step forward and join the board of Trustees of the overarching Ardentinn Community Trust.

To be clear the new Trustees are not part of a project team for the continued development of the Walled Garden. The new Trustees will have oversight of the Walled Garden project and provide assistance and support to obtain funding for its continued development. Furthermore, the new Trustees will have oversight on future projects, by helping to identify funding that will benefit residents, care for our local environment and protect historical buildings and archaeological sites. New projects can be presented to the Trustees by residents as individuals or as a group, as long as its benefits remain within the Ardentinn Community Council geographic area. In the future, projects may come from the Ardentinn Local Place Plan.

What is required to keep the Ardentinn Community Trust going?

There is a need for a minimum of four Trustees to form a quorum and so ensure the survival of the Ardentinn Community Trust. The treasurer has agreed to continue, but there is a requirement for a Chairperson, Secretary and at least one further member Trustee. The Trustees are fully indemnified against loss or liability of the Trust.

If you have a passion to see the beautiful area in which we live not only preserved but also enhanced by the sensitive and appropriate careful management of the built and natural environment, please consider standing for a position as a Trustee of the Ardentinn Community Trust. You could play a key role in this ‘mile stone’ opportunity for our local community.

A Development Trust opens up access to numerous funding streams that would otherwise be unavailable to the community i.e. Scottish Government Rural Housing Funds, UK Government - Community Ownership Fund, National Lottery Community Fund, Investing in Communities Fund (ICF), Community, Capacity and Resilience Fund (Funding Scotland), Robertson Fund - Community Food and Health, Regeneration Capital Grant Fund, Scottish Borders Council, Shared Property Fund etc. Without it we cannot access these funding sources.
