Reopening the Hall

Clubs are up and running again.

Quiz nights introduced this year and other fundraising events have taken place. Hall insurance price increased this year. Main hall heaters not to be left on when hall unattended as fire risk.

Hydro

Smart meter in place and readings can be broken down into daily/weekly/monthly costs. The electricity will be at least half the cost of what was being paid. Awaiting first invoice from Hydro. Hydro team are currently storing their caravan at the hall for a fee and will be returning to the hall in the spring to carry out work at the hydro by the Centre.

Hall Repairs/Works

Mullden Roofing replaced two slates in the autumn which has stopped the roof leaking Gutters – the old cast iron gutters have been replaced as they were causing a pooling of water and leaking into the hall by the windows. The slates on the roof have been extended to enable the new guttering to be fitted.

The Renewables Trust kindly awarded a grant to cover two-thirds of the cost with the balance being funded by the hall.

Works completed today.

Slates on the weathered side of the hall will need to be replaced in the next 5-10 years but the east side is fine.

Neil built shelving in the container. Items not frequently used will be moved to the container freeing up space for each club to have its own cupboard space.

Funded by Renewables Trust a new removable handrail has been fitted on the stage enabling the area to be better used and not invalidate insurance. Sandra P concerned about badminton and ability of watchers to see the court. Guy explained that the handrail followed building control regulations and offered to obtain higher seating.

Changes to the Committee:

Adina Robinson - Secretary Susie stepping down as Treasurer after four years. New Treasurer to be found by the next AGM. Neil Robinson elected to the Committee

Additional Works

Guy explained the steps to the stage will be altered to move under the stage and the carpet bowls to have carpets on a trolley for ease of use.

Window where plaster caved in due to leaking gutters to be mended.

The second door to the kitchen which has been opened up door will be addressed this week to stop the draft from the kitchen.

Hall heating is being looked into and information gathered. Anne Wood asked about the type of heating and Neil explained infrared panel radiators and additional insulation to the hall.

Loos need upgrading with the addition of a disabled one.

Upgrade the kitchen with an instantaneous hot water system rather than heating the immersion. An industrial oven required.

Neil explained there are grants available for the £20-40k range but not so many for lesser amounts.

Guy mentioned a quarterly email drop to everyone in the village as well as a meeting each quarter so the village can be kept informed 4-6 months in advance of events or works at the hall. Letterbox drop of information for anyone not on email.

Accounts to date: attached. After outstanding invoices in and payments out the accounts will stand at approx. £7k.

Internet banking to be applied for. No two people from the same household can be signatories

Cleaning rota been discussed as this was requested but need to sort. Email residents and ask for volunteers and put in pairs or more then work a 6-week rota for example.

Neil discussed the warm space for anyone who need to come to keep warm and not worry about heating etc.

Spoke to BT about wi-fi box and other issues

Mugs have been printed and will be on sale. First set were credited as badly printed. These are now being used in the hall.

Planning to make some postcards to sell at functions and again raise money for the hall.
