Ardentinny Community Council News

Road Safety in Ardentinny

Just to let you know that in response to our letter, Argyll and Bute Roads department have promised a reply to us by next week. We gave them a list of requests that we believe would address speeding traffic in the village, safety at Rock Cottage corner and a reduced speed limit for the north end of the village. Road Safety was the highest priority in your resident's survey. We have received support to this request from our Ward Councillors which could be very useful going forward if the Roads department are not too keen to implement our requests, but let's see what their reply is first.

Argyll and Bute Council Budget Setting - An Opportunity for us to participate

We have been given an opportunity by Argyll and Bute Council to provide input to their Budget planning for Council Services. Argyll and Bute is facing an estimated gap in funding for its council services of more than £40 million over the next five years, with a gap of over £10 million in 2024-25 alone.

The Council are inviting communities to get involved earlier than usual in the budget-setting process by using a budget simulator to set high-level priorities. You can find this on the Council website, see link below; you can choose the services where you believe they could save money and where not to cut services. The consultation is open until 11 August 2023.

Ardentinny Village Hall News

Hi Everyone,

After contacting BT/Outreach to find out why the installation of the line is taking so long, it appears there has been several issues from their side which resulted in them completely cancelling the account without notifying anyone.

We are still looking into this and will keep you updated.

Two brand new BBQ's and 2 gazebos have now been delivered which will make organising events and outside functions more achievable.

You may be pleased to know, there has been outside interest from people wishing to book the hall for personal events as word is getting out there about the upgrades and improvements. This is all positive and will help towards raising funds for the hall which will benefit everyone.

A polite reminder that the notice board at the hall is for events happening in the hall and around the village. Notices for events further afield should be put on the notice boards in the car park.

Sandwiches provided for the Marshalls of the Argyll Rally were gratefully received. Thank you to John and Elsbeth for being real troopers and helping make the sandwiches at the last minute.

Completed

All lighting and electrical work has now been completed apart from a cooker socket which there is no rush for at the moment. Thank you to our local electrician Harry for working all hours on his days off and between other jobs.

Instead of an immersion heater, there is now instant hot water which makes things easier for holding any events which were mentioned above as well as our regular users.

After speaking to Harry about the hot water system, the immersion switch can be put on when groups first enter the hall, and the water will be hot enough within minutes. The immersion heater must be switched off at the end of each group session or it will break as the storage tank is not meant to hold hot water continuously. This will also avoid the water becoming too hot.

The old water tank which has been removed, is plastic and we are hoping to recycle this for storing grit, sand, and salt for the roads in winter.

As the hall is now watertight, the window to the right of the hall has now been plastered and the supports removed. Thank you to Guy Elder for this.

Guy has also been to complete this now the plaster has dried completely so this should be looking much better and ready for the new blinds to be fitted, hopefully next week.

Still to be completed

Going forward we do have plans to refurbish and re-instate the kitchen area so we can once again look to use this facility and once a fund has been found we will look to renew the heating system in the hall.

We currently have 4 volunteers to clean the hall on a rota basis. Thank you, this is very much appreciated. After speaking with the CC at the meeting on 6th June, we are still looking at other options. Updates to follow once we know more.

In the meantime, thank you to the volunteers who are doing a great job of keeping on top of this while this is sorted.
