citizens advice Somerset **The Somerset Household Support Fund is** designed to provide short-term financial support (from December – end March 2022) to vulnerable households which are struggling to afford the cost of food, gas, electricity, oil and water bills and other essential costs.

The scheme is funded by the DWP and administered by Somerset County Council. The fund is being distributed by Citizens Advice in Somerset which are assisting the

County Council.

Who can apply?

- You must live in the County of Somerset
- You will be over the age of 16 and living independently of parents/carers
- You are struggling to pay for essentials because you don't have enough money to pay for them
- You can provide the required proof of your identity; Somerset residency and either proof of your benefits OR proof of your income (the most recent, last month's, bank statement)

Can I get help if I go to work or if I am retired, or if I don't work at all?

Yes, there will be many different reasons why it has become difficult to pay for essentials. The key thing is that you and your household are struggling to pay for 'essentials'.



Will a Household Support Fund affect my benefits?

No, it will not affect your benefits.

How long does it take to make an application?

Citizens Advice will process completed applications within 5 working days.

Incomplete applications will not be processed until all the evidence required has been provided.



Faudulent Claims

Where Somerset County Council suspects that fraud may have occurred it will investigate the matter as appropriate and this may lead to criminal proceedings.
