#### Thoughts on a Flagpole Please

#### **Burial Ground Grit Bin**

We've put a grit bin in the Burial Ground in Draycott for visitors to use on the path in icy weather. We'll keep an eye on it but please get in touch if you think it needs refilling.

#### Ash Dieback

The closure of New Road in Draycott has been extended to the 31st of May and Westbury Drove in Westbury until 26<sup>th</sup> March to remove trees suffering from Ash dieback. The District Council is preparing a leaflet which will be available on our website, but we are asking landowners to be vigilant in getting trees cut back as soon as they show signs of the disease. Delays can be expensive and hazardous.

## Step 1 Social distancing still in place

8th March

Primary and secondary schools reopen, plus wraparound childcare.

Exercise or recreation outdoors with one other person is also permitted.

29th March If the four tests to carry on with the roadmap are passed: -

The rule of 6 outdoors is allowed, with outdoor sports.

Outdoor parent and child groups of up to 15 can also begin

## Step 2 Social distancing still in place

If the four tests to carry on with the roadmap are passed: -

Around 12 April, to be confirmed a week in advance.

Gym and indoor leisure will reopen.

The rule of 6 outdoors continues but no mixing indoors.

Outdoor attractions such as zoos, theme parks and drive in cinemas to open.

Eating outdoors will be permitted.

Non-essential shops to reopen.

Person care premises to resume business.

Libraries and community centres to open.

Household over-night stays permitted.

Indoor children's activities resume.

## Step 3 Social distancing still in place

If the four tests to carry on with the roadmap are passed: -

17<sup>th</sup> May

Indoor entertainment and attractions reopen

30-person limit outdoors.

Rule of 6 or two households can meet indoors.
