The Charity of John & Joseph Card – 300th Anniversary May 2024 (Known locally as The Card Trust)

Established in 1724, John Card, the eldest brother, had 6 children who all died before him. When John died in 1724 his wife was unable to inherit, as women were not allowed to inherit. John left his land to the hamlet of Draycott and his money to his brother Joseph Card. In 1728 Joseph died and, as his children had also died before him, he left his money and land to the hamlet of Draycott. John and Joseph are both buried in Cheddar Churchyard.

The Will states that "money shall be doled out to the Second Poor". The second Poor were those struggling to pay rent and working long hours to make ends meet, often unable to feed their families. Originally, the grants were for older people as a pension but also a part of the charity was for "need, hardship or distress". Often for a "one-off" payment where applicants approached the Trustees for consideration.

Who can apply to The Card Trust? Twice yearly application details are published in the Parish Newsletter and on the Draycott Facebook page. Grants are based on the Trust income from the previous year. Applications for April 2024 are to be made to the Trust Clerk, Valerie Kennedy, Tel. 01934 741912 or email wiskennedy2021@outlook.com, who will supply an application form. The deadline for the next meeting is 09 April 2024. Anyone living in the village can apply and the grant is assessed on need.

You can apply at any time of the year if you are in hardship by contacting the Trust Clerk. The Trust is non-judgemental and discreet.
