Gullies, waterways, streams and rivers

Do you know your responsibilities if you live next to a watercourse? With the threat of flooding increasing it is more important than ever to do all you can to protect yourself and your neighbours. Many residents of Stoke Street in Rodney Stoke are impacted by flooding with the brook and gullies requiring regular clearing. Highways are not responsible for clearing gullies, we are fortunate that they have recently agreed to clear the pipe in Stoke Street but they have told us that it is now up to the landowners. Please check our Community website page for the Environment Agency booklet **Your Watercourse: rights and roles** plus many other useful links to help with flooding. Please speak to your neighbours if you share a watercourse – you may be able to join forces to clear your section.

Community Orchard

Thank you to everyone who responded to the survey. Over 100 responses were received with an overwhelming majority in favour of a community orchard. Zebra Crossing

Please use the crossing and not the traffic islands to cross the road. The zebra crossing was installed because of the danger of the road, please ensure that all school children know how to cross safely. We have received reports of unattended children using the traffic islands to cross which is a huge concern.

Hedge Cutting

Landowners are responsible for cutting back boundary hedges, especially if they impact visibility or safety. County Highways are not responsible for cutting hedges and will look to recharge costs, so please maintain your boundaries.
