#### I joined Bridgnorth u3a fourteen years ago ...



When I retired in 2007, I was aware of the existence of the U3A. My mother attended the monthly meetings and, particularly, the French Conversation classes, at Hatfield U3A.

Soon after my retirement, I saw a paragraph in the Bridgnorth Journal advertising Bridgnorth U3A. I was determined to join and duly went along to a talk by Margaret Bradley on "There is Life After Forty". I was introduced to various committee members, Joyce Green, Pam Smith, Peter Smith and Chairman Alan Crouch, and made to feel very welcome.

Very soon, I was invited to join the Committee and was pleased to accept. I asked 'is there a special role for me to do?' and was assured that all they wanted was a bog

standard committee member. However, at my 2nd meeting they asked me to become Speaker Secretary which I undertook for ten years! This led me to take on the role of Chair for six years until April 2023.

Very early I helped set up a French Group, in memory of my mother. I then got involved with the installation of a hearing loop in the Community Hall. Enquiries told us that there was a system which had never been correctly installed or used in three years! We sorted that but unfortunately it only covered half the hall ... so hearing impaired members had to be careful where they sat!

I quickly joined the Out and About Group. My first two visits were to the Burton Bass Brewery and the Halfpenny Green Vineyard. I thought "this is the life for me". I also played with the flat green Bowling Group until grandparent duties became more onerous.

Then Covid came along and everything changed - including our new branding and lower case '**u3a**' logo!

I investigated setting up a Zoom Licence for u3a and oversaw two AGMs, Speaker Meetings and Committee

Meetings all on Zoom. I also took on the challenge of Zoom Coffee & Chat and a weekly Zoom Quiz Group.

When a member suggested a Short Walks Group, I thought "I must take a lead" and I have only missed two walks! It has been a growing success and I have made some very good friendships amongst the walkers and been most grateful for Ina Roberts' expert knowledge of the local area.

So, during the last fourteen years I feel I have put a fair amount of effort into our u3a ... but I have reaped so many personal benefits for which I am eternally grateful. My thanks are due to my mother's introduction to u3a and to those early committee members who welcomed me into u3a, to all the committee members I have served with over the years and to all our members who make Bridgnorth and District u3a such a vibrant organisation. And, finally, thank you for awarding me 'honorary membership'.

In May, 38 members had a very informative private guided tour of Stokesay Court near Craven Arms. We were welcomed by the owner and after

our tour we were served a delicious English afternoon tea followed by time to walk in the extensive grounds with the marvellous backdrop of Titterstone Clee.

Built in 1889 for John Derby Allcroft, a partner in glovemakers J & W Dent, it included the most modern technological developments of the time and well-preserved examples of the earliest electric lighting and heating are visible today.

Stokesay Court attracted fame as the setting for Tallis House in the film Atonement starring Keira Knightley and James McAvoy. Well worth a look on YouTube Atonement - YouTube
