*It's a social occasion, and eating is simply the way we choose to help people to meet. We all know that the best way to unite a family is to sit at a table and have meals together, where both successes and problems can be aired and often solved.*

*In line with the basic objective of u3a, our Supper Club is a learning experience ... you would be amazed what you discover from other people, the Bridgnorth area and the world in general.*

*We meet once a month, where the food is good and there is room for us. To date, we have met in The Wheel at Worfield, The Down, The Old Castle, The Royal Oak at Alveley and Blue Ginger. 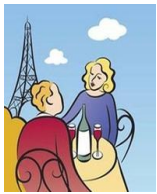

## ALL THINGS FRENCH ?

*Bonjour ... ça va bien ? Ça me fera grand plaisir de vous parler aujourd'hui de notre petit groupe de français. Mais oui, mais oui ... but perhaps I'll do in English instead!*

We are a small, eager but relaxed group, meeting twice a month (except July and August) at Giovanni's Cafe in The Cartway. Emilie, the 'patronne', is French and, as well as serving us coffee, likes to take a sneaky interest in the 'sujet du jour', often supplementing the discussion with snippets of advice and information, *en français bien sûr!*

The aim of the group is to try and speak as much as possible in French but the atmosphere is generous and relaxed, encouraging everyone to participate, so we won't pretend that we converse in French for the entire hour. It is as much about gathering knowledge of French topics and situations and about exchanging our experiences.

As Group Leader, I choose the topic for the day, presenting it through a variety of materials and activities. Fact sheets, quizzes, games, sometimes audio clips but these tend to be rather daunting. Yes, the French can talk quickly ... but have you ever considered how fast we can talk too! As much as possible, I like to find topics that have some relevancy to that moment in time. So far this year, we have looked at superstitions on Friday 13th, comparing English ones to French ones; the Winter Olympics; driving offences and penalties (my ouch!) – an amusing and cathartic hour when we all declared our motoring transgressions! In January, the Great British Bird Watch took place so we created a version 'à la française', increasing our vocabulary about birds; and most recently, on 8<sup>th</sup> May, we pondered why and how this date is recognised in France, followed through with a quiz on flags, beginners' version! New participants are always welcome ... we charge the occasional fee for photocopying ... but otherwise, the cost is a coffee from Emilie.



## WINE APPRECIATION

*David Sharland, our Group Leader, hosts our friendly monthly two-hour wine tasting sessions in The Garden Bar, St John Street. David, whose enthusiasm is infectious, has worked in the wine industry for many years and has visited many countries, countless vineyards and sampled wines of all ages and qualities.*

*David brings five bottles of good wine around a 'theme' for us to sample. He gives us background information on these wines, their country of origin, where vineyards large and small are situated and why varied traditional and modern methods of production, and weather can all affect production.*

*We are then asked to give each wine our personal rating and to guess the price of each bottle. It is always interesting to hear the variety of comments after each tasting and we have one member (who will remain nameless) who is always 'shocked' at the price declaring 'far too expensive!' Members contribute wine related tales which add to the session and are entertaining!*

*I think professional wine tasters spit out their wine after tasting! No such finesse for us. We certainly do not spit out our wine, although we have glasses of water and breadsticks provided for optional palette cleansing.*

*Friendship (and wine) give us happy smiles and we enjoy socialising with u3a friends old and new. Our understanding and knowledge of quality wines is certainly being expanded! David – Thank you and 'Cheers'!*

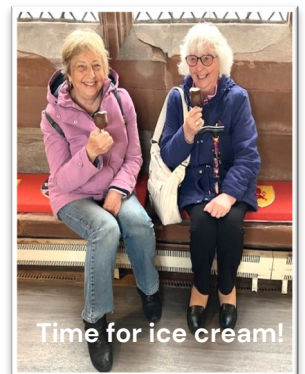

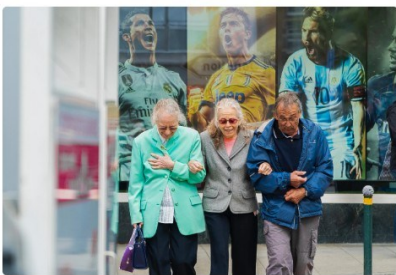

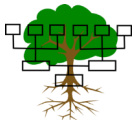
