### A New MP for Rushcliffe

Congratulations to James Naish who has become Rushcliffe's first Labour MP for 54 years.

At the general election on the 4<sup>th</sup> July, Mr Naish received 25,291 votes, 7,500 more than the Conservative's Ruth Edwards.

Voter turnout in Rushcliffe was 73% against a national turnout of 60%.

### **Rushcliffe's New Mayor**

Cllr Andy Brown has been elected as the new Mayor of Rushcliffe for the forthcoming 12 months.

Cllr Brown is the current Borough Councillor for the Gotham ward (which includes Kingston on Soar).

He currently serves on the Council's Planning Committee and the Nottingham East Midlands Airport Independent Consultative Committee

In a ceremony in the Council Chamber at Rushcliffe Arena on Thursday May 23<sup>rd</sup>, he accepted the position for the next 12 months from incumbent Cllr Debbie Mason as part of the authority's Annual Council meeting.



Mr Mayor said: "I am honoured to be Mayor of Rushcliffe and represent the thousands of residents who live in the Borough, I look forward to meeting and working with the many different people and groups who are at the heartbeat of our communities".

# Music Concert in Kingston-On-Soar Church

### **Soar Valley Bus**


The Soar Valley Bus is planning a trial run of a service to Loughborough market on Saturday's starting in August.

#### **Notts Bus on Demand**

Following the success of the trials of the Notts Bus on demand here in West Rushcliffe and in North Notts, the service has been expanded with a new Central Rushcliffe service. The service will launch from 22<sup>nd</sup> July.



This will enable Kingston residents to change buses at East Leake to get to the Central Rushcliffe rural villages in the map above.

Nottsbus On Demand services do not follow a fixed timetable. Instead, they operate on a flexible, on demand basis, allowing you to travel between bus stops and designated points within the travel zone, where there are currently no local bus routes.

You can also use the service to connect to other bus services if you want to go further out of the area.

The easy way to book and track a journey is via the Nottsbus On Demand App. You can also book by phone. See the Nottinghamshire County Council website for details.

### Kingston Village Green Improvements

The Parish Council are looking at ways in which the Village Green could be improved. We are keen to make it a more welcoming place to sit and enjoy the village and also incorporate improved biodiversity.

We have developed some initial thoughts and ideas, but we want your views. We will be launching a consultation over the summer, so do look out for that coming through your door.

Once we have your feedback the proposals will be developed and refined, and we will then seek funding for the works.

### Kingston Village Hedges & Footpaths

Parts of the footpath through the village have become difficult to walk along due to garden hedges being overgrown and restricting the width of the footpath, forcing wheelchair and pushchair users into the road. Can we kindly encourage residents to make sure hedges are trimmed once the bird nesting season is over and cut back again in early 2025 before the next bird nesting season starts.

### Is Your Cat Microchipped?

New legislation came into force on 10th June 2024 making it mandatory for all cat owners to have their cats microchipped.

Owners must ensure their cat is microchipped before they reach the age of 20 weeks with their contact details stored and kept up to date in an approved pet microchipping database.

With more than 9 million pet cats in England, the introduction of mandatory microchipping will make it easier for lost or stray pet cats to be reunited with their owners and returned home safely.

Failing to comply with the law could see owners receive a fine of up to £500.

# Extended Smoke Control Zone Consultation Results

Following a public consultation earlier this year, Rushcliffe Borough Council has put on hold plans to extend the Smoke Control Zone across the whole of the Borough. The proposals would have put further restrictions on the type of fuels residents can burn to heat their homes or requirements for upgraded appliances.

80 per cent of people who responded to the consultation objected to the plan.

Concerns included the expense of cleaner fuels and having to buy new appliances during the cost of living crisis, with some people feeling the measures were "disproportionate" for the benefits.

There was also worry about the lack of alternatives for rural residents whose homes aren't connected to gas, some of whom still rely on burning fuels for cooking and heating.

A total of 1,206 people took part in the public consultation to determine whether there was support for the proposals, which ran between January and March 2024.

#### Ratcliffe Power Station Closure

Ratcliffe-on-Soar's power station received its final order of coal in June.

Ratcliffe is the UK's last remaining coal-fired power station and is set to shut at the end of September.

During its lifetime, Ratcliffe, which was commissioned in 1967, has generated enough power to make more than a billion cups of tea every day.

At the turn of the 20th Century, coal was used to generate more than 95% of the UK's energy, but last year it had fallen to 1%.

The power station will close on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2024 as part of government plans to phase out coal from Great Britain's energy system.

# **Gypsum Extraction at Ratcliffe Power Station**

The Parish Council are working with the 5 Parish Group to assess the impact of the proposals for gypsum extraction at the Ratcliffe Power station site. British Gypsum have mineral rights to the gypsum which would need to be removed before the power station is redeveloped following its closure later this year.

Of particular concern is the number of additional lorries that would use the New Kingston crossroads to take the gypsum to the headquarters at East Leake.

### **Planning Applications**

- No new applications received within the Parish.
- The appeal for the Wood Lane/Stocking Lane solar farm has been dismissed.
