Local Elections May 2023 and Parish Councillor Vacancies

Local elections will be held in May including the Parish Council. We currently have insufficient Councillors and need to recruit up to 3 new Councillors.

Rushcliffe BC are hosting a briefing for prospective candidates for the forthcoming Parish/Town Council elections and are keen to engage with any new people who may wish to stand. They will hold this event online using Microsoft teams and it will take place on Wednesday 1st March 2023 commencing at 10am and is planned to finish around 11.30am.

The briefing will cover what candidates need to do to submit a nomination, cover the key dates and changes to the elections this year and also how clerks can assist and what information we will provide you with throughout the election period.

Anyone wishing to attend should email <u>elections@rushcliffe.gov.uk</u> to confirm, giving their name, parish and email address by no later than Friday 17 February. They will then send you a link to join the meeting online.

Greater Nottingham Strategic Plan

Rushcliffe Borough Council have now issued the next stage of the consultation on housing growth options. We are working with the five Parish Council group to respond. The deadline for comments is 14th February.

There are no new large strategic housing allocations in Rushcliffe above those previously approved, as Rushcliffe can meet their targets with those current sites. The proposed large housing site covering land around New Kingston was rejected and land along the A453 below Fairham was considered a potential development site but not selected.

The Power Station redevelopment is allocated for commercial development.

Power Station / Freeport Redevelopment - Local Development Order Consultation

Following feedback from the initial consultation Rushcliffe BC revised the design guidance and sent it out for further consultation.

The revisions include:

- Greater restrictions on the permitted uses on the Southern site (land south of the A453)
- Limiting the amount of building that can exceed 30m on the Southern site.
- Requiring a public transport strategy
- Requiring a contribution to a traffic management study for local roads and nearby villages
- Various improvements to the design guide and environmental improvements

The five Parish Group have responded to the consultation which ended on 19th January 2023.

It has also been confirmed that the Power Station will remain operational to 2024 due to the energy crisis.

Church Farm Solar Farm

The Parish Council are in dialogue with the developer on the conditions and timing of the Community Benefit Fund that was part of their original proposals.

Alternative Fuel Payments

The government is providing a £200 Alternative Fuel Payment (AFP) to help those households in Great Britain who use alternative fuels such as biomass or heating oil to meet energy costs this winter. Most households eligible for the AFP support in Great Britain, will receive payment automatically via their electricity supplier in February, with no need to take any action.

Community Cinema at Gotham Church

The five churches at Barton, Gotham, Kingston, Ratcliffe and Thrumpton are in one combined benefice and each month in the winter have a community cinema in Gotham church. Under the terms of the charity license they are not allowed to advertise the names of the films but the dates and brief details of the films are shown below. The doors open at 6.30pm, the film starts at 7.00pm and refreshments are served, including popcorn. They are not allowed to charge an admission fee but ask for a donation from people who watch the film. The stone interior of Gotham church gives an atmospheric experience to watching a film shown at almost cinema standard at a low price - depending on how much you donate after seeing the film. Please consider coming along to watch these films, particularly if there is nothing worthwhile on television.

Save Sutton Bonington Bus Service

Since Trent Barton gave notice of the withdrawal of the Skylink bus service the Parish Council, Cllr Matt Barney and a number of residents have held a meeting with Notts County Council to try and plan a way forward after the full withdrawal in April. Residents will be aware that Notts County Council have undertaken to support the current service until then.

A number of options are being considered by the County Council. Sutton Bonington PC intend to submit a petition in support of continuing bus services in Sutton Bonington and surrounding villages. Road Closure Sutton Bonington

Roadworks on Park Lane have commenced at the site entrance to the new housing development from Tuesday 10th January until Wednesday 15th February when one way traffic lights will be in operation.

From Thursday 16th February until Tuesday 21st February, Park Lane will be **completely closed** from Charnwood Fields to the A6006 to enable the works to be completed. The works will be to construct a raised table to slow down traffic on both Park Lane and the site itself.
