HRH Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Celebrations 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> June



On 6th February this year Her Majesty the Queen became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth.

To celebrate this unprecedented anniversary, events and initiatives will take place throughout the year, culminating in a four-day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June.

On **SATURDAY**  $4^{\text{TH}}$  **JUNE** there will a street party and picnic in Kingston Village from 2 – 6pm. Tables and chairs will be provided, so please bring along a picnic and join in the celebrations. The Village Hall bar will be open for drinks. There will be a bouncy castle, garden games and a Royally good paint a pot activity. We also have loads of chalk and hope to make a massive Jubilee mural.

Please note there will be a road closure in place between 1.30pm and 6.00pm to allow the event to take place.

In the evening, the Minesweepers will be playing at the Village Hall. Tickets £5. Doors open 7pm; band from 7.30pm.

### **Chairman's Annual Statement**

At the annual Parish Meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, Chairman Cllr Mark Johnson gave his annual report.

Cllr Johnson opened by thanking his fellow councillors, the Borough and County Councillors and the clerk for their support during the year.

Cllr Johnson provided a summary of the year:

- There had been a number of successful events in the village including the beer festival and garden walkaround, Cllr Johnson thanked Cllr Elders and her helpers.
- Significant improvements to the village hall have now taken place.
- Two trees have been planted on the village green, a third is awaited.
- Traffic speeds and volumes are still creating a safety issue.
- Cycling time trials are still taking place.
- Developments matters the nuclear fusion site is no longer going ahead but the freeport looks to be. There has been various planning applications over the year including one solar farm consultation and a second is pending.

Cllr Johnson would like to remind everyone that the Parish Council is made up of volunteers from the village and surrounding areas who care about where we all live, they are not politicians. The Council provides the parish with a buffer and a voice to outside influence, and the decisions they make, and have to make, are intended for the good and benefit, and safety of residents.

Their aim is to help keep the parish a safe and pleasing place to live, which, for most would be why you chose to live here, so please help the Council help you with thoughts and ideas and give your support where you can to achieve this.

A marriage made in heaven (or perhaps hell): live soundtrack group Minima and FW Murnau's expressionist classic silent horror movie 'Nosferatu'. (2022 was its centenary year)

Considered to be one of the best horror films of all time, this silent-era masterpiece - a version of Bram Stoker's 'Dracula' - still startles and amazes. The Dracula character, Count Orlok, was played as a hideous walking corpse with a bald head, pointy teeth and long fingernails, putting the fear of God into film fans in the age before sound. Images of Orlok's undead shadow ascending a staircase and clawing at his victim's heart rank among the most haunting (and most parodied) moments in cinema.

Minima are a Bristol-based four-piece group, with instrumentation including cello, double bass, baritone guitar, acoustic and electric guitars, mandolin, autoharp, dulcimer, synthesizer, glockenspiel and drum kit. In performance they use no backing tracks or pre-recorded material.

The Parish Council continues to work closely with our neighbouring wards as part of a 5 Parish council working group to address the wider development issues along the A453.

There are a number of solar farm proposals in the area currently being consulted on.

The proximity to the power station infrastructure makes this a prime location. As a group, we are keen to ensure that the pros and cons and cumulative impact are fully considered in the planning process.

A planning application for a solar farm at Church Farm is expected for comment shortly.

The solar farm application at Gotham/ West Leake is under consideration by planners.

Cllr Nicole Elders resigned from the Parish council at the May meeting due to her extensive voluntary commitments to the village hall and local events. We would like to thank Nicole for her hard work and dedication in bringing new life to the events programme and establishing the beer festival.
