Minutes and Matters Arising.

Good News regarding the Factory Shop still in operation Kintyre Recycling got monies to continue operating No further info on Phone Mast The minutes were then proposed by John McDowall and Seconded by Elizabeth Barbour

Roads – Regarding the white lines; loose chippings and unfinished surface at Castlewraggs etc. Council waiting on better weather. There are still concerns re Castlewraggs as road very icy and slippy in bad weather. No Gritters are getting round the Learside in these bad weather conditions and Royal Mail and Bus not getting up.

Crime Prevention – Meetings have now been moved to 16.15hrs to try to attract younger members from the High School. Await news of how this have panned out.

Police Report: There have only been 4 incidents for your area with 2 Crimes being reported, nothing of any serious nature.

We would express to your area our advice regarding the securing of all property and the locking of doors etc. All vehicles and dwelling doors should be locked no matter where people reside. Some of the properties last night were rural farms as well as vehicles parked on roads within the town centre. Last night's events have shown that criminals can be active in rural areas and the Police need to be informed of any suspicious persons or vehicles in the area.

We have, since last night's events became public, been made aware that over the last few days people have seen the vehicle in question throughout the Kintyre area acting suspiciously however no-one contacted the Police to have us check out the vehicle or its occupants.

John Bakes at this point spoke to the meeting about the £50k loan which was given to Dunaverty Hall when during the building of the new hall they were in financial difficulties. They have to date, paid back £7500 and have advised they will pay a further £2500 before the end of our financial year. After discussion it was agreed to offer to write off £3000 each year over the next 10years and ask that the hall either charge no rent or a reduced rent to the user groups. Once agreement was reached a contract would be drawn up and John had concerns that if the community council folded would Argyll & Bute ring fence the monies held by the community council. John then asked Malcolm to put this offer to the Dunaverty Hall Committee and would await their response.

Councillor's Report: Rory Colville.

Helicopter Crash is nearing its 25th Anniversary on 2nd June and Rory was keen to find out if Southend were doing some sort of commemoration. The Minister could advise that there is to be a church service led by The Rev Roddy McNidder followed by a short commemoration at the Memorial Cairn on the Mull of Kintyre near the crash site and further information will be provided nearer the time.

Argyll & Bute's budget is to be set out in three stages with the first stage being discussed on Thursday 1st February. The Greens usually get council more funding and Explore Kintyre is totally against the new proposed Tourism Tax. It was agreed this Tourism Tax wouldn't do Argyll & Bute any favours. Council Tax is to be raised by 3%

Council have found further funding of £7m. By cut backs; council tax management savings and policy savings. Increased funding from the Scottish Government for Early Years; Frank's Law, Schools etc.

There followed a discussion on Kintyre Recycling. Costs to be checked and possible changes to be made in future. Priority at the moment is to ensure jobs for the disabled employees were maintained.
