# Councillor's Report: Donald Kelly.

Motion put forward on Tuesday re working with monies available and asking that the following services should not be cut were Adult learning; Road Safety; Amenity; Music Tuition; Recycling which will be safe but only till August of this year and probably grass cutting would be reduced.

There was extra monies in the budget after the green party pushed for extra funding.

Unfortunately Adult learning and Music Tuition lost out to sand and gravel for roads with Road safety, Amenity being saved

Council Tax is to be raised to 4.79% which will generate an extra £2million

Stuart Jardine asked about the Library as he'd heard it had been changed to a charitable organisation but Donald confirmed it was not being run as a charity.

Macc Base has the salmon farm back in operation and in the future other subsidiary companies either German or Danish will possibly be moving to the base to build weather balloons

John Bakes advised Donald that since the Tourist information point had closed there was no information with regard to tide times etc. for visitors to Davaar Island and on Sunday the Life Boat was called out to rescue 7 people stuck on a sandbank

This has happened before. Donald advised that Campbeltown CC were undertaking a few projects around the town and perhaps this is something that they would consider looking at. Definitely a notice board should be at the causeway to highlight the dangers. Donald said it definitely had to be looked after by a group and not the council. It was however highlighted that should a group want to erect a notice board then the council would want planning permission applied for whereas if the council took this on board they wouldn't require planning.

David McCallum asked about the grass cutting at the cemetery as last year people were having to look after their own plots. Donald wasn't sure what was proposed as yet

John Bakes asked what was proposed in regard to the public toilets and Donald replied that as yet they had not been mentioned

Linda Brannigan asked re the toilet at Inveraray with regard to the turnstile which at present was not operational again there was no info in regard to this.
