Councillor's Report: Rory Colville.

1. Rory advised us that he had taken part in equality and diversity meetings over the past week he went on to say that in 1954 there were over 7000 people living and working in Campbeltown with over 6000 people living and working in Oban today there are approximately only 4500 living and working in Campbeltown with the number in Oban rising to 11000.
