


#### Acknowledgements

These records have been greatly assisted by the earlier list of pre-1855 monumental inscriptions in North Perthshire which was made in 1975 by John and Sheila Mitchell and others for publication by the Scottish Genealogy Society; a revised edition of this list was edited by Alison Mitchell and published by the Society in 1997.

#### Moneydie Church and Graveyard

The ground on which Moneydie Church was built was first recorded as a religious site in 1274. The present church, built about 1813, replaced an earlier one which was in existence when the First Statistical Account was published. The minister at that time described the church as being too small, miserable and having been repaired years before.

It is thought that Thomas Graham, later Lord Lynedoch, one of the heritors, had the new church built to his own design. Rectangular in shape it has a square bell tower at the west end and a circular crenellated porch with main door at the other. Three sets of rectangular windows with domed arches let in the light and smaller windows have been set into the tower and porch. Buttresses were added to the original plan. The builder thought they would add to the grace of the plain walls and hoped to be recompensed for their cost but the heritors thought otherwise!

The gravestone of an 18th century minister is fixed to one of the buttresses. His grateful congregation had had inscribed a long and fulsome dedication to his life and work. Another relic of the past is the jougs fastened by a chain and link to the wall beside the porch entrance. With a hinged collar round his neck the miscreant was forced to bear the humiliation and the comments of the congregation as they entered and left the church.

An area containing human bones was uncovered when the foundations were dug for the larger church They were thought to be the remains of plague victims when whole communities were decimated before the disease passed on. Decimated too was the small community of Moneydie when the men of the parish fought and died in the Great War. Their names are inscribed on the war memorial fixed to the outside wall beside the door.

The church was built to seat 460 worshippers. At one time the gallery of the church was used as the loft of the Drummonds of Logie House. Over the years the numbers worshipping at Moneydie declined, since those coming from Logiealmond had to travel several miles to their parish church. Eventually an alternative meeting place was used at Logiealmond. In 1848 Logiealmond was separated from Moneydie and their own minister appointed. Moneydie became a small parish of about two square miles.

The interior of the church is plain in contrast to the elaborate design of the pulpit. One architect described Moneydie church as "having the eccentric traits of an amateur designer". It may be that the pulpit was designed by the same hand. White marble tablets on either side of the pulpit are dedicated to Adam Milroy and David Young, Moneydie ministers who had each served his parishioners for many years. When in 1884 music was introduced into the services, Mrs Latham of Letham gifted an organ in memory of her son who had died in Carolina (The family grave can be found in the graveyard.) This organ was in use until 1935 and a collection plate dated 1765 was still in use in 1962.

The Moneydie population had been steadily declining. The 1851 census showed 321 persons and in 1861 there were 252 By 1961 the numbers had fallen to 190. The Rev. John Chisholm, serving his congregation from 1934 to 1978 was the last Moneydie Minister. The church was closed and the congregation joined with Auchtergaven Church, Bankfoot.

The churchyard contains several stones that have sunk in the ground and are almost completely covered. 17th century stones were often coped or flat and the passage of feet over them has partially or totally obliterated the inscriptions. Three have been recorded in the National Monuments Records of Scotland. These gravestones are of William Scobie, John Gow and Thomas Alison. The oldest legible stone is dated 1629. Pre - 1855 stones were recorded in 1973 and reviewed in 1996. From these we can obtain a fuller inscription than is now visible. (Earlier recording has been encapsulated in brackets.)

Statistical Accounts record that Moneydie parish is a healthy place in which to live. The number of deaths due to fevers had fallen over the years. This was attributed to the draining of marshes and the planting of trees by the estate owners. Many Moneydie parishioners have lived

into their nineties with one reaching his century and one dying at one hundred and four. When the graveyard was full, a narrow extension was added and the earliest grave there is dated 1955. That area is still in use.

While the future of the building is uncertain those buried in the graveyard will be left in peace, the inscriptions detailing for those who care to look, that Moneydie was once a populous and thriving community - and very healthy to live in.




