Scotland's Charity Air Ambulance's (SCAA) mission is simple: to ensure that no one in Scotland suffers or dies because medical help can't get there in time.

As the nation's only charity air ambulance, SCAA plays a crucial role in responding to life-threatening accidents and medical emergencies across Scotland.

Whether it's a serious accident, a medical emergency, or a trauma incident, SCAA is there to provide fast, expert care before delivering patients to hospitals across the country.

SCAA'S HISTORY

2010	The idea of a charity air ambulance for Scotland was born
2013	SCAA Officially launches in May at Perth Airport
2014	SCAA introduces Rapid Response Vehicles
2015	Service upgrade to a newer EC 135 helicopter
2020	Second airbase added to the service at Aberdeen Airport
2024	Enhancement to introduce night vision to the Perth helicopter
2025	Service upgrade to a new H145 D3 helicopter to Aberdeen Airbase

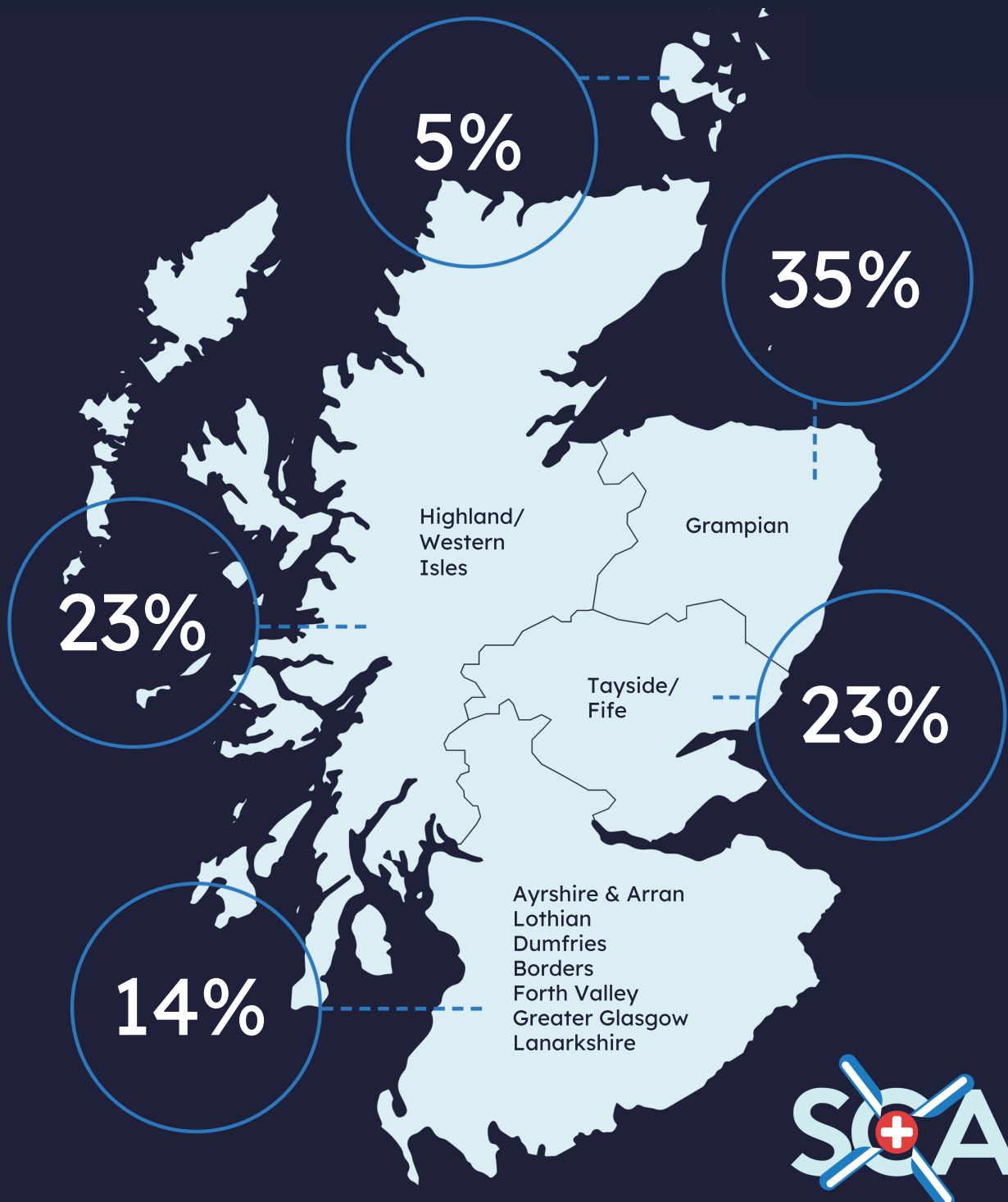
