Structure Governance & Management

The structure of the organisation consists of: -

The MEMBERS - who have the right to attend members' meetings (including any annual general meeting) and have important powers under the constitution; in particular, the members appoint people to serve on the board and take decisions on changes to the constitution itself; Membership is open to any individual aged 18 or over who is currently resident in the Black Isle area who supports the purpose and the activities which the organisation exists to promote.

The BOARD who hold regular meetings, and generally control the activities of the organisation; for example, the board is responsible for monitoring and controlling the financial position of the organisation.

The people serving on the board are referred to in the constitution as CHARITY TRUSTEES.

Constitution:

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It is governed by its constitution which was adopted on 16 April 2018. The Shed was granted charitable status by OSCR on 5 February 2018.

Appointment of Charity Trustees

The Board, which normally meets twice yearly, are the charity's trustees. Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting which is held in February or March. Under the constitution, there must be a minimum of three and not more than nine elected trustees. The trustees may co-opt a further three trustees if they consider it would be in the interests of the Shed to do so.

Management

The trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the Shed, whilst day-to-day running is delegated to the Shed Committee.

We have several volunteer session leaders to assist on a rota basis. One of the Committee members attends the trustee meetings to discuss progress and development.

Objectives & Activities

Charitable purposes

The purpose of the organisation is to provide recreational facilities and advance the social needs, health and wellbeing of anyone aged 18 or over living in the Black Isle area.

Activities

Practical sessions, mainly related to various types of woodworking and talks on a variety of subjects of interest.

Achievements & Performance

The Covid-19 pandemic continued to curtail Shed activities during 2021. We were able to continue outdoor green wood-working with well-attended sessions at Feddanhill Wood. Zoom has enabled our social activities to continue with lectures on a variety of topics, and the regular meetings of the Aye Write group. WhatsApp has proved popular, and we have been using Facebook. We have moved the container and small workshop from the car park to a position to the west of the main building.

The Trishaw project continued with the formation of the Fortrose and Rosemarkie Chapter (FARC) of Cycling Without Age Scotland. BIMS has continued with administrative support and very successful fund raising program for the purchase of one Trishaw and sufficient funds for a second, to be purchased in 2022.

Financial Review

We do not charge fees and continue to rely on donations and grants. This year we received a grant from Inverness Council (unrestricted).

Receipts on the restricted Fund were £10,175

Receipts on the unrestricted fund were £2,637

Payments for the year were £14065

The resultant deficit for the year was £1253

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to maintain reserves of £3000.00 in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure. Reserves at the end of the year were £5319, which is well within the target range – largely because of reduced expenditure during the period of Shed closure.

Plans for Future Periods

We look forward to resuming Shed activity in 2022 subject to a retreat of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Independent Examiner's Report

For the Year Ended 31 December 2021

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Black Isle Men's Shed

I report on the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020, which are set out on pages 6 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations"). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section (44) (1) I of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Regulations. Notes to the accounts – for the year ended 31 Dec 2021

1. Basis of Accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the Receipts & Payments basis in accordance with the Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

2. Nature and purpose of funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the Shed.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

During the year, the Shed received an Unrestricted Fund grant of £280 from Inverness Council.

3. **Related Party Transactions**

The Shed's insurance policy includes Trustee Indemnity Insurance for all its trustees and volunteers. No other remuneration was paid to the trustees or to any connected persons during the year.
