- 4 Chairman's Report: Donnie presented a review of 2022.

What a great job making our workshop from natural woodland materials so a particular thanks to George, Richard Evans and Don Holden plus all others who contributed to this project and a special thanks to Graham Tuley for welcoming us to his hobby woodland.

I would like to mention 2 members who have moved on through health issues in the last year. Mike Hutcheson was an early member whose woodworking skills and enthusiasm are sadly missed by all. Charles Oates has also moved away to be closer to his family. Charles, while unable to do too much physically was certainly good company for us all in the Wardroom. Don't forget that the Wardroom is a very important element of a Shed.

I would also like to say thanks to Stewart Roberson who Is stepping down as a trustee of the Shed. Stewart mainly was responsible for the formation of the Shed and was our first Chair. Stewart led us successfully through our embryonic days to where we are now. I hope that Stewart will still be able to contribute to the Shed as his input and knowledge are highly regarded.

On stepping down as chair I would like to thank the board and trustees for their help and commitment to the Shed over the past year and in particular to Peter Lawrence and Richard Cherry as Treasurer and Secretary respectively, these guys do most of the administrative heavy lifting. Steve Bramwell deserves a mention as he has worked tirelessly in securing a variety of grants from many sources to help with the running and sustainability of the Shed.

On a sadder note, I must mention the passing of Cliff Sim who oversaw our audited accounts since the Shed started and we pass on our condolences to his family and friends. Fortunately, we now have Hector Douglas vetting our books and we are very grateful for Hector agreeing to do this essential service for us.

Our main challenge now is being able to sustain the Shed over the next few years. Our landlords, due to increased cost to run the centre are having to increase the lease cost to centre users to such an extent that it will be very difficult for us to remain at the centre. While we have discussed this issue informally we need to resolve it formally through our new committee. Accordingly, it is necessary to call a special meeting to agree the way forward. The committee has been looking at potential ways of continuation of the Shed and I am confident that there are solutions. It may take some time for a long-term solution however there are a number of potential contingencies available. The new committee will agree a date for the Special meeting as soon as possible.

We have cemented very good relations with our friends from the repair café and this initiative is growing and becoming more popular with the public as it is reducing what goes to landfill. We are also talking to Avoch Primary School with a view to promoting more intergenerational working with the school.

The Scottish Government may halt funding of SMSA that may result in us losing support from Jason and Tim. Should this be the case I would support that we continue with our Moray Firth networking group. This is a very useful forum for exchanging views and concerns.
