Convenor’s Annual Report
<p>The following report was provided by Kilmun Community Council Convenor, Diane Nicholson and reads as follows:</p> <p>“Thank you to Councillor William Sinclair who has agreed to Chair the AGM.</p> <p>Kilmun Community Council welcomed new members last year and we were able to add co-opted members to boost the committee numbers. Kilmun Community Council was, after the 2024 Annual General Meeting, in a unique position to have full membership. Russell Humphrey (an ex-community councillor) kindly agreed to continue as the treasurer and Steve Abbott of Heartstart agreed to be an adviser for the community defibrillators. Later in year Gordon Holm agreed to be the Geologist adviser to Kilmun Community Council.</p> <p>Kilmun Community Council has an open invite to contact Police Scotland with regard to local incidents, but unfortunately monthly reports are not as frequent as once provided.</p> <p>The National Park representative for the Shores Community lives in Arrochar which is remote to the Kilmun/Strone/Blairmore area and is unable to attend our evening meetings, however, Councillor William Sinclair does provide updates when possible. Lachlan Macquarie and I attended a multi community council meeting at Strachur with National Park representatives, Iain Shonny Paterson Loch Lomond &amp; Trossachs National Park (LL&amp;TNP) Representative and Heather Reid Convenor of LL&amp;TNP on the 26 March 2025. This meeting was constructive, and the representatives agreed to engage with FaLS on advancing the tidy up after Strom Eowyn and accelerate the re-opening of Puck’s Glen. They also agreed to raise the flooding issues experienced along the Shore Villages.”</p>

## Convenor's Annual Report (Cont.)

Forest and Land Scotland (FaLS) provides monthly reports through Fraser MacDonald of the ongoing management within the Cowal area. Phytothera (Larch Disease) is still present causing devastation along with storm damage within the Cowal peninsular and forcing many of the commercial forests to be felled prematurely.

The flooding at Strone Brae continues to be an issue. Argyll and Bute Council Legal department is continuing to look into this matter on our behalf, as well as talking to Forest and Land Scotland regarding the culvert ownership and their responsibility of safeguarding the properties from flooding. The area has experienced additional flooding due to the tree harvesting with water cascading through the neighbouring properties and down Strone Brae. Mark Borland has taken up the mantel and is hoping to establish a solution.

Mark Borland and I attended meetings with the Cowal Gourock Transport Link (CGTL) during this year supported by all the Cowal Community Councils and Gourock Community Council to continue the work in the fight to establish a better ferry service from Dunoon town centre to Gourock town centre. Talks have been on-going with MSP Jenni Minto, CMAL and representative from CGTL.

We have been fortunate to have Steve Abbott of Heartstart to provide advice of the community defibrillators. They are located at Younger Hall, The Strone Inn, Blairmore Hall with an additional two located near Graham's Point, Strone and Clachaig Village. All have been fully serviced and registered with the emergency services. Kilmun Community Council has adopted and accept responsibility for the defibrillators; however, Kilmun Community Council's limited funds will not sustain the defibrillators continuous management and will in the future look towards the community for fund raising or crowdfunding.

The main issue this year is the proposed Giants Burn Wind Farm. Kilmun Community Council held a public meeting and have overwhelming support by those who attended to object to the installation of the wind turbines due to firstly the environment impact on the existing pristine peatlands present at the proposed location, secondly the potential flooding issues and silt being washed down into the Holy Loch Nature Reserve and lastly the visual/noise impact to the surrounding communities.

There will be changes to the line-up after this Annual General Meeting. A few of our members have resigned, Graham Revill, Kerris Bone, Lindsey McKenna and Lindsay Greer-Phillips. I am sure everyone thanks them for their input and wishes them well. I am standing down from the position of convenor but will remain as a community councillor, however, I believe we have some new co-opted members that will be voted to join the community council. Thank you all members of the community council for the work that has been undertaken in the last year.

To conclude as last year, Kilmun Community Council is only successful if the community involvement continues.

Finally, a big thank you to everyone who attends the meetings."
