# **PIRBRIGHT HISTORIANS**

For almost 10 years we have been trying to identify Ernest Cole, the only soldier named on the 1st World War Memorial with no regiment. In spite of our best efforts, we had been unable to trace any Ernest Cole with a Pirbright connection. However, thanks to the perseverance of British Legion member John Warden, the mystery has been solved. An online family tree listed Ernest Cole (1914 - 1986) born 11 April 1914 in Gole Road, Pirbright. The birth certificate confirmed that his father was also called Ernest Cole, he was a Lance Serjeant in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, the Grenadier Guards, who



died of wounds in a Boulogne hospital on November 15<sup>th</sup> 1914. Ernest Snr had enlisted in 1909 at Tonbridge, his home town, and married Honor Hardy at Windsor in 1912. Like many service wives, she would have followed her husband and lived in digs close by the Guards Depot. The Sussex Courier reported his death with this photo. Ernest's biography will be added to the Memorial book in the church. Motto – never give up.... Jonathan Foster jonathan@pirbright.info

#### St Michael's Into the Future – the latest news!

It has been a long time (June 2019) since our much loved priest Chris Musser retired. Since then, amidst the restrictions and challenges of Covid, the PCC has been considering the future of ministry in Pirbright and has made several decisions about how we should move forward:

- \* that we could only afford to continue with a half time priest;
- that we should explore the possibility of sharing a full-time priest with St Mark's in Normandy to give both parishes a strong leader to help us realise our exciting plans;
- \* and that we should recruit an Interim Priest for St Michael's while that exploration was carried out.

Rev Bev has been the Interim Priest-In-Charge for nearly two years and the moment has now come when both parishes are separately considering the options before them:-

- 1. for each parish to continue with a half time priest;
- 2. to create a United Benefice of both parishes led by 1 full time priest where we will work in partnership, and share resources but maintain separate PCCs and finances;
- 3. to create a United Parish led by 1 full time priest with 1 PCC and financial unit from day one.

After prayerful and full discussion at a recent Away Morning, the PCC agreed, by an overwhelming majority, to recommend Option 2 to our church members at a consultation meeting at the end of February, chaired by our Area Dean. Further details will be explained, and questions/concerns addressed before a final discussion and a decision made by the PCC at their meeting on 15 March.

The PCC believes that this recommendation will help to send us strongly into the future and firmly at the heart of the community we wish to continue to serve. We will keep everyone in touch as we move through this process via our website - pirbrightchurch.org.uk and church weekly bulletins. # MOTHERS' DAY 27th March

What's the difference between Superman and Mothers? Superman is just a superhero now and then. Mums are superheroes all the time.

## MARCH GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Dead head daffodils as they fade, but allow the foliage to die down naturally. Plant in the garden any forced bulbs that you had growing indoors such as hyacinths and daffodils so that they can add more colour to your garden next year. Feed borders with a general purpose fertiliser, but feed acid loving shrubs such as azaleas, rhododendrons

and camellias with an ericaceous fertiliser. It is best to get supports into borders early, so that plants can grow up through them. Shrubs can be moved now and should re-establish quickly. Lift and divide overgrown clumps of

herbaceous perennials that were not split in the Autumn. Overcrowded clumps of snowdrops and winter aconites can be lifted and divided after they have finished flowering. This is the last chance to prune wisteria before it starts to grow. Apply a high nitrogen spring/summer lawn fertiliser in late March. Rake lawns with a spring tine rake to remove any moss and thatch. Remove net coverings placed over ponds to protect it from autumn leaf fall. Plant



first early potatoes now. Lettuce, rocket, carrots and peas can be sown outside when the soil has warmed up.
